In the Court of Common Pleas.

By the Honorable Montgomery, Major, Judge of the
Seventh Circuit of the State aforesaid.

It appearing unto me, upon due examination,
had agreeable to an Act of the General Assembly,
passed, regulating the admission of Attorneys, Solicitors
and Counsellors to practice in the Courts of this
State: That Joseph D. Boston is duly
qualified to act as an Attorney, Solicitor and Coun-
sellor in the Circuit and Probate Courts: and having
this day taken and subscribed the oath of allegiance and
fidelity to the said State, and also the oath appointed to
be taken by Attorneys, and signed the Roll kept for
that purpose, he is hereby admitted to practice as
an Attorney, Solicitor and Counsellor in the Cir-
cuit and Probate Courts of this State.

And it is Ordered, that his admission be entered on
the Record and the name of the said Joseph D. Boston
be enrolled among the names of the Attorneys of the
said Courts.

Given under my hand and the seal of the
said Court at Charlestown the Fifteenth day of July
in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hun-
dred and Seventy five and in the One Hundredth year
of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United
States of America.
