Dear Miss Tate;

I received your kind letter and was delighted to hear from you. We hope you are enjoying the best of health.

The 92nd Division is "alerted" for overseas action. We have begun an extensive training program here. We will continue training until we get an assignment. I arrived here from Louisiana April 17th.

I was sure glad to get back to a bed and a shower. After sleeping on the ground for 2½ months and going without a bath for long periods of time I sure appreciate these things. I stayed in the shower for hours.

Possibly 75% of the A.S.T. men are being transferred out of the 92nd Div. Some of the men come from S. U. They don't know

where they are going. They may be assigned as cadre to some training unit in this country or they may get an overseas assignment.

We haven't had our big reunion yet. Several of us got together last Sat. night. We had a lively time. I was sure glad to see the boys. We had so many things to talk about. We made plans for a reunion.

I expect to be in D.C. about May 12th. They are granting furloughs to all those who wish them. I'm turning mine now. I will visit the University. I hope to be able to see you.
