## PRACTICAL PEARL: Adolescent Male Sexual Health

INTRODUCTION	<ul> <li>Sexual and reproductive health (SRH) services for males have received much less attention than those for females. INITIAL MANAGEMENT BY PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER	<ul> <li>SRH should be part of the primary care office visit!</li> <li>Pneumonic for the SRH history: the 5 P's</li> <li>Partners: number and type (men, women or both)</li> <li>Prevention of pregnancy</li> <li>Protection from STIs</li> <li>Practices: Use of condoms, types of sexual activity</li> <li>Past history of STIs</li> <li>Guidance for providing SRH to adolescent males includes:</li> <li>Encourage parents to repeatedly have age appropriate discussions about sexual health with their sons</li> <li>Discuss healthy, responsible relationships</li> <li>Use "clinical hooks" e.g. sports physicals or acne follow up to keep adolescent males engaged in health care</li> <li>Consider an annual male SRH visit</li> <li>Perform a complete genital exam annually as part of a comprehensive PE; recognize this as an opportunity to promote SRH and educate about anatomy and function.</li> </ul>
WHEN TO REFER	<ul> <li>Pubertal males through age 21 requiring SRH services; in particular, those related to:</li> <li>Risky sexual behavior</li> <li>Need for more in depth counseling about SRH issues</li> </ul>

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM BAYSTATE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL VISIT	<ul> <li>Comprehensive SRH history with indicated physical examination, laboratory testing and treatment</li> <li>Counseling and guidance about SRH related issues</li> </ul>
