Instructions for Authors

The International Journal of Research and Education follows the publishing norms of the American Psychological Association (APA).

All submitted manuscripts must comply with the following criteria:

Article length: there is no maximun nor minimum extension, although we recommend between 4 and 10 pages, which will not be numbered.

Language: both British English and American English are acceptable, but consistency is required throughout.

Originality: to be considered for publication in the International Journal of Research and Education, the manuscript must be an original piece of work, unpublished, and not being considered for publication in any other journal. The authors are responsible for the originality of their manuscripts. If at any time the editors of the Journal detect the non compliance of this point, the paper will be immediately disqualified for publication, or if already published, it will be eliminated from the Journal without notice.

Types of articles: research articles; review articles; technical reports; short communications.

Scope: earth and life sciences, social sciences, economics, management, law, mathematics, technology, art, and education.

Format: The letter type will be Times New Roman. Manuscripts will be prepared using Microsoft Word.

Article title.

Identification of author (s) and affiliation.

Abstract (maximum 150 words).

Key words (3 to 5).

Main body of the article: For research papers we recommend to use the following structure: Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, References. Other structures are acceptable if that improves the clarity of the paper. For the rest of article types the structure is free. The use of sections and sub sections is encouraged in order to improve the presentation. References are always compulsory.

Acknowledgements: if possible, the authors must acknowledge the sources of funding of their research.

References: will follow the norms APA.

Review system: all manuscripts will be blind peer reviewed by at least two external reviewers. The reviewers will suggest changes and recommend the publication or rejection of the paper.
