in higher, Christian education.

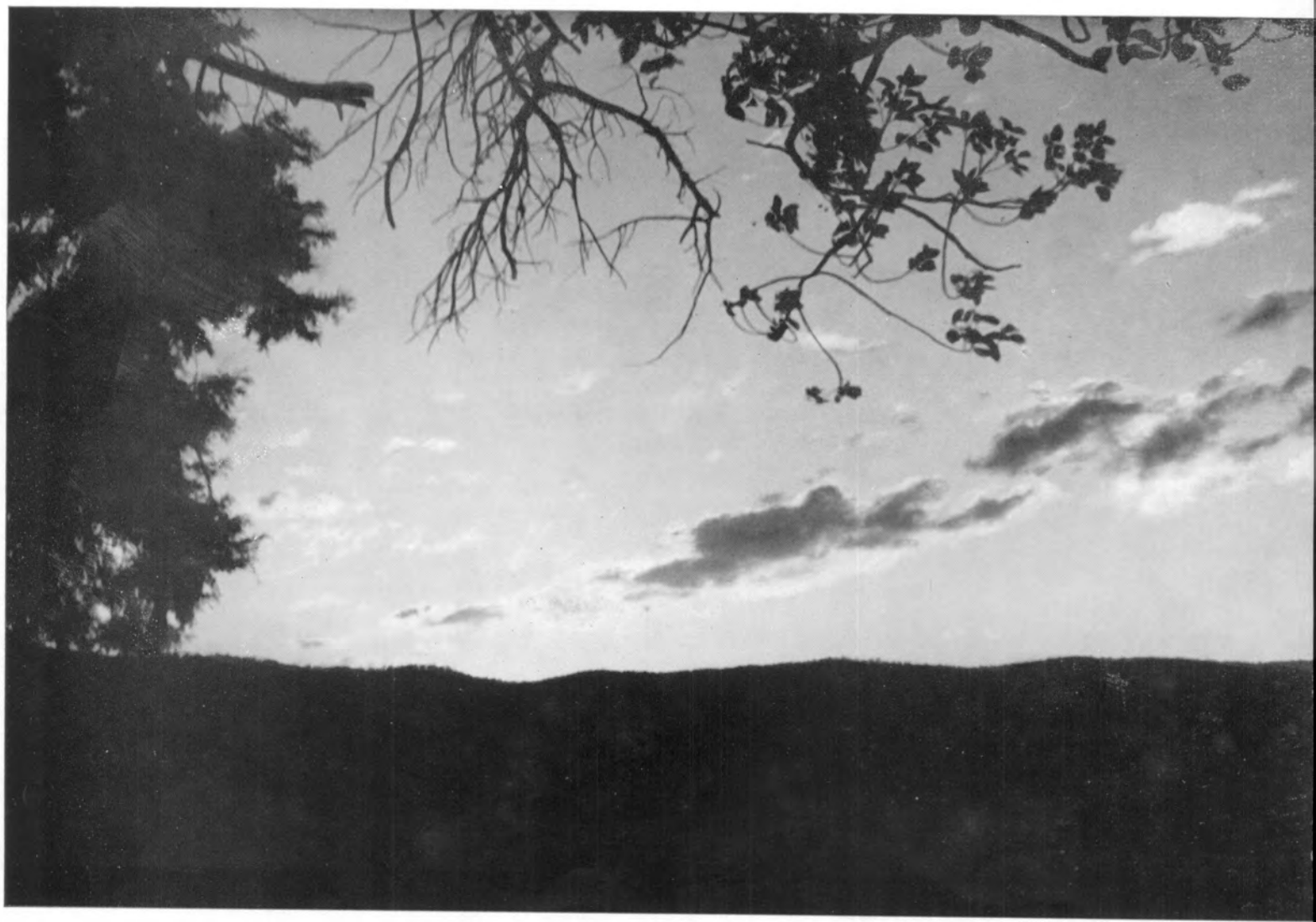
