
Prescriptions waiting for Patient Pick-up

Patient Assistance Program



Medication Cost Saved





Description of Activities

- Advocate for patients unable to afford or obtain their prescription medications
- Promote medication adherence by connecting patients to resources to obtain medications and distributing them on arrival
- Monitoring both the initial applications and refills to prevent gaps in continuity of treatment
- Coordinate with physicians to ensure patients will receive medication
- Appeal assistance program rejections
- Administer patient surveys through interviews
