 Named Bishop of Pittsburgh: Feb. 11, 1988
 Installed canonically: Feb. 12, 1988; Installed liturgically March 25, 1988 in St. Paul Cathedral, Pittsburgh
 Appointed Archbishop of Washington, D.C.: May 16, 2006

 Appointed Bishop of Pittsburgh: July 29, 1853 (not installed)
 Appointed Bishop of Erie: Feb. 20, 1854
 Ordained bishop: April 23, 1854 by Arbp. John Purcell in the Cathedral of St. Peter in Chains, Cincinnati
 Installed: May 7, 1854 by Bishop John Timon in St. Patrick Pro-Cathedral, Erie, PA
 Died: Sept. 18, 1866 in Erie, PA
 Buried: St. Patrick Cemetery, Erie (1866), then removed to St. Peter Cathedral under its main altar (1902), and finally removed to the Bishops' Crypt in St. Peter Cathedral, Erie, PA (1944)

David Allen Zubik

Born: Sept. 4, 1949 in Sewickley, Beaver County, PA (Diocese of Pittsburgh)
 Ordained a priest of Pittsburgh: May 3, 1975 by Bishop Vincent Leonard in St. Paul Cathedral, Pittsburgh
 Appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Pittsburgh/Titular Bishop of *Jamestown*: Feb. 18, 1997
 Ordained bishop: April 6, 1997 by Bishop Donald Wuerl in St. Paul Cathedral, Pittsburgh, PA
 Appointed Bishop of Green Bay: Oct 10, 2003
 Installed: Dec. 12, 2003 by Arbp. Gabriel Montalvo and Arbp. Timothy Dolan in St. Agnes Church, Green Bay, WI
 Appointed Bishop of Pittsburgh: July 18, 2007
 Installed: Sept. 28, 2007 by Justin Cardinal Rigali and Arbp. Pietro Sambini in St. Paul Cathedral, Pittsburgh

 Ordained priest of the Congregation of the Passion: April 28, 1934 by Bishop Thomas O'Reilly in St. Ann Monastery, Scranton, PA
 Passionist missionary in Hunan Province, China: 1935–1951
 Placed under house arrest by the Communists in 1949 and expelled from China in 1951
 Appointed Prelate Nullius of Marbel, Philippine Islands/Titular Bishop of *Cerballi*: Nov. 18, 1969
 Ordained bishop: Jan. 30, 1970 by Bishop Charles Olwell in the Cathedral, Koronadel [Marbel], South Cotabato Province, PI
 Installed: Feb. 24, 1970 in Christ the King Cathedral, Koronadal [Marbel], South Cotabato Province, PI
 Retired and resigned as Titular Bishop of *Cerballi*: Oct. 1, 1981
 Served as Vicar General of the Manila Archdiocese 1981-1989; returned to the U.S. in 1989
 Died: April 26, 1996 in Mont Marie Health Care Center, Holyoke, MA
 Buried: Crypt of St. Paul of the Cross Monastery, Pittsburgh, PA

Second: One bishop, who was not a native of Western Pennsylvania but regularly confirmed in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, **died in Pittsburgh** after medical illness:

Alfred James Jolson, S.J.

Born: June 18, 1928 in Bridgeport, CT (Diocese of Hartford)
 Entered the Society of Jesus (S.J. – Jesuits)
 Ordained a priest of the Society of Jesus: June 14, 1958
 Appointed Bishop of Reykjavik, Iceland: December 12, 1987
 Ordained bishop and Installed as Bishop of Reykjavik: February 6, 1988 by John Cardinal O'Connor in Christ the King Cathedral, Reykjavik
 Died: March 21, 1994 in Mercy Hospital, Pittsburgh, PA after heart bypass surgery
 Funeral: March 29, 1994 from St. Mary of Mercy Church, Pittsburgh, PA
 Buried: Reykjavik, Iceland

Third: One priest, a native of Western Pennsylvania, was appointed to episcopal status, but **declined the appointment** on the eve of his ordination as a bishop:

John Paul Elford

Born: Sept. 24, 1922 in Pittsburgh, PA (Diocese of Pittsburgh)
 Ordained a priest of Indianapolis: May 27, 1947 by Arbp. Paul Schulte in Indianapolis, IN
 Appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend/Titular Bishop of *Acropolis*: July 15, 1968
 Resigned appointment as Auxiliary Bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend/Titular Bishop of *Acropolis*: Oct. 1968
 Died: Feb. 6, 1991 in Terre Haute, Vigo County, IN
 Buried: Priests Circle, Calvary Cemetery, Indianapolis, IN

Fourth: One priest, also a native of Western Pennsylvania, **exercised episcopal functions** as a missionary in China, but was not ordained a bishop:

Dominic Francis Langenbacher, C.P.

Born as Francis Langenbacher: Jan. 9, 1884 in Pittsburgh, PA (Diocese of Pittsburgh)
 Educated at St. Michael School (South Side), Pittsburgh, PA
 Entered the Passionist novitiate at St. Paul of the Cross Monastery, Pittsburgh, PA: 1899 (shortly after his 15th birthday)
 Professed vows as a member of the Congregation of the Passion (C.P.) at St. Paul of the Cross Monastery in Pittsburgh, taking the religious name "Dominic": Jan. 16, 1900
 Ordained a priest of the Congregation of the Passion: June 30, 1906 in Scranton, PA
 Missionary in China: 1922-1938
 Appointed first Prefect Apostolic of Shenchow [now named Chenzhou], Hunan Province, China: July 16, 1925
 Installed: Nov. 26, 1925 in Shenchow, Hunan Province, China
 Sisters of St. Joseph of Baden, PA, began missionary work in his prefecture: 1926
 Resigned as Prefect Apostolic of Shenchow: Oct. 3, 1928 (accepted by the Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith: April 29, 1929)
 Kidnapped twice by bandits in China: 1936 and 1937
 Died: June 6, 1939 in St. Joseph's Infirmary, Louisville, KY, on his way back to Pittsburgh, PA
 Buried from St. Paul of the Cross Monastery, Pittsburgh, PA: June 10, 1939
 Buried: St. Paul of the Cross Monastery Cemetery, Pittsburgh, PA
