## Scope Note

The papers of Ethel Payne (1911 – 1998) commonly known as the “First Lady of the Black Press,” reflect her personal and professional life as a journalist, White House correspondent and civil rights activist. The papers range from 1917 to 1980, and cover Ms. Payne’s early life growing up in Chicago through her 30 plus year career as a journalist for the Chicago Defender and other news outlets. The bulk of the material in these papers span the late 1940s to the early 1970s. The papers include eight series; personal papers, family papers, correspondence, writings by Ethel Payne, writings by others, subject files, photographs and oversized items. The collection consists of 12 cubic feet of material. The papers were donated by Ethel Payne in February of 1977 and were received by Karen L. Jefferson of the Moorland-Spingarn Research Center. After her death, the remaining papers were donated to the Library of Congress by the Payne family.

The personal and family papers series contain biographical information regarding Ethel Payne as well as brief family histories. Included in the family papers are two issues of *The Journal*, a family publication exploring the lives of various members of the Payne and Austin progeny. Many of the personal papers detail the travels of Payne as a journalist in her later life.

Of particular importance in the Payne papers are the many writings by Payne during her extensive career as a journalist. As a journalist Payne covered a diverse array of topics including domestic civil rights struggles, labor rights struggles, global events and Washington, D.C. politics. Payne participated in the “Spectrum” series for CBS Radio in the early 1970s where she provided brief opinion pieces on current events and many of these transcripts are located in this series. The writings by Payne series also contains a few collections of articles that Payne wrote including; “Judgment Day for Dixie,” that covered the civil rights movement in the South as well as the “A Look at the Republican Party,” series which examined the trials and tribulations of the GOP in the late 1960s. Also prevalent in this series are the numerous writings by Payne about global issues such as African independence and the war in Vietnam.

The writings by others series includes articles, pamphlets, speeches and press releases that Payne utilized to write her articles during her career. Documents by Whitney Young, Martin Luther King, Jr. and Congressman Charles Diggs are of particular importance to civil rights in this series. Also prevalent among the writings by others are the numerous reports by agencies such as the U.N. and the Department of State that examine global issues.

The subject files series contains research materials collected by Payne for general interest and background information for future news articles. There are clippings on Black life, Black women, and journalism/journalists, international issues of justice and ephemera materials from various Black organizations such as Association for the Study of African American Life, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and the National Business League, among others. Of special interest in this series are documents regarding Payne's international travel to destinations such as the Bandung Conference in Bandung, Indonesia in 1955 and to the Ghanaian independence celebration in 1957. The subject files series includes brochures, government reports, news clippings and other printed materials from Bandung, Ghana and various other locations from around the globe.

The photographs series contains a treasure trove of material relating to Payne's global travels. There are numerous photos of Payne's trips to Japan, Vietnam, Ghana, China and various other countries. Also of interest are various photos taken of Payne with civil rights activists, world leaders and U.S. Presidents Kennedy, Johnson and Nixon at numerous events. Photos of everyday citizens and U.S. soldiers in Asia are also prominent.

The Ethel Payne papers provide a glimpse into the life and work of "the First Lady of the Black Press." With materials ranging a sixty-three year period of Payne's life, the collection provides researchers with numerous primary materials to better understand the life of Payne while simultaneously providing some insight into some of the major events of the 20th century.

## Biographical Sketch

Ethel Lois Payne

- 1911 August 14 Born to William A. Payne and Bessie nee Austin Payne in Chicago, IL. She was the fifth of six children born to the Payne's.
- 1934 Attended Crane Junior College and Chicago Training School
- 1940s Received a three-year certificate and went on to study at Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern University
- 1948 May Left position as Senior Library Assistant in Chicago Public Libraries to accept an assignment as Service Club Hostess with the Army Special Services in Tokyo, Japan.
- 1951 March Returned to the United States and joined the staff of the *Chicago Defender* as a feature writer
- 1952 Won first prize from the Illinois Press Association for her stories on child adoption and Negroes in industry.
- 1953 November Assigned by the *Chicago Defender* as the Washington correspondent representing four other papers in the chain the *Louisville Defender*, the *Michigan Chronicle*, the *Tri-State Defender* and the *Defender National Edition*.
- 1953 Won honorable mention in the Heywood Broun Memorial Award
- 1955 Sent by the *Chicago Daily Defender* to cover the first Asian-African Conference of 29 nations at Bandung, Indonesia she reported from 11 other countries in Asia and Europe. She was one of nine persons selected by the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations for its Third Annual World Understanding Award. She was the only American woman reporter present at this historic first gathering of darker nations, representing two thirds of the world's population.
- 1956 Accredited to the White House and the Congressional Press galleries, the Department of Defense and the State Department
- 1956 Received the Third Annual World Understanding award by the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations for coverage of the Asian-African Conference in Bandung, Indonesia
- 1957 Accompanied United States Vice President Richard M. Nixon to the Independence ceremonies for Ghana in Accra along with 34 other reporters.

- 1957 Selected by the Capital Press Club in Washington, DC as “Newsman’s Newswoman.” Also honored by the Windy City Press Club.
- 1957 Kenwood-Ellis Community Association, Chicago – Award for community services
- 1958 Accepted a position with the AFL-CIO Committee on Political Education in Washington, DC as a staff writer. She served as an editor of Notes from COPE.
- 1962 May Appointed vice chairman of the Democratic National Committee. Through this position she gained experience in organizing women’s groups and directing voter registration drives.
- 1965 Metropolitan Women’s Democratic Club, Washington, DC Testimonial Luncheon for Outstanding Service
- 1966 African Methodist Episcopal Church- Excellence in Journalism award
- 1966 January Accepted a special assignment with the Social Security Administration to serve as a Consultant with the Medical Alert Program visiting 22 cities across the country.
- 1966 April Helped with the 1966 Campaign Conference for Democratic women  
1966 June Assisted in coordinating the White House conference To Fulfill These Rights.
- 1966 August Traveled to Austin, Texas to serve as Assistant Coordinate in the Campaign of Attorney General Waggoner Carr for the United States Senate
- 1966 December Left for Vietnam as a war reporter for the *Chicago Defender*
- 1967 “100 Outstanding Women,” award, Operation PUSH Chicago
- 1967 March She reported from Thailand, Hong Kong, South Korea and Japan before returning to the United States.
- 1969 Covered civil war in Nigeria with a focus on refugees.
- 1970 Accompanied Secretary of State William Rogers and Mrs. Rogers on their 10-nation tour of Africa.

Johnson Presidential inaugural materials. Of note are a variety of professional resumes and a Pulitzer Prize nomination portfolio. This series also contains material pertaining to the ancestry of the Payne and Austin families. Of interest is a narrative written by Thelma Elizabeth Gray, Ethel Payne's older sister. "Our Family Story," provides great genealogical information into the arrival of the Payne and Austin clans in Chicago, IL. There are two issues of <i>The Journal</i> a family publication exploring the lives of various members through joys and sorrows.
<b>Series B</b>	<b>Correspondence</b>
Box 239-2	The bulk of this series contains correspondence involving various aspects of journalistic endeavors such as travel, tips and organizational events. There are items from former two United States President's and their wives: Lyndon B. Johnson and Richard M. Nixon. There are letters from notable publishers and social and political figures: Enoch Waters, John Sengstacke, Charles Diggs and Dorothy I. Height.
<b>Series C</b>	<b>Writings by EP</b>
239-3	This series contains the published, draft and clippings of Payne's writings. Her journalistic beat followed international events throughout Asia and Africa from military activity to civilian life. She also covered a wealth of national matters that involve the civil rights movement, its leadership, political struggle and historical roots. These articles provide great insight into her life and professional activities. Most articles are arranged thematically, geographically or by format.
