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SWAN Flies at Oslo Reception

The official reception, announcing the publication of *SWAN*, was held at the University of Oslo on November 17, 2005. The reception was attended by Arne Naess; his wife Kit-Fai; Harold Glasser, the series editor; Alan Drengson, associate editor; Charles Erkelens, representative of the publisher; Inge Bostad, professor of philosophy and vice Chancellor of the University of Oslo; and many other

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distinguished guests. The launch, moderated by Nina Witoszek from SUM, was a great success. There was considerable interest in the 10 elegant volumes that were on display. Music was provided by Norwegian violinist Arve Tellefsen, one of Norway's top violinists. His pieces were drawn from traditional folk as well as contemporary music. One piece he played is named "Mountains." Arne's son Ragnar spoke movingly about what he had learned from his father. The reception was a solemn and yet funny, joyful celebration of Naess's life and work. Arne arm-wrestled many of the people who shook his hand, and also offered to spar with several of them using Gandhian boxing. There were many toasts.

This letter from Doug Tompkins, of the Foundation for Deep Ecology, which sponsored the *SWAN* project, was read by Rob Waring at the reception.

Hi Arne and Kit-Fai,

I have just read your email and was very excited to hear that the set of *SWAN* finally arrived in your hands. I feel like *Mission Accomplished!* It may have taken longer than planned, but it goes to show that if you put your mind to something, keep working on it long enough, you can get it done!
