CREDENTIALS

Requests for working press credentials should be made to the BGSU Athletic Communications Office. Requests should be made at least one week in advance. Late requests will be honored if space is available, but parking cannot be guaranteed for requests less than one week in advance. Scouts and non-working media will be seated if space is available, dependent on league and national rules.

WEEKLY INFORMATION

Media members can access BGSU information via the internet at BGSUFalcons.com. Weekly game notes and statistics will be updated regularly. A PDF version of releases and statistics can be e-mailed to those outlets which would prefer to receive this information on a regular basis. Please notify the BGSU Athletic Communications Office if you would like to be put on our primary media e-mail list.

MAC TELECONFERENCE

Football head coach Mike Jinks will be available each Monday during the regular season on the weekly MAC Teleconference. To join this MAC teleconference please contact the MAC at 216-466-5622.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCES

Football coach Mike Jinks will hold a weekly media press conference in the Wilcox Room on the third floor of the Sebo Athletic Center. All members of the media are welcome to attend. Out-of-town media should contact Jason Knavel to schedule a phone interview with Coach Jinks or players at least one day in advance. All phone interviews need to be completed by *Wednesday evening*. Audio and video of each weekly press conference will be available at BGSUFalcons.com shortly after the completion of the press conference.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

BGSU Athletic Communications strives to provide multiple opportunities for media to conduct interviews with student-athletes and coaches. Often, interviews can be conducted following practices, but we also suggest making player requests during each team's weekly press conference. Please allow at least 24 hours to set up interviews with players. Arrangements can be made for telephone and in-person interviews at a time that is mutually agreeable to the reporter/broadcaster and the athlete, should there be a scheduling conflict.

PARKING

a special media parking lot is located adjacent to Perry Stadium, near Cochrane (soccer) Field (Lot EE). Access to the media lot is by Stadium Drive. Admission to the media lot is restricted to people holding the correct credential acquired from the athletic communications office. All media members are asked to enter the stadium through the press gate (Gate 2) at the southwest corner of the stadium.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

At Home: Coach Jinks and BGSU players will be available for post-game interviews in the Sentinel-Tribune Room located between the two locker rooms, following the normal cooling-off period. BGSU observes a closed locker room policy. The Sentinel-Tribune Room is on the east side of the stadium (opposite the press box), and can be entered through the tunnels at either the north or south end. On the Road: Coach Jinks and requested players will be made available in a designated media room or just outside the locker room following the normal cooling-off period.

PRESS GATE

The press gate (Gate 2) at Doyt L. Perry Stadium is at the southwest corner of the stadium, a short walk from the media parking lot.

MEDIA FIELD POLICY

a general media pass will allow you access to the field during pre-game warmups and during the final five minutes of the fourth quarter only. Field access will be limited to working photographers and television reporters. No interviews may be conducted on the field and any attempt to do so may lead to the loss of your media pass.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photo passes for newspaper photographers, television videographers and, under special circumstances, for free-lance photographers, are available from the BGSU Athletic Communications Office. Photo passes entitle the photographer access to the sideline, the post-game press conference room and the press box.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Members of the media will be provided with game programs, flip cards, current statistics and last-minute pregame notes prior to the start of the game. Statistical summaries will include play-byplay, quarter stats, halftime stats, complete team and individual stats and tackles. The BGSU press box does have wireless internet connection for all members of the media.

RADIO AND TELEVISION

Requests for permission to broadcast must be made in writing. Space will be made available for the official visiting radio station and student radio station on request. There is space in each booth for four people. Phone lines can be ordered through Jason Knavel. Anyone wishing to televise a game from Doyt L. Perry Stadium should contact the BGSU Athletic Communications Office at least ONE MONTH prior to the game, and preferably before the start of the season. The Mid-American Conference makes final decisions on all television requests through their television partner contracts.

LIVE STREAMING

Live streaming of BGSU football practices or games is not permitted. The use of Periscope and Meerkat is prohibited while covering BGSU Football, unless prior permission is obtained from the BGSU Athletic Communications staff.



Mike Jinks

Head Coach, First Season Angelo State, 1994

On Dec. 9, 2015, BGSU announced that it had tabbed Texas Tech Associate Head Coach Mike Jinks to lead the defending Mid-American Conference champion football program. Jinks, who also coached running backs for the Red Raiders, became

the 19th head coach in program history.

Jinks, who came to BGSU after spending the 2015 season as associate head coach at Texas Tech, had coached the Red Raiders' running backs for the past three seasons. Prior to his time at Texas Tech, he was a National Coach of the Year finalist while winning the 2010 Texas State Championship and compiling a record of 43-4 in his final three seasons at San Antonio powerhouse, Steele High School.

Known for their prolific offense, Texas Tech saw great success with Jinks in 2015. The Red Raiders owned the second-best offense in the country, totaling 7,134 yards in 12 games (594.5



yards per game). TTU also had the second-best passing offense. The Red Raiders averaged 46.6 points per game (second in FBS) and had 33 touchdown drives under two minutes. Texas Tech also ranked inside the top five nationally for third-down conversions (.519), first downs (346), and plays run (1,002).

Under Jinks, Texas Tech saw incredible success in the running game. In just his second season, Jinks tutored DeAndre Washington, who became the first Red Raiders' running back since Ricky Williams in 1998 to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. Washington finished the season with 1,103 rushing yards and was named second team All-Big 12.



In 2015, Washington turned into the Big 12 Conference's most prolific rusher under Jinks, totaling a league-best 1,455 yards on the ground and 14 touchdowns. Washington was second in the Big 12 in all-purpose yards (146.6 yards per game) behind only teammate Jakeem Grant (180.6 yards per game). The Texas Tech rushing attack averaged 204.8 yards per game and tallied 34 rushing touchdowns.

Jinks joined the Texas Tech program after a highly successful tenure at Steele High School in Cibolo, Texas – a suburb of San Antonio. Jinks was the first head coach at Steele when the school opened its doors in 2005, and it didn't take long for him to mold the program into a state powerhouse. While at Steele, Jinks compiled a 76-18 record overall, including an impressive 43-4 mark in his final three seasons. He led the Knights to the 2010 Class 5A Division II State Championship and to the state finals again in 2011.

His highly successful career at Steele led to him receiving the honor of coaching the West Team in the U.S. Army All-American Bowl in January 2013. He was also a finalist for the Xenith National High School Coach of the Year Award. While at Steele, Jinks coached former Texas Longhorn, and All-American

running back, Malcolm Brown.

Prior to becoming the head coach in Cibolo, Jinks was the head coach at Burbank High School for a season. Prior to that, he had a highly successful career as a high school assistant coach and offensive



coordinator at five different schools. Jinks' coaching career began in 1995 as the quarterbacks coach at Eillison High School. In 1998, Jinks became the quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Judson High School. Following that, he served as offensive coordinator at David Crockett High School, Galena Park High School and Robert E. Lee High School, all prior to his first head coaching position

Jinks is a graduate of Angelo State University where he earned his degree in kinesiology. He and his wife Meredith have three children – Jaden, Madison and Tristan.

Perry Eliano

Associate Head Coach, First Season Stephen F. Austin, 2000

Perry Eliano was hired by Mike Jinks and will serve as the Falcons' Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator, coaching the safeties. Eliano comes to Bowling Green after coaching the past five seasons at the University of Texas-San Antonio. At UTSA, Eliano was the special teams coordinator and coached safeties.

"My family and I are excited about the awesome opportunity we

have to be a part of such a phenomenal university," said Eliano. "We are looking forward to embracing the great tradition here at BGSU. We will be relentless in everything we do!"

Last season, Eliano mentored a defensive backfield which had 14 interceptions. Under Jinks, Eliano will take over an already aggressive defense and turn up the heat, as the Falcons had 20 interceptions in 2015. Eliano coached two players who earned All-CUSA honors in cornerback Bennett Okotcha (second team) and safety Michael Egwuagu (honorable mention).

In 2014, Eliano helped lead a defense that ranked in the Conference USA top five in five different statistical categories, including second in rushing defense (140.8 ypg). UTSA forced 19 turnovers (10 fumbles/9 INTs) with his safeties combining for seven of the picks. Free safety Triston Wade was one of 15 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award (nation's top defensive back) — a program first — and he also garnered second-team all-conference honors after registering team highs for tackles (86), interceptions (4), pass breakups (10) and fumble recoveries (2). Wade signed with the Seattle Seahawks as an undrafted free agent in May 2015.

Eliano's special teams also excelled in 2014, as the Roadrunners led the league in net punting (39.3 avg.) on the strength of honorable mention all-conference punter Kristian Stern, who set school records for punts (83) and punting average (41.2). The team was tied for third in field goals behind second-team all-conference place-kicker Sean lanno, who made 17-of-21, including a school-record 53-yarder against Florida Atlantic, along with registering 16 touchbacks on kickoffs. Deep snapper Jesse Medrano also collected second-team all-conference honors.

In 2013, Eliano helped lead UTSA to a 7-5 overall record, including victories over a pair of bowl teams. The Roadrunners finished second in the West Division with a 6-2 mark in their first season in Conference USA. He helped tutor a defense that forced 14 turnovers (6 fumbles/8 INTs), with the safeties combining for six of the picks, and allowed just 143.1 rushing yards per game. Wade led the team in tackles (94), solo tackles (54) and interceptions (two), while Nic Johnston was third in stops (70). On special teams, lanno established a school record for

touchbacks with 21 and connected on all 38 of his extra-point attempts. Wade earned second-team All-Conference USA honors, while Johnston and Stern were honorable mention all-conference.

In 2012, Eliano helped lead UTSA to an 8-4 overall record and a 3-3 mark in its first and only season in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The campaign was highlighted by historic wins against South Alabama, the program's first road and Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) victory, and New Mexico State, its first league win. The defense forced 29 turnovers (16 fumbles/13 interceptions), which led to 22 scores (15 TDs/7 FGs), and Wade garnered first-team All-WAC accolades.

In his first year overseeing special teams, the placekickers combined to make 15-of-19 field goals and all 45 PATs. Kenny Harrison finished second in the FBS in punt return average (17.3), had a program-record 79-yard TD return in the season-ending victory against I-35 rival Texas State and was an honorable mention all-league selection..

Eliano helped lead the Roadrunners to a 4-6 record during their inaugural campaign in 2011. The defense allowed just 21.4 points and 126.2 yards rushing per game and forced 21 turnovers (11 fumbles, 10 interceptions), which led to 15 scores. His safeties recovered six fumbles — three by Johnston — and picked off five passes. Additionally, three of the team's top five tacklers were in his unit — Mark Waters (68/2nd), Johnston (59/4th) and Mauricio Sanchez (44/5th).

Prior to his time on the Roadrunners coaching staff, Eliano was an assistant at Central Arkansas from 2006-10. He coached defensive backs throughout his tenure and was named associate head coach prior to his final season. Eliano coached the 2005 season as Sam Houston State's secondary coach after an earlier two-season stint at Central Arkansas as the running backs and wide receivers coach. Eliano coached wide receiver Mike Norvell at Central Arkansas, who was recently hired as Memphis' head coach.

A Killeen, Texas native, Eliano got his coaching start as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Stephen F. Austin, from 2001-02. Eliano played linebacker for the Lumberjacks from 1996-99. He was the team's Defensive Most Valuable Player and leading tackler in both 1998 and '99. Playing strong safety as a senior, he registered a team-high 99 tackles to help guide the Lumberjacks to the Southland Championship and was named all-conference following that campaign. He also was named the Ralph Todd Award (University Outstanding Male Athlete) winner the following spring.

A standout prep defensive back, Eliano was a three-year letterwinner at Ellison High School from 1993-95. He earned all-state honors following his senior season after helping the Eagles reach the Class 5A state quarterfinals.

Eliano earned his bachelor's degree from Stephen F. Austin in 2000 and a master's in secondary education three years later. He and his wife, Regenia, have two sons, Amari and Evan.

Kevin Kilmer

Co-Offensive Coordinator, First Season Texas Tech, 2011

Kevin Kilmer joined the staff of new head coach Mike Jinks as the Co-Offensive Coordinator for the 2016 Falcons' football season. He will work with the BGSU's wide receivers.

"I'm fired up to be part of the BG family," Kilmer commented. "I can't wait to get out on the field with the players. I'm very thankful for the opportunity from Coach Jinks and BGSU."

Kilmer spent last season at Texas Tech as the offensive quality control coach, after previously serving as an offensive graduate assistant for the Red Raiders.

Kilmer, who graduated from Texas Tech with a Bachelor of Arts in History in 2011 and a Master of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies in 2015, had been at

TTU since 2007. He began his coaching career as a student assistant under Mike Leach, who is currently the head coach at Washington State. He has also worked for Kliff Kingsbury as well as Tommy Tuberville, who is currently at Cincinnati.

The Red Raiders played in a bowl game in seven of nine seasons with Kilmer on the staff, so he is no stranger to postseason success. During his time with the program, he coached the quarterbacks, wide receivers and running backs. Besides working under the three Texas Tech head coaches, Kilmer has worked with Lincoln Riley (currently Offensive Coordinator at Oklahoma), Neal Brown (currently Head Coach at Troy) and, most recently, Jinks.

Kilmer was responsible for film breakdown and game planning last year as Offensive Quality Control coach. On game day, he charted the defense and helped organize recruiting visits for the Red Raiders. He has also served as the Kliff Kingsbury Football Summer Camps Director and was responsible for all aspects of the camp.

Kilmer, a native of Slaton, Texas, is married to his wife Jaryn. The couple was married in March of 2014.



Andy Padron

Co-Offensive Coordinator, First Season Mary Hardin-Baylor, 2007

Andy Padron became part of Mike Jinks' coaching staff at Bowling Green after coaching the past six seasons at Texas Lutheran University. Padron will be the Falcons' Co-Offensive Coordinator, responsible for the quarterbacks.

Padron joined the TLU Bulldogs' coaching staff when his father, Danny Padron, accepted the head coaching position in January 2010. The younger Padron handled the play-calling duties in 2011 as the

quarterbacks coach and continued through 2015. He was elevated to offensive coordinator following the 2011 season.

In his six seasons with the Bulldogs, Padron coached an offense and individual players that combined to set 49 new TLU team and individual records. After inheriting a program that went 6-24 in the three previous seasons, Padron helped engineer a turn-around that produced a 38-22 overall record over the next six seasons.

As the team's quarterbacks coach, Padron guided TLU QB Trenton White to the 2015 SCAC Offensive Player of the Year award. White set a new TLU school record for career passing touchdowns (61).

Among all NCAA DIII schools in 2015, the Bulldogs ranked 22nd in total offense, 32nd in passing offense, 21st in scoring offense, 29th in first downs, 14th in red zone offense, 11th in time of possession, and 18th in completion percentage.

The 2014 TLU Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA Division III playoffs as an at-large team. The 2014 NCAA playoff appearance was TLU's first as an NCAA DIII member and the first for the program since the 1976 NAIA Division II national semifinal.

In 2012, Padron and the Bulldogs set new school team records for passing yards (3,253), passing yards per game (325.3), total offense per game (480.9), total offense in a single game (616, vs. Sul Ross State on Oct. 13) and for touchdown passes in a season (29).

The record book onslaught by the TLU Offense continued in 2013. On their way to the SCAC Championship, the Bulldogs led the league in total offense, rushing offense, passing offense, scoring offense, turnover margin, passing efficiency, fewest turnovers lost, fewest passes intercepted, first downs, third and fourth-down conversions, red zone offense, and pass completion percentage.

Padron coached TLU quarterback Brent Peavy to multiple individual school records and to the SCAC Offensive Player of the Year award. The Bulldogs of 2013 set new school records for passing yards per game, total offense per game, points per game, TD passes, and TDs per game.

Padron is a 2007 graduate of the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor, where he starred as a quarterback and helped UMHB to the NCAA Division III National Championship game in 2004. Padron and his wife Sarah, a Texas Lutheran grad, were married in 2013.

Matt Brock

Special Teams Coordinator, First Season Baker, 2011

Matt Brock joined the staff of head coach Mike Jinks after coaching at Texas Tech for the last three seasons. Brock will serve as the special teams coordinator and will coach nickelbacks for the Falcons in 2016.

"I am honored to be a part of Bowling Green State University and the football program," Brock stated. "I am grateful for the opportunity provided to me and my wife by Coach Jinks and Athletic Director Chris Kingston. We are very excited

to be a part of this community, university, and the tradition of BGSU Football. I look forward to working with the staff that Coach Jinks has assembled and cannot wait to build on the winning culture that surrounds Falcon Football."

In each of the last three seasons, Brock served as a defensive quality control assistant for the Red Raiders. He also coached the defensive line in the Texas Bowl against LSU in 2015. Brock was promoted to inside linebackers coach early in the 2014 season following the departure of defensive coordinator Matt Wallerstedt and served in that capacity during the remainder of that season.

In 2015, Brock assisted with the defensive line and was responsible for presenting installation for the defensive unit and position groups. He also assisted in the on-campus recruitment of student-athletes and organized off-campus recruiting. Brock assisted a defensive unit that ranked 17th in the country in takeaways during the 2015 campaign.

In 2014, Brock spent the majority of the season as the inside linebackers coach, developing Sam Eguavoen, an All-Big 12 linebacker. He assisted in developing the game plan each week and was directly involved in analysis and evaluation on game day. During the 2013 season, Brock's first with the Red Raiders, he coached Will Smith, who garnered All-Big 12 honors and was named Holiday Bowl Defensive Player of the Game. Smith was drafted in the seventh round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys.

Brock was the defensive quality control coach in his first season at Tech in 2013. He went to Texas Tech following two seasons at Baker University, his alma mater, where he served as a graduate assistant coach.

He spent two seasons at Baker (2011-12) overseeing the team's linebackers and assisted Baker defensive coordinator Jason Thoren in the coaches' booth on game day. Brock was also the defensive coordinator of the Baker JV team. In addition, Brock assisted with the kickoff and punt teams.

Brock also coordinated Baker's strength and conditioning program during his tenure as a graduate assistant coach.

Brock was a linebacker during his collegiate playing career at Baker. He tallied 277 career tackles and posted seven interceptions while leading the league in total tackles and tackles per game in 2010.

A 2009 and 2010 all-conference pick, Brock was a two-time Academic All-American and earned several team most valuable player awards. Brock graduated from Baker in 2011 while majoring in physical education. Brock is married to his wife, Alyssa.



Marcus White

Defensive Line, First Season Murray State, 2005

Marcus White joins Mike Jinks' staff at Bowling Green for the 2016 season. White, who coached the 2015 season at Faulkner University, will coach the defensive line for the Falcons. Jinks and White previously worked together at Texas Tech, as White served the Red Raiders in an off-the-field role for two seasons.

White, a former player at Auburn and Murray State, joined the Faulkner staff as the defensive line coach prior to the 2015 season.

In 2015, Faulkner went 7-3 and won their final four games of the season. The Eagles totaled 103.0 tackles for loss and 48.0 sacks. Freshman Qunn Johnson was named Mid-South Conference's West Division defensive Freshman of the Year,

registering 45 tackles, 8.5 TFL, and 5.5 sacks. Additionally, defensive lineman Tony Threatt was named first team All-MSC after totaling 51 tackles, 11.5 TFL and 8.5 sacks. Johnson was named second team All-MSC.

As a player, White originally signed with Auburn, then transferred to Murray State prior to the 2003 season. At MSU, he was an All-Ohio Valley Conference selection for three years. White was a member of the NFL's Tennessee Titans from 2005-2007 before concluding his professional career in the Arena Football League.

A graduate of Murray State, White was an offensive analyst at Texas Tech prior to his time at Faulkner. He served as an offensive quality control assistant at Houston in 2012, Tarleton State's offensive line coach in 2011 and offensive graduate assistant at Houston in 2010. A Theodore, Ala., product, White was an assistant at St. Paul's Episcopal in Mobile, Ala. in 2009 and the defensive line coach at Jackson Olin High in Birmingham, Ala. in 2008.

White and his wife, Jaunelle, have three daughters - MaKiah, Jailyn, and Layla.

Stephen Hamby

Offensive Line, First Season Texas Tech, 2009

Stephen Hamby joins the coaching staff of head coach Mike Jinks at BGSU in 2016. Hamby, who played at Texas Tech from 2004-08, will coach the offensive line for the Falcons.

"What an amazing time it is to be accepted into the nest of Falcons," Hamby commented. "With absolute gratitude I thank Head Coach Mike Jinks and Athletic Director Chris Kingston for making this a reality. God's path has led me to a

very unique and special place. BGSU, it's time to get loud, physical and fast."

During the last three seasons, Hamby served as the assistant offensive line coach under Kliff Kingsbury at Texas Tech. Hamby was directly responsible for coaching the team's centers, while assisting with on- and off-field instruction of the offensive line. During game weeks, the former Red Raiders center helped with film breakdown and planning for the running game. Hamby was also directly involved in all aspects of Texas Tech's recruiting during his three seasons, analyzing offensive line prospects and assisting with all recruiting materials.

An offensive lineman with the Red Raiders, Hamby helped Texas Tech to a 37-16 record and four consecutive bowl appearances. TTU played in the Cotton Bowl twice, the Insight Bowl and the Gator Bowl during Hamby's four seasons in Lubbock. Following his career at TTU, Hamby was invited to training camp with both the Washington Redskins and New Orleans Saints.

Hamby graduated from Texas Tech in August 2009 with a degree in Agriculture and Applied Economics.



Mike Mickens

Cornerbacks, Third Season Cincinnati, 2011

Mike Mickens enters his third season at BGSU in 2016 and his first as an assistant to new head coach Mike Jinks. Mickens coaches cornerbacks for the Falcons.

Mickens' cornerbacks were crucial in the Falcons' 2015 drive to win a second MAC championship in three years. BGSU was the only MAC team with more interceptions (20) than touchdown passes allowed (19), which contributed to a MAC-best +12 turnover ratio.

The Falcons were second in the MAC in opponent's passer efficiency (119.8). Alfonso Mack, in his first full season of play, tied for second in the MAC with six interceptions and was one of the team leaders with 58 tackles. Mack had interceptions in three straight mid-season games, then produced a season-best eight tackles and an interception in BGSU's MAC Championship Game victory over Northern Illinois.

The 2014 season featured several milestones for Mickens' cornerbacks. Jude Adjei-Barimah, who made the switch after playing rover in 2013, finished third on the team with 82 tackles. He was also third on the team with 12 passes defensed. Mickens mentored two true freshmen cornerbacks in 2014 who combined for nine interceptions. Nick Johnson finished the year with five interceptions – tied for most in school history among true freshman with Martin Bayless (1980). The pair of corners were the only two true freshmen in the nation to record more than four interceptions on the season.

Mickens came to Bowling Green from Idaho, where he coached under head coach Paul Petrino. He has has previously coached at Indiana State and Cincinnati, in addition to Idaho.

He was drafted by Dallas in the 2009 NFL Draft. He wound up playing for both Tampa Bay and Cincinnati as well as the Calgary Stampeders before retiring because of injury.

As a collegian, he was Cincinnati's career leader in interceptions (14) as well as interception return yards (296). He was named an All-American in 2007 and 2008 and was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award. Additionally Mickens was named All-Big East four times during his career, twice on the first team and twice on the second team.

A native of Dayton, Ohio, Mickens is a graduate of Wayne High School where he was a two-time All-Greater Western Ohio Conference cornerback and helped the Warriors to a 24-9 record as well as two league titles during his three seasons. He recorded 205 tackles, 10 interceptions and returned a kickoff for a touchdown and won the Ohio State 300-meter hurdles championship as a junior.

He earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Cincinnati in 2011. He is married to his wife, Jessica.

Benny Morrison

Linebackers, First Season Drake, 2011

Benny Morrison joins the staff of head coach Mike Jinks in 2016 and will be responsible for the Falcons linebackers. Morrison most recently served as a graduate assistant on the defensive side of the ball at the University of South Florida.

During his season spent at South Florida, Morrison helped the Bulls to an 8-4 record, including a 5-0 record in the American Athletic Conference's East Division. He

mentored defensive end Eric Lee, who was named second team All-AAC. The Bulls ranked 22nd in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 21.1 points per game.

Prior to coaching at South Florida, Morrison was a graduate assistant at UTSA under Perry Eliano. Morrison was a graduate assistant for three seasons with the Roadrunners, where he worked with the defensive linemen. He was responsible for breaking down and organizing opponents' film, instructing the scout team, generating practice schedules and scripts and assisting with the recruiting process.

Morrison came to UTSA from Montana State, where he spent the 2011 season as the special teams intern. He helped the Bobcats to a 10-3 record, the Big Sky Championship and the quarterfinal round of the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoffs.

The Lincolnshire, III. native was a four-year letterwinner at Drake from 2007-10, where he played linebacker for then UTSA defensive coordinator Neal Neathery. He garnered second-team All-Pioneer Football League and conference all-academic team honors, was an Allstate AFCA Good Works Team finalist and won the team's Torchbearer Award — voted on by players and coaches as team's top leader — as a senior. Morrison ranked second on the team with 71 tackles (39 solo), including 5.5 for loss and a pair of sacks. He also had a 95-yard interception return for a touchdown and a fumble recovery to help the Bulldogs to a 7-4 record. The co-captain picked up Pioneer League co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades and was an honorable mention FCS Defensive Linebacker of the Week pick.

As a junior, Morrison was an honorable mention all-conference and academic honor roll selection. He ranked fourth on the squad with 75 stops (35 solo), including 14.5 for 48 yards in loss and 4.5 sacks. He blocked two kicks, forced and recovered three fumbles and intercepted one pass to help Drake to an 8-3 record. As a sophomore he led the Bulldogs in tackles with 55 and he topped the Pioneer League with 87 stops and three fumble recoveries as a freshman in 2007.

Following his playing career, Morrison was a student intern with Drake during the Spring 2011 season, where he assisted with the linebackers, defensive scout team and official recruiting visits.

Morrison earned his bachelor's degree in education from Drake in May 2011 and a masters from UTSA in December 2013. He is married to his wife, Danielle.



Seth Doege

Wide Receivers, First Season Texas Tech, 2011

Former NFL player and All-Big 12 star quarterback Seth Doege joins the staff of head coach Mike Jinks as wide receivers coach for the 2016 season. Doege, a 2011 graduate of Texas Tech University, was a first team Academic All-Big 12 recipient as a player.

Upon graduation from Texas Tech, Doege embarked on a professional football career in both the NFL and CFL. He played with the Atlanta Falcons during the 2013 season, and then played with the Saskatchewan Roughriders. He led the Roughriders to the playoffs in November of 2014.

At Texas Tech, Doege excelled on the football field in leading the Red Raiders offense. He earned All-Big 12 honors, was named MVP of the Meineke Car-Care Bowl and was a semifinalist for the prestigious Davey O'Brien Award. Doege played in the East-West Shrine Game and earned AT&T All-America Player of the Week honors on numerous occasions. He finished the 2012 (senior) season second in the country with 39 passing touchdowns, second in the nation with 4,215 passing yards, and top five in completions, completion percentage, and yards per game.



THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

Providing leadership in education and diversity, the Mid-American Conference moves into its 71st year of service to our students.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country. One of only 10 football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences, the MAC named Dr. Jon A. Steinbrecher as its eighth commissioner in March of 2009.

The league has grown its commitment to championship events as it hosts championships in 23 sports, including neutral site events at some of the finest facilities in the nation - football (Ford Field, Detroit), men's and women's basketball (Quicken Loans Arena, Cleveland), softball (Firestone Stadium, Akron) and baseball (All Pro Freight Stadium, Avon, Ohio). The MAC secured a four-year contract extension with Ford Field to host the MAC Football Championship Game through the 2019 football season, anchored a six-year contract extension for the MAC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments at Quicken Loans Arena through the 2023 season, and stabilized a five-year contract extension through the 2020 season for the MAC Baseball Tournament at All Pro Freight Stadium in Avon, Ohio.

In addition to growing its commitment to MAC championships, Steinbrecher has strategically positioned the MAC's participation in hosting NCAA events and championships. The MAC recently served as the host for the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regional at Quicken Loans Arena in Cleveland and will also serve as host of the 2018 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships, also at Quicken Loans Arena. The MAC has previously hosted both the 2012 and 2014 NCAA Women's Bowling Championships under Steinbrecher's direction.

In the summer of 2014, the MAC and ESPN announced a historic 13year rights extension deal through the 2026-27 season for expanded national television and digital distribution. This is the largest and most extensive agreement in the history of the Conference and brings longterm security for the MAC through the 2026-27 academic year.

ESPN has exclusive television and digital distribution rights for all MAC sporting events, and guarantees coverage of every football game, and select men's and women's basketball and Olympic sporting events. The MAC and ESPN will establish on-campus production capabilities that will provide a significant increase in the national coverage of baseball, softball, soccer, volleyball, wrestling and Olympic sports on ESPN3. This will open up nearly 92 million households from ESPN3 for exposure to MAC sports for the first time in Conference history. Through this ESPN partnership, the MAC and CBS Sports Network announced a four-year sub-licensing agreement to expand its national coverage of football and basketball through the 2018-19 season.

During the 2015 season, the MAC tied a Conference record with seven programs receiving a bowl invitation. Bowling Green (GoDaddy Bowl), Northern Illinois (San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl), Toledo (Marmot Boca Raton Bowl), Ohio (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl), Western Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl), Akron (Famous Idaho Potato Bowl), and Central Michigan (Quick Lane Bowl) represented the MAC in bowl games last season.

The seven MAC bowl invitations matches the Conference record for programs receiving a bowl invitation in a single season, which also occurred during the 2012 bowl season. This also marks the eighth time in MAC history to have five or more programs receive a bowl invitation (2004, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015) in a single-season.

In December of 2015, the MAC named Bowling Green QB Matt Johnson as the league's Vern Smith Leadership Award Winner and MAC Offensive Player of the Year. Also receiving accolades, Akron LB Jatavis Brown earned MAC Defensive Player of the Year, Western Michigan RB Jamauri Bogan won MAC Freshman of the Year, NIU kick returner Aregeros Turner won MAC Special Teams Player of the Year Award and former Toledo head coach Matt Campbell won MAC Coach of the Year.

Four MAC students were named 2015 Academic All-Americans as selected by the College of Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Buffalo senior tight end Matt Weiser and Kent State senior safety Jordan Italiano were named Academic All-America First-Team, while Kent State junior safety Nick Cuthbert and Bowling Green sophomore punter Joe Davidson were named Academic All-America Second-Team.

In December of 2013, former Northern Illinois quarterback Jordan Lynch finished third overall in the Heisman Trophy voting, the highest ever finish by a MAC student. Lynch was invited to the Heisman Trophy Award ceremony in New York City and became only the third MAC student-athlete to receive an invitation to the ceremony - Marshall QB Chad Pennington (1999) and Marshall WR Randy Moss (1997).

During the 2014 NFL Draft, Buffalo Bulls linebacker Khalil Mack was the fifth overall selection by the Oakland Raiders. Mack's selection was the highest-ever for the Buffalo program and the second highest ever selection for a MAC student. This marked the second consecutive year for the MAC to have its two highest ever selections in the NFL Draft. In the 2013 NFL Draft, Central Michigan offensive tackle Eric Fisher was selected as the first overall selection by the Kansas City Chiefs, making Fisher the first-ever football player from the MAC selected first overall in the NFL Draft.

In 2012, the MAC witnessed a record setting seven teams receive bowl invitations, including the first ever BCS Bowl invitation with Northern Illinois playing in the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 2013. The MAC also had four football programs ranked in the top 25 of national polls - Northern Illinois, Kent State, Toledo and Ohio—as the BCS Standings had two MAC programs in the Top 25 at the end of the regular season with No. 15 Northern Illinois and No. 25 Kent State. The MAC also set a conference record for the most wins against FBS opponents with 16 victories.

In the fall of 2013, the MAC announced the creation of newly created bowl games in Boca Raton, Fla.,

Nassau, Bahamas, Miami Beach, Fla., and Montgomery, Ala. for a six-year period (2014-2019). The creation of the Marmot Boca Raton, Popeyes Bahamas and Miami Beach Bowls is the centerpiece of a joint agreement between several FBS conferences and will be supported by several FBS conferences on a six-year rotating

The Marmot Boca Raton Bowl will be owned and operated by ESPN and will be played at FAU Stadium, an open air stadium which seats nearly 30,000 fans on the campus of Florida Atlantic University. The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will be played at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium. The Miami Beach Bowl will be played at Marlins Park. The Raycom Camellia Bowl, based in Montgomery, Ala., is owned and operated by ESPN and will be played in the Cramton Bowl, a 25,000 seat stadium.

The MAC is also a partner with the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl as a primary partner in 2017 and 2019, and a secondary partner in 2015, 2016 and 2018 bowl seasons. The MAC will play the Mountain West in both the 2017 and 2019 bowl seasons, played at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego.

Each football season the MAC has a minimum five guaranteed bowl opportunities. The MAC has long-term primary contracts with the Mobile Alabama Bowl (based in Mobile, Ala.) through the 2017 season and Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (based in Boise, Ida.) through the 2019 season.

THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

During the 2015 football season, Bowling Green won the 2015 Marathon MAC Football Championship with a 34-14 win over NIU. This marked the second MAC Championship for Bowling Green in the last three seasons and the programs 12th overall Conference Championship. Bowling Green also clinched the East Division title for the program's third consecutive East Division crown, while Northern Illinois won its sixth consecutive MAC West Division title as the Huskies won the tie-breakers in the four-way tie for first place in the West with NIU, Toledo, Western Michigan and Central Michigan.

Bowling Green's Matt Johnson set the Conference record for single-season passing yards (4,700), passing touchdowns (43) and the Falcons offense set the league record for single-season total offense (7,293 yards). NIU defensive back Shawun Lurry, who led the nation with nine interceptions in 2015, was named First-Team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), Second-Team All-American by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Third-Team All-American by The Associated Press and Honorable Mention All-American by SportsIllustrated.com. Buffalo senior tight end Matt Weiser and Kent State senior safety Jordan Italiano were named Academic All-America First-Team, while Kent State junior safety Nick Cuthbert and Bowling Green sophomore punter Joe Davidson were named Academic All- America Second-Team.

The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame named 25 MAC students as members of the 2016 Hampshire Honor Society, which recognizes college football players that maintained a 3.20 GPA or better throughout their college career. Six more MAC players were selected in the 2016 NFL Draft - OT Willie Beavers (Western Michigan) by Minnesota (4th Round, 121st overall); WR Tajae Sharpe (UMass) by Tennessee (5th Round, 140th overall); LB Jatavis Brown (Akron) by San Diego (5th Round, 175th overall); S Kavon Frazier (Central Michigan) by Dallas (6th Round, 212nd overall); RB Darius Jackson (Eastern Michigan) by Dallas (6th Round, 216th overall); and WR Daniel Braverman (Western Michigan) by Chicago (7th Round, 230th overall).

In men's basketball, the MAC witnessed the No. 3 seed Buffalo Bulls win its second consecutive MAC Tournament Championship, becoming the first program in 14 years to repeat as MAC champions. The MAC finished the season ranked 10th overall in conference RPI and had six programs invited to postseason tournaments (NCAA-Buffalo; NIT-Akron; CIT-Central Michigan and Ball State; CBI-Ohio; Vegas Invitational-Northern Illinois). Ohio Junior forward Antonio Campbell was named a 2015-16 Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America selection. Ball State reached the postseason for the first time in 14 years and posted the fourth-best turnaround in the country, improving from seven wins to 21 wins in the 2015-16 season.

During the 2015-16 academic year, Akron men's soccer won its ninth straight MAC regular season title (18th overall) as well as its fourth straight MAC Tournament Title (12th overall). Akron defeated three Top-25 schools during the regular season (Georgetown, Maryland, Saint Louis) and was awarded the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Zips advanced to the 2015 College Cup before falling to eventual NCAA Champion Stanford in penalty kicks (8-7). Bowling Green cracked the NSCAA Top-25 as it marked the first time since 1999 that the Falcons had been ranked in the national poll. Western Michigan set a school record with 12 shutouts as Chad Wiseman was named 2016 MAC Coach of the Year, the first ever for the Broncos soccer program. Akron MF Richie Laryea was selected in the first round, seventh overall, by Orlando City Soccer Club in the 2016 MLS SuperDraft. Bowling Green MF Ryan James was selected in the third round, 52nd overall, by Sporting Kansas City. Akron's Tyler Sanda named recipient of NCAA Elite 90 Award. The award is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 90 championships. Akron's Adam Najem (Second-Team) and Richie Laryea (Third-Team) were both named NSCAA (National Soccer Coaches Association of America) All-Americans. Akron's Najem was also selected as a First-Team NSCAA Scholar All-American. Akron's Laryea was named to MLS 2016 Generation adidas class, only five underclassmen who entered the professional ranks through the 2016 MLS SuperDraft are selected. Bowling Green's Pat Flynn (First-Team) and Joe Sullivan (Second-Team) along with West Virginia's Jack Elliott (Second-Team) were all named Co-SIDA Academic All-America, while West Virginia's Jamie Merriam earned Senior CLASS All-America Honors (Second-Team).

In wrestling, Missouri won its fourth consecutive MAC Tournament Championship and finished sixth overall at the NCAA Wrestling Championships. Missouri junior J'den Cox became the 11th MAC wrestler in Conference history to win a National Championship, including the first two-time National Champion. Cox won the 197 weight class with a 4-2 win over Penn State's Morgan McIntosh at Madison Square Garden in New York City. Cox becomes the fourth MAC National Champion in the last six years -- joining Kent State's Dustin Kilgore in 2011 (197 weight class), Cox in 2014 (197 weight class) and Missouri's Drake Houdashelt in 2015 (149 weight class). Cox also qualified for Team USA for the 2016 Summer Olympic Games in Rio de Janiero, Brazil, The MAC had 45 wrestlers invited to the 2016 NCAA Wrestling Championships, which ranked third most of any Division I Conference, and 10 wrestlers were named All-Americans from six different programs -- Missouri (J'Den Cox 1st place at 197; Lavion Mayes 3rd place at 149; Daniel Lewis 4th place at 165; and Willie Miklus 6th place at 184); Kent State (Mike DePalma 5th place at 149; Ian Miller 6th place at 157); Old Dominion (Chris Mecate 5th place at 141); Northern Iowa (Dylan Peters 6th place at 125); Central Michigan (Justin Oliver 7th place at 149) and Ohio (Cody Walters 7th place at 174).

Eastern Michigan claimed its sixth consecutive and 20th MAC title in men's cross country. Both Eastern Michigan's Nick Raymond and Miami's Joe Stewart represented the Conference at the 2016 NCAA Championship. Stewart was also selected as the Men's Division 1 Cross Country Runner of the Year by the Ohio Association of Track and Cross-Country Coaches. Eastern Michigan won its 33rd swimming & diving championship. Western Michigan won the program's 11th overall MAC Tournament Championship. Toledo junior Stjepan Sisko was named MAC Co-Player of the Year, which marked the third consecutive year to be named or share MAC Player of the Year honors (2014, 2015, 2016). In men's golf, Kent State captured its 23rd MAC title and Bowling Green's Jose Narro won the 2016 U.S. Open Local Qualifier, while Akron's Elliot Grayson finished in the runner-up position.

Akron won its third consecutive MAC Indoor Track and Field Championship and its fifth title in the last six years. Akron's Clayton Murphy won the 800m run at NCAA Indoor Track & Field, becoming a three-time U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCA) First-Team All-American. Eastern Michigan's Anthony Jones finished 13th in weight throw at NCAA Indoor Championships, earning All-American honors. Four students were named Second Team All-Americans; Willy Fink (Eastern Michigan), Alex McCune (Akron), William Barnes (Kent State), and Donovan Tolbert (Kent State).

In men's outdoor track and field, Akron won its sixth Conference Championship in program history. A total of 50 male athletes from the MAC participated in the 2016 NCAA Men's Track & Field Preliminary Championships, while 13 male athletes advanced to the NCAA Track & Field Championships. Akron's Clayton Murphy captured his second National Championship title of the year, winning the 1500m by crossing the line in 3:36.38. Murphy was also named a semi-finalist for the 2016 Bowerman Award. The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) named three MAC students as First-Team All-Americans -Clayton Murphy, Akron (800 Meters); Solomon Simmons, Eastern Michigan (Decatha-Ion); Reggie Jagers, Kent State (Discus) and five students as Second-Team All-Americans – Terrell McClain, Akron (Long Jump); Joseph Oduho, Akron (Long Jump); Curtis Richardson, Akron (High Jump); Cody Stine, Akron (High Jump); Jesse Oxley, Kent State (Pole Vault). The USTFCCCA also named Clayton Murphy (Akron) as the Great Lakes Regional Men's Track Athlete of the Year, while Akron assistant coach, Tomasz Smialek was honored as Assistant Coach of the Year. Eastern Michigan's Willy Fink was named to CoSIDA's Academic All-

THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

In baseball, Kent State won the 2016 MAC Baseball Regular Season title, the program's 13th title, while Western Michigan won its first ever MAC Baseball Tournament title. Kent State's Eric Lauer became the 10th pitcher in school history to throw a no-hitter and was the MAC Pitcher of the Year, who led the nation in ERA (0.69) and had the lowest ERA of any Division I starting pitcher since 1979. Lauer was named First Team All-American and Western Michigan junior LHP Keegan Akin was named Third Team All-American by Baseball America. Ohio's Rudy Rott, Western Michigan's Connor Smith, NIU's William Anderson & Miami's Cole Gnetz were named to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. A total of 15 MAC students were taken during the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft led by Eric Lauer (Kent State) selected in the 1st round, 25th overall by San Diego; Keegan Akin (Western Michigan) picked in the 2nd round, 54th overall by the Chicago White Sox; and Alex Call (Ball State) in the 3rd round, 86th overall by the Chicago White Sox.

Women's athletics continued to shire for the MAC this past year. In women's basketball, Buffalo won its first ever MAC Tournament Championship as a No. 8 seed. Six programs were invited to postseason tournaments (NCAA-Buffalo; WNIT-Akron, Ball State, Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan and Ohio). Ohio made a run to the Sweet 16 of the WNIT, while Ball State and Eastern Michigan each recorded one victory in the postseason tournament. Central Michigan's Tinara Moore tied the NCAA Record for most field goals made in a game without a miss after going 16-of-16 in her game at Akron on January 9th. Ball State's Nathalie Fontaine became just the 15th MAC Women's Basketball Player to surpass 2,000 points for her career after scoring 28 in her game at Kent State (Feb. 13). Fontaine also garnered national honors as AP Honorable Mention All-American as well as being named to the WBCA All-Region 2 Team.

In volleyball, Northern Illinois won the MAC Regular Season title for the third time in program history, however the Ohio Bobcats won the MAC Championship Title. The MAC defeated top ranked opponents during the regular season as Ohio beat No. 10-ranked Kentucky and Miami shutout No. 19-ranked Michigan State, 3-0. NIU's T'ara Austin earned 2015 Player of the Year, senior Alexis Gonzalez was named 2015 Setter of the Year and Ray Gooden was chosen as 2015 Coach of the Year. Kent State's Kelsey Bittinger and Miami's Katie Tomasic were named CoSIDA First Team Academic All-District.

In women's soccer, Western Michigan claimed it third MAC Tournament title. Akron's Sarah Sivic, Ball State's Alyssa Heintschel, Central Michigan's Christen Chiesa, Miami's Haley Walter, Kent State's Donavan Capehart and Western Michigan's Emma Kahn were named CoSIDA Academic All-District Second Team All-Americans.

In women's cross country, Eastern Michigan won their first title in program history. Western Michigan sophomore Maria McDaniel was selected as a member of the NCAA All-Great Lakes Regional Team and placed 43rd at NCAA Championship.

In field hockey, Kent State repeated as MAC Tournament Champions. Miami's Bea Dechant was named a NFHCA All-American, while Miami's Alysa Xavier ranked 2nd nationally in save percent with .803. Central Michigan's Sadie Lynn Reynolds ranked 7th nationally in saves per game with 8.24.

In gymnastics, Eastern Michigan ended the 2016 season ranked 24th in the country and won its second MAC title in program history. For the first time in MAC gymnastics history, four teams qualified for NCAA Regionals – Bowling Green, Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan and Kent State. Eastern Michigan's Rachel Slocum qualified for NCAA Nationals on the Floor Exercise. She tied for 47th with a score of 9.8. Eastern Michigan's Head Coach Jay Santos was named Regional Coach of the Year, while Eastern Michigan's Assistant Coach Jess Santos was named Regional Assistant Coach of the Year.

Akron won its third straight MAC Championship in women's swimming and diving. The MAC had 11 students (9 swimmers, 2 divers) represented at the NCAA's Championships. Miami's Pei Lin claimed her second straight runner-up title in the three-meter dive at NCAA Championships and also finished 3rd in the one-meter dive.

In women's indoor track and field, Eastern Michigan repeated as MAC Champions for the program's fifth overall title. Akron's Claudia Garcia Jou placed 3rd in high jump at NCAA Indoor Championships, earning USTFCCCA First-Team All-American honors for the third time. Alexis Cooks and Jackie Siefring of Akron picked up Second-Team All-American honors at NCAA Indoor Championships.

In women's outdoor track and field, Eastern Michigan became the first program in 10 years to earn the Triple Crown - having won MAC Championship Titles in Cross Country, Indoor Track & Field and Outdoor Track & Field. A total of 57 women athletes from the MAC participated in the 2016 NCAA Women's NCAA Track & Field Preliminary Championships, while 10 women qualified for the NCAA Track & Field Championships. The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) named two MAC student-athletes as First-Team All-Americans -Claudia Garcia Jou. Akron (High Jump); Caroline Hasse, Akron (Pole Vault) and two MAC student-athletes as Second-Team All-Americans – Jackie Siefring, Akron (Heptathlon); Jackie Leppelmeier, Kent State (Hammer). USTFCCCA named Eastern Michigan Head Coach Sue Parks the 2016 outdoor season Great Lakes Region Women's Coach of the Year. Akron's Claudia Garcia Jou was named to CoSIDA's 2016 Academic All-America Team.

In women's tennis, Ball State won the programs first ever share of the MAC Regular Season Title and also won the programs first ever MAC Women's Tennis Tournament Championship. Ball State finished the regular season with a program best overall record of 20-3, including 7-1 in the MAC.

In women's golf, Kent State won their 18th straight MAC Women's Golf title, giving them the conference record for most consecutive titles won. The Golden Flashes ended the season ranked 9th nationally on GolfStat with an average score 73.61. Toledo's Sathika Ruenreong became the first Rocket selected for the NCAA Regionals in the 21-year history of the program.

In softball, Miami captured their fourth MAC Tournament Title in program history. Kent State's Holly Speers established the NCAA record for home runs in consecutive at-bats with five as she achieved the record over four games (March 22-26) and during this span, Speers also reached base in 11 consecutive plate appearances, which was tied for fifth in NCAA Division I history. Northern Illinois senior Emily Naegele was selected Co-SIDA Academic All-District on May 5.

From two-time Super Bowl quarterback winning Ben Roethlisberger (Miami University), NFL Defensive MVP James Harrison (Kent State University), NFL Pro Bowlers (OT Joe Staley, TE Antonio Gates, WR Antonio Brown), British Open winner Ben Curtis (Kent State University), World Series winning manager Bob Brenly (Ohio University) and Olympic bobsled team member Brock Kreitzburgh (University of Toledo), the Mid-American Conference continues to excel in producing leaders in the world of athletics.

History of the MAC

Based in Cleveland since July 1999 following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since moving to Northeast Ohio. The MAC was founded as a five-school league on February 24, 1946 in Columbus, Ohio with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members. The Mid-American Conference membership consists of 12 universities across five states (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, New York and Ohio).

In 1946 men's basketball was the first competitive sport in the MAC, which now sponsors a total 23 sports. Women's sports were brought into the conference's structure in 1980. For men, there are 11 championships sponsored in football, basketball, baseball, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, golf and tennis. For women, 12 championships are sponsored in basketball, softball, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis.

Game 1 - Tennessee 59, BGSU 30

The Bowling Green State University football team dropped its season opener to the No. 25-ranked University of Tennessee Volunteers, 59-30, Saturday evening in front of 61,323 fans at Nissan Stadium. A lightning delay, which occurred midway through the third quarter, delayed the ballgame 1:20.

Redshirt senior Matt Johnson threw for a career-high 424 yards, completing 27-of-49 passes for two touchdowns and no interceptions. Redshirt junior Gehrig Dieter led all Falcon receivers with career highs in catches (7) and yards (133). Junior Ronnie Moore added 95 yards on five catches, while redshirt-senior Chris Gallon had three receptions for 45 yards. Sophomore Roger Lewis registered two catches for 49 yards.

Junior Fred Coppet led the Bowling Green rushing attack with 63 yards on 12 carries. Redshirt-senior Travis Greene chipped in with 34 yards on nine touches. Redshirt-senior Ryan Burbrink – who also caught four passes for 70 yards – scored the Falcons' lone rushing touchdown.

Dino Babers' #FalconFast offense ran 85 plays, racking up a total of 557 yards of offense. Bowling Green gained 24 first downs, and the Falcons were a perfect 3-for-3 on fourth-down attempts. The 557 yards of offense is third most for the Falcons under Babers.

Game 2 - BGSU 48, Maryland 27

The Bowling Green State University football team defeated the University of Maryland Terrapins, 48-27, Saturday afternoon inside of Byrd Stadium in front of 36,332 fans. The Bowling Green offense exploded for 42 points in the second half, erasing a 13-6 halftime deficit.

Bowling Green ran 105 plays and outgained Maryland, 692-341. The 692 yards of total offense is the most under head coach Dino Babers. The 48 points is tied for the most under Babers. The Falcons also outgained Maryland on the ground, 201-156.

Redshirt senior quarterback Matt Johnson completed 36-of-55 passes for 491 yards and six touchdowns. The 491-mark ranks second in school history, while his six touchdown tosses ties a school record. Johnson also became the first Falcon to throw for over 400 yards in back-to-back games.

Sophomore wide receiver Roger Lewis hauled in 15 receptions for 200 yards and two touchdowns. His 15 receptions ranks tied for fifth all-time, while the 200 yards was sixth best in Falcon football history.

Defensively, the Falcons intercepted three passes. Senior Dernard Turner picked off two passes, while sophomore Clint Stephens intercepted one. As a team, BGSU recorded seven tackles for loss, and registered five pass breakups. Graduate transfer defensive back Eilar Hardy and senior linebacker Trenton Greene led the way with eight tackles apiece.

Game 3 - Memphis 44, BGSU 41

The Bowling Green State University football team lost a 44-41 decision to the Memphis Tigers on Saturday afternoon in a hard-fought contest at Doyt L. Perry Stadium in Bowling Green, Ohio. The game was the Falcons' season opener at home.

The Falcons continued to be a juggernaut on offense, as they racked up more than 30 points and over 500 yards for the third time in three games this season. Today, the team's total was 579 yards on 74 plays from scrimmage, or an average of nearly eight yards per play.

Quarterback Matt Johnson continued his electric play by throwing for 443 yards and rushing for 41 more. He threw four touchdown passes and ran for another score. He increased his season passing totals to 1,358 yards and 12 touchdowns with just one interception thrown.

Three of Johnson's scoring tosses went to receiver Roger Lewis. Lewis found the end zone on passes of 62, 62 and 94 yards en route to seven catches for 261 yards. Lewis is the first player in BGSU history with back-to-back games with 200 receiving yards, and his 94-yard touchdown reception was the second-longest in school history.

BGSU took a 27-17 lead into halftime and scored twice more, both on Johnson-to-Lewis passes. Memphis scored the final 10 points of the game, the final three of which came on a 29-yard Jake Elliott field goal midway through the fourth quarter.

Game 4 - BGSU 35, Purdue 28

The Bowling Green State University football team defeated Purdue University, 35-28, Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. The win marks BGSU's second win over the Big Ten Conference this season. Redshirt senior running back Travis Greene rushed for a 12-yard score with just nine seconds left in regulation to give the Orange and Brown the thrilling win.

Redshirt senior quarterback Matt Johnson completed 43-of-59 passes for 402 yards, marking the fourth straight game that he's thrown for over 400 yards this season. Johnson is the first quarterback in school history to have four, 400-yard career passing games.

Redshirt junior Gehrig Dieter hauled in a game-high 10 catches for 96 yards. Junior Ronnie Moore caught nine passes for 74 yards and a touchdown, while Greene had six catches for 75 yards.

Defensively, Trent Greene registered a team-high 11 tackles. Redshirt-sophomore Austin Valdez had nine tackles to go along with a game-sealing interception. Redshirt junior Taylor Royster had seven tackles, including two sacks. Sophomores Nilijah Ballew and Ben Hale registered seven tackles, and 1.5 tackles for loss.

With 7:08 remaining in the ballgame, Purdue started a drive inside of their own 10-yard line. Quarterback David Blough hooked up with D.J. Knox for 26 yards, setting up the Boilermakers with a first-and-10 at the BGSU 17.

The Falcons stood tall, however, allowing Purdue to gain just two more yards on the drive. Purdue then attempted a 32-yard field goal, but it sailed wide right, setting up BGSU's game-winning touchdown drive.

Game 5 - BGSU 28, Buffalo 22

The Bowling Green State University football team defeated the State University of New York at Buffalo, 28-22, Saturday afternoon inside of UB Stadium. The contest served as the Mid-American Conference opener for both schools.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, junior Ronnie Moore took a reverse for a touchdown on third-and-five from the Buffalo seven, putting the Falcons up, 28-9. The Bulls would go on to score the final 13 points of the game, scoring a touchdown with 5:13 left in regulation to pull within six.

But the Orange and Brown were able to run out the clock from there, ending the game in victory formation inside UB territory.

The Falcons ran of total of 71 plays – 25 less than Buffalo, but BGSU still outgained the Bulls, 536-500. Bowling Green also won the turnover game, as redshirt junior linebacker James Sanford intercepted Joe Licata - who completed 35-of-59 passes for 348 yards - on Buffalo's first drive of the second half. The interception - Sanford's first of his career – halted a drive deep in Falcon territory.

Sanford led the way on defense for BGSU, recording 13 tackles, while also registering a tackle for loss and a pass breakup to go along with his pick. The Falcon defense clamped down in the red zone all afternoon, forcing Buffalo to settle for field goals three separate times. Redshirt sophomore linebacker Austin Valdez was second in line in tackles with 10, while senior linebacker Trent Greene had eight.

Game 6 - BGSU 62, UMass 38

The Bowling Green State University football team set a school record for total offense and scored 60 points for the first time in ten years en route to an emphatic 62-38 victory over the University of Massachusetts on Saturday afternoon. The game was held at Doyt L. Perry Stadium in Bowling Green, Ohio.

The Falcons accumulated a school-record 725 yards of total offense, eclipsing the previous school record of 706 set versus Grand Valley in 1978. The team also set a team record with 519 passing yards. BGSU's 62 points are the most by the team since scoring 70 versus Temple on Oct. 1, 2005.

As a team, the Falcons also had 206 yards rushing, 37 first downs and 37:17 of possession time. They were 9-for-13 on third downs and six-for-six in the red zone.

Individually, Matt Johnson completed 33 of 39 passes for 450 yards and five touchdowns. Roger Lewis caught eight balls for 142 yards and a touchdown. Gehrig Dieter also caught eight passes for 85 vards, and Moore, Burbrink and Lee all caught touchdown passes.

On the ground, Travis Greene rushed for 122 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries, and he also had a touchdown among three catches for 35 yards.

The BGSU defense held Massachusetts to just 30 yards rushing, forced two turnovers and sacked the guarterback five times.

Game 7 - BGSU 59, Akron 10

The Bowling Green State University football team defeated the University of Akron, 59-10, Saturday afternoon inside of Doyt L. Perry Stadium in front of a Homecoming crowd of 20,021 Falcon fans. The Falcons outgained the Zips, 532-271, and outscored Akron, 31-0, in the second half. Bowling Green held the Zips to just 104 passing yards, while the Falcon passing game accounted for 412 yards.

The 49-point win marks the largest margin of victory for the Falcons over the Zips in series history. Bowling Green has now beat Akron in seven straight contests.

Matt Johnson completed 25-of-30 passes for 357 yards and five touchdowns. Johnson also caught a pass for 16 yards. Travis Greene rushed for 64 yards on 13 carries, while Fred Coppet gained 52 yards on 10 touches. Donovan Wilson found the end zone twice, rushing for 14 yards on nine carries.

Roger Lewis had a game-high 118 yards on six catches and two touchdowns. Gehrig Dieter and Ryan Burbrink also hauled in touchdown pass, while adding 77 and 54 yards, respectively.

The Falcon defense forced four turnovers, and made two fourth-down stops. Defensive back Eilar Hardy led the Falcons with nine tackles. Defensive lineman Terrance Bush followed with eight, and registered one sack with two quarterback hurries. Linebackers Trent Greene and Austin Valdez recorded seven tackles.

Game 8 - BGSU 48, Kent State 0

The Bowling Green State University football team defeated the Kent State University Golden Flashes, 48-0, Saturday afternoon at Dix Stadium. The Falcons scored on their first five possessions of the game, racing out to a 31-0 halftime lead.

The shutout is Bowling Green's first since Nov. 12, 2013, when BGSU defeated Ohio by a score of 49-0.

After racing out to a 31-0 halftime lead, the second half was high-lighted by a pair of Roger Lewis touchdown catches. The sophomore receiver – who caught four passes for 102 yards – scored both of the Falcons' touchdowns in the second half.

The Falcons outgained the Golden Flashes, 602-166, and held Kent State to just 55 rushing yards on 26 attempts. Defensive back Jamari Bozeman led BGSU with eight tackles. Linebacker Trenton Greene was next in line with seven, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Linebacker Austin Valdez finished third on the team with six tackles, including one tackle for loss. Defensive lineman Zach Colvin and linebacker James Sanford recorded one sack apiece.

Defensive back Alfonso Mack intercepted his third pass in as many games, while fellow defensive back Eilar Hardy picked up his first interception for the Falcons.

Matt Johnson completed 27-of-40 passes for 430 yards and five touchdowns, while also rushing for 45 yards and a score. Johnson has surpassed 400 yards passing six times this season, and has thrown for at least 300 yards nine times in his career.

Game 9 - BGSU 62, Ohio 24

The Bowling Green State University football team scored at least two touchdowns in every quarter, running past visiting Ohio University by a 62-24 final on Wednesday night in Mid-American Conference play at Doyt Perry Stadium.

The Falcons' offensive juggernaut continued as BGSU racked up over 60 points for the second time in 2015. It is the first time they have accomplished that in 12 years. This is also the first time the Falcons have ever scored 59 or more points three times in one season.

BGSU amassed 581 yards of total offense in just 69 plays, averaging 8.4 yards per play. They were successful both through the air and on the ground. Matt Johnson passed for 365 yards and helped two receivers surpass the century mark, while Travis Greene ran for over 100 and moved within 174 yards of the Falcons' all-time career rushing record.

BGSU earned 399 passing and 182 rushing yards, as well as 29 first downs, despite controlling the ball for just 22:54. The Falcons were 8-for-12 on third down and scored on all five of their red zone trips.

Johnson finished 26-for-35 with 365 yards, four touchdowns and zero interceptions. Greene rushed for 106 yards and now has 3,249 for his career. That moves him into second place on BGSU's all-time list.

Ten different receivers caught at least one pass for the Falcons. The group was led by Gehrig Dieter, who hauled in nine passes for 136 yards and two scores.

Game 10 - BGSU 41, W. Michigan 27

The Bowling Green State University football team defeated the Western Michigan University Broncos, 41-27, Wednesday night at Waldo Stadium. The win clinches BGSU's third straight Mid-American Conference East Division title, as well as a third straight berth in the MAC Championship Game.

After Western Michigan scored on its first drive of the third quarter to knot the contest at 27-27, the Falcons scored the final 14 points of the game to secure the two-score victory.

Fittingly, it was Travis Greene who scored the final two touchdowns of the game. Greene – who is now just five yards shy of breaking the career rushing yards record – ran for a career-best 170 yards on 24 carries, while also scoring three touchdowns for the second consecutive week.

Matt Johnson completed 23-of-41 passes for 269 yards and three touchdowns, while throwing just his fourth interception of the year.

To lead all Falcon receivers, Roger Lewis – who caught two touchdowns in the first half – hauled in five balls for 86 yards. Gehrig Dieter grabbed a team-high nine balls for 84 yards.

Linebacker Austin Valdez led the Orange and Brown with 15 tackles, including two tackles for loss and a sack. Defensive back Clint Stephens and linebacker James Sanford followed with 12 tackles each, while linebacker Trent Greene followed with 11. Defensive back Eilar Hardy recorded nine tackles.

Game 11 - Toledo 44, BGSU 28

The Bowling Green State University football team dropped a 44-28 decision to the University of Toledo on Tuesday night in front of a crowd of 23,492 at Doyt Perry Stadium in Bowling Green, Ohio.

Gehrig Dieter caught set a new career-high in receptions and touchdowns, while Travis Greene became BGSU's all-time leading rusher. Matt Johnson also set a school record for most passing yards in a single season.

Dieter caught 13 balls for 103 yards and three touchdowns, including two highlight-reel sideline catches in the end zone. His 13 receptions surpass the ten he made in September against Purdue, while the three touchdowns eclipse the two scores he had two weeks ago against Ohio.

Greene needed five yards tonight to become the Falcons' career rushing leader, and he earned the record on his second carry of the night. He finished the game with 17 carries for 73 yards and has a new career total of 3.492.

Johnson completed 29 of 47 passes for 274 yards and threw for three touchdowns. His season totals are now 4,229 yards, 39 touchdowns and only six interceptions. The previous record of 4,051 yards was owned by Tyler Sheehan in 2009. Johnson also surpassed the 8,000 yard mark for his career tonight.

Game 12 - BGSU 48, Ball State 10

The Bowling Green State University football team wrapped up the regular season by defeating the Ball State University Cardinals, 48-10, Tuesday night at Scheumann Stadium. BGSU raced out to a 27-0 halftime lead, and never looked back.

Matt Johnson – who completed 24-of-31 passes for 236 yards and two touchdowns – tied the school and MAC record for touchdown passes in a single season when he found Gehrig Dieter for a one-yard score in the third quarter, pushing BGSU's advantage to 34-0. The touchdown pass was Johnson's 41st of the season, which ties fellow Falcon Omar Jacobs' mark that was set in 2004.

BGSU nearly had three 100-yard rushers in the game. Fred Coppet rushed for 109 yards and one touchdown on 12 carries. Coppet now has four 100-yard rushing performances in his career. Travis Greene and Matt Domer scored both of Bowling Green's fourth-quarter touchdowns. Greene – who finished with 97 yards on 17 touches – put the Falcons up 41-10 with 6:16 to go in regulation. Greene also rushed for a score in the first half. Domer had just three carries, but rushed for 105 yards. His 95-yard touchdown score with 39 seconds to play – which concluded the game's scoring – was the second-longest touchdown run in school history.

Leading all Falcon receivers, Dieter caught 11 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown, while Roger Lewis finished with four catches for 59 yards.

Game 13 - BGSU 34, N Illinois 14

Behind redshirt senior Travis Greene's career-high 183 rushing yards and two touchdowns, redshirt senior Matt Johnson's 235 passing yards and two touchdowns, and the BGSU defense's three interceptions and two fumble recoveries, the Falcons controlled the game from start to finish in a 34-14 win over Northern Illinois to win the 2015 Marathon Mid-American Conference Championship Game on Friday night at Ford Field in Detroit, Mich.

The 2015 conference title is the second MAC Championship over the last three years for the Falcons and is the 12th MAC Championship in school history.

BGSU nearly doubled NIU in total yards with 501 yards compared to the Huskies' 259 yards, as the Falcons had a balance attack with 266 rushing yards and 235 passing yards for the game.

The Falcons' defense forced five Huskie turnovers – two fumbles and three interceptions – and held NIU to just 2-of-13 overall on third down attempts and 1-of-5 on fourth down tries for the contest.

Greene led BGSU with two scores on a new career-high 183 yards rushing on 29 attempts, while Fred Coppet added 85 yards on 16 carries and one touchdown. Johnson finished 25-of-37 for 235 yards and two touchdowns, and became the MAC single-season passing leader surpassing Ben Roethlisberger's 4,486 yards in 2003. Johnson also surpassed Omar Jacobs for the school and MAC record for touchdown passes in a single season. Jacobs threw 41 in 2004 – Johnson has 43 touchdowns through 13 games in 2015.

Game 14 - Georgia S. 58, BGSU 27

Georgia Southern scored 35 unanswered points in the second half to overcome Bowling Green's 27-23 halftime lead Wednesday evening to defeat the Falcons 58-27 in the GoDaddy Bowl. It was BGSU's fourth consecutive year playing in a bowl game.

Matt Johnson threw three first half touchdowns and Travis Greene scored from five yards out with 36 seconds left in the first half to put the Falcons ahead 27-23. For Johnson, he became Bowling Green's passing touchdown leader, ending his career with 73.

Bowling Green built a 20-9 second-quarter lead as the Falcons moved the ball well in the first half.

Johnson finished his career by going 15-of-34 for 246 yards and the three first half touchdown passes. He ended the year with a MAC record 4,946 passing yards. Greene's career came to a close with a team-high 79 yards rushing. Ronnie Moore had five catches for 83 yards and Gehrig Dieter added five receptions for 76 yards. Roger Lewis caught three passes and had 68 receiving yards. Defensively, Taylor Royster and Austin Valdez each recorded 11 tackles.

Since Frederick G. Beyerman, an instructor in the physical education department and the first athletic director, announced in July 1919 that Bowling Green State Normal College would field an intercollegiate football team, a rich tradition has developed.

From that very first team, to the first squad to go unbeaten in 1928, to the first perfect record of the 1959 national college division champions, to back-to-back seasons of nationally-ranked football across the new millennium.

From former head coach Warren Steller, to Max Minnich – the first BGSU player to be drafted by a professional team. To Fred Durig – the first All-America selection – to legendary head coach Doyt Perry. To Paul Miles, the only football player ever to have his jersey retired, to Dave Preston, the career rushing leader. To record-setting quarterback Brian McClure, to an unknown head coach by the name of Urban Meyer, to Biletnikoff finalist Freddie Barnes, the NCAA record holder for catches in a season (155), the Bowling Green State University football program has a tradition as rich as any in the Mid-American Conference.

Since 19 of the 30 males enrolled at Normal College banded together to form that first team, many different figures have combined to mold the lore of football at BGSU.

The program got off to a rocky start losing its first seven games played. Franklin Skibbie scored the first touchdown with BG's only points in the 10-6 loss to Findlay in the 1920 season opener. That team would post a 7-0 win over Kent State Normal College (Kent State) in the season finale to record the first win.

The 1921 squad was the first to win a conference title, capturing the Northwest Conference championship with wins over Defiance, Findlay, and Toledo. BG posted a shutout of Findlay, scoring a school-record 151 points in one of the most

talked-about games in school history. In the season opener against Kent State, played behind what is now Ridge Street School, the Falcons played possibly the quietest game in school history. All fans were prohibited from making noise because of an illness in the neighborhood.


The following season, BG held its first homecoming game on Nov. 4, 1922, which was played at the Fairgrounds. Bowling Green and Toledo battled to a 6-6 tie.

After having a different coach in each of its first five seasons, Warren Steller was selected to coach the 1924 squad, the beginning of a very successful 11-year tenure, the second-longest in school history. Steller was the first BGSU head coach to have an assistant when Paul Landis was hired in 1925.

Led by Chet Chapman, the first BG player to earn first team All-Ohio honors, the 1928 team posted the first unbeaten record while allowing just 18 points in seven games.

In 1936, the federal government offered to help Bowling Green financially in the construction of a new football stadium and the Board of Trustees accepted the offer. University Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 23, 1937 and served as the home of Falcon football until 1966 when Doyt L. Perry Stadium was built. University Stadium was located in what is now the center of campus directly west of Jerome Library.

In 1941, Robert Whittaker was named the head coach at Bowling Green after compiling an 11-year record of 89-19-2 at Sandusky High School. Whittaker's first of his 14 teams (the longest tenure in school history) tied Case Western Reserve for the Ohio Conference title and was thought to be one




Brian McClure is one of only two players in MAC history (both from BG) to earn league MVP honors twice.

of the best teams ever, scoring 173 while allowing just 40.

After back-to-back losing seasons in 1953 and 1954, Doyt Perry began his legendary career as the Falcon head coach in 1955 and made an immediate impact. BG posted a 7-1-1 record, scoring 224 points while allowing only 53. This came on the heels of a 2-7 record the previous season.

Perry, whose teams never lost more than two games in any of his 10 seasons, led his 1959




1919 - First BGSU Football Team

team to the first perfect record in school history at 9-0-0. In the process, the Falcons were named the mythical small college national champions by the Washington, D.C. Touchdown Club.

BG's closest game that season was a Mid-American Conference victory at Ohio University by a 13-9 count to wrap up the perfect season and national honor.

The following season, BG came within one game of repeating as national champions, losing only to OU by a score of 14-7. The Bobcats would claim top national honors that year.

In 1961, Bowling Green played in its first bowl game, the Mercy Bowl at the Los Angeles Coliseum. The game against Fresno State was played to raise

money to help the families of 16 members of the Cal Poly San Luis Obispo football team. The 16 players perished in a plane crash shortly after takeoff from Toledo Express Airport after a 1960 game against BG. The game netted \$170,000 for the memorial fund.

The arrival of a skinny, much-heralded quarterback from Ravenna, Ohio in 1982 signaled the beginning of an 11-year period in which the Falcons would make four bowl appearances.

The quarterback was Brian McClure and all he would do in the next four seasons was lead the Falcons to a 34-12 record, and a 19-1 record at home. McClure also led the Orange and Brown to two bowl games, and became only the second quarterback in NCAA history to pass for over 10,000 yards.

He became the starter in the third game of his freshman season, and despite missing the last

two games of the regular season, he became the first freshman to be named a first-team all-league quarterback.

He would rewrite the BG and MAC record books before his career was over, setting five NCAA records as well. McClure still holds numerous school and MAC records.

In 1991, Gary Blackney was tabbed as the 14th head football coach, and much like the arrival of McClure, he made an immediate impact on the program. In his first season, he took a team which compiled a 3-5-2 mark the previous season and molded them into an 11-1 squad, going undefeated in the MAC while winning the program's first bowl game.

The following season was more of the same, as the Falcons were again perfect in league play. A win over Nevada in the first Las Vegas Bowl made it back-to-back bowl victories. The 1993 squad would

> extend the conference winning streak to a leaguerecord 19 games, while going unbeaten in the first 22 MAC games of Blackney's tenure.

Urban Meyer took over the reins of the Falcon program in 2001 and engineered the top turnaround in the FBS. The Falcons opened the Meyer era with an impressive road win at Missouri and fol-



lowed that up with wins over Buffalo and Temple, surpassing their victory total of the previous year.

BGSU posted its first winning season since 1994 when it reeled off three straight wins to end the season. The Falcons' 43-42 victory at Northwestern made them the first MAC team to ever defeat three teams from BCS conferences in a single season. The Falcons ended the season six days later with a 56-21 pasting of MAC champion Toledo.

In 2002, BGSU roared to an 8-0 start, including wins over Missouri and Kansas and were ranked in both the AP and Coaches polls at the same time for the first time in school history.

Meyer's offensive coordinator, Gregg Brandon, took over as head coach in December of 2002 and guided the Falcons to their first-ever MAC West title and Motor City Bowl championship. That team finished ranked in the top 25 (No. 23) in both major polls at the end of a season for the first time in school history.

One player who links Blackney, Meyer and Brandon was All-American quarterback Josh Harris. The Westerville, Ohio native came to BGSU with the intention of sitting out the 2000 season as a redshirt, but was pressed into duty when injuries decimated the Falcon backfield. Serving as a running back and kick returner for the bulk of the season, Harris showed signs of greatness in glimpses, and even started his first career game on ESPN against Toledo.

Meyer took over the program the following season and inserted Harris into the starting lineup for good in the ninth game of the season and watched his team win 11 straight games over the next two seasons to earn its first national ranking since 1985. The Motor City Bowl MVP guided the Falcons to a 6-1 record in three seasons as a starter against BCS competition.

The 2003 season gave BGSU its highest national profile and elevated the program to new heights. Longtime Falcon fans have viewed the program's 1972 win over the Boilermakers as one of the biggest in BGSU history.

Well, lightning strikes twice. While Purdue entered the day ranked No. 16 with BCS aspirations, the Falcons kept the ballgame close throughout. BGSU converted twice on fourth down, capped by a 32-yard miracle pass-and-catch from Harris to Charles Sharon with 2:08 remaining to post a 27-26 win.


The Falcons were back into the national spotlight with a No. 23 ranking by the AP, and a showdown with undefeated No. 12 Northern Illinois showed so much promise that ESPN's College Gameday made Bowling Green its home for the weekend. For the first time in 20 years, Doyt Perry Stadium was sold out and the game was shown on ESPN2.

All-American Janssen Patton set an NCAA record by picking off three passes in a game for the third time in his career. Harris directed the BGSU offense flawlessly, as the Falcons prevailed by a score of 34-18 in just the second-ever regular season meeting between two nationally-ranked MAC schools. The Falcons would spend the next seven weeks in both national polls and were ranked 24th in the final BCS standings.

In what would be one of the most meaningful games in the history of the BGSU-Toledo rivalry, another sellout crowd would witness the first meet-

ing in which the two schools played the final game of the regular season for an outright championship.

The Falcons rallied in the fourth quarter in front to post a 31-23 win over archrival Toledo. That would secure the Falcons' first-ever MAC Championship Game appearance at home against No. 12 Miami.

In the MAC's first battle with the Big Ten in postseason play, Harris earned MVP honors completing a bowl-record 38 passes, as the Falcons registered a 28-24 win over Northwestern. The victory allowed the Falcons to finish the 2003 season in both the AP and Coaches polls for the second time in program history.

In 2004, BGSU once again enjoyed the national spotlight when they opened the season on the road at Oklahoma in a game that was televised by ABC. While the Falcons fell 40-24 to a team which would play for the national title, a new era was ushered in that day.




Charles Sharon hauls in this 32-yard touchdown pass with 2:08 left in BGSU's upset win over Purdue in 2003.



Sophomore quarterback Omar Jacobs, in his first collegiate start, would hold his own with Heisman Trophy winner Jason White. Jacobs would go on to earn All-American honors and MAC Offensive Player of the Year recognition after throwing for a national-best 41 TD passes. He completed 309-of-462 passes for a BGSU record 4,002 yards.

Following a 1-2 start, BGSU erupted for a 70-16 victory at Temple, won their next seven games, and were ranked by both AP and ESPN for the third straight year.

BGSU would earn its second straight bowl berth and played Memphis in the GMAC Bowl. In its first



Jacobs would throw for five TDs and 365 yards and the Falcon defense would limit the Tigers to seven points in the second half as BGSU won, 52-35. The Falcons were one of a MAC-record five teams selected to participate in a post-season contest.

BGSU began the 2005 season ranked 23rd by Sports Illustrated and Jacobs was featured in ESPN The Magazine.

In 2007, the Falcons were picked to finish fifth in the Mid-American Conference East Division. But following a 32-31 win over Minnesota to open the season, the Falcons rolled to a MAC East

> co-Division championship. Bowling Green went 6-2 in the MAC, and advanced to its third bowl game in five seasons. The Falcons finished 8-5 in 2007.

The 2008 Falcons opened the season with a bang, downing No. 25 Pittsburgh, 27-17, for the Falcons' first win over a ranked team since 2003. That same season, the Orange and Brown hosted Minnesota, marking the first time in school history that a Big Ten team ventured into Doyt Perry Stadium. BGSU finished the 2008 season with a 6-6 record, ushering

in a new era with the hiring of Dave Clawson on Dec. 12, 2008.

Clawson's first year was a memorable one, and the Falcons opened the year with a 31-14 win versus Troy. While finishing 6-2 in the MAC and advancing to the 2009 Humanitarian Bowl, Clawson helped lead an offense that saw Freddie Barnes grab 155 catches in 13 games. That total established a new NCAA record, breaking the old mark of 142 that had been held by Manny Hazard (Houston) since 1989.

BGSU earned its first win over a Big Ten opponent in Doyt Perry Stadium by defeating Indiana in 2014.

Barnes' top moment came on Oct. 10, 2009 at Kent State when he caught 22 passes for 278 yards, one catch shy of the all-time NCAA record. Barnes was a finalist for the Fred Biletnikoff Award that season, given to the nation's top wide receiver.

After three seasons of rebuilding in which the Falcons went from 2-10 (2010) to 5-7 (2011) to 8-5 (2012) and a loss in the Military Bowl to San Jose State, the Falcons were primed to make a run at the Mid-American Conference title.


Bowling Green opened the 2013 season with two straight wins, before suffering their only double-digit loss of the season at Indiana. The Falcons would bounce back with three straight wins at home to improve to 5-1. After a one-point loss on the road at Mississippi State and a three-point loss at home to Toledo, Bowling Green was just 5-3. Needing to run the table for a shot at the MAC Championship, the Falcons put together one of the most dominant stretches in program history. BGSU outscored its next four opponents 176-17, allowing just one offensive touchdown in that span, to advance to the MAC Championship Game

against undefeated Northern Illinois, who was ranked No. 14 in the country.

The Falcons would defeat NIU, 47-27, to win their 11th MAC Championship and first since 1992. BGSU would advance to the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl to play ACC foe Pittsburgh.

On December 18, 2013, after the departure of Clawson to Wake Forest, Director of Athletics D. Christopher Kingston announced the hiring of Dino Babers as the

18th Head Football Coach in Bowling Green State University history.



The 2014 season, though, was just a taste of what was to come in Babers' second year.

With the return of 2013 MAC Championship MVP quarterback Matt Johnson, who missed the final 13 games of the 2014 season with an injury, and an explosive array of wide receivers, Bowling

Green used the 2015 season to post video game stats and break MAC record after MAC record.

Despite a loss to Tennessee to open the season, the team knew something special was brewing as Johnson threw for 424 yards. The following week the Falcons traveled to Maryland looking for the second win over a Big Ten program in as many years.

The game was close for a half and



Bowling Green won its first Bowl game in 10 seasons with a 33-28 triumph over South Alabama in the inaugural Raycom Media Camellia Bowl Dec. 20, 2014.

BGSU just 33 seconds to tie the game in the third quarter and the Falcons exploded for 42 secondhalf points in a 48-27 rout.

After a hard-fought 44-41 loss to a Memphis

the Terrapins held the Falcons' offense in check for

30 minutes, leading 13-6 at the break. But it took

After a hard-fought 44-41 loss to a Memphis team that was nationally ranked for much of the year, the Falcons headed to Purdue with a 1-2 record. But senior Travis Greene, the all-time rushing leader at BGSU, scored with nine seconds left to break a 28-28 tie and give the Falcons their third victory over Big Ten opponents in two years.

That win kickstarted a seven-game winning streak that included blowout victories over UMass (62-38), Akron (59-10), Kent State (48-0) and Ohio (62-24). And for the third consecutive season, BGSU would face Northern Illinois for the MAC Championship.

The Falcons avenged a 2014 MAC Championship loss to Northern Illinois with a 34-14 win that gave BGSU its 12th MAC Championship. Greene was named MAC Championship MVP, while Johnson was the MAC Offensive Player of the Year and the Vern Smith Leadership Award winner. Sophomore wide receiver Roger Lewis was an FWAA Second Team All-American and an AP Third Team All-American. He was also given the Paul Warfield Tropy, as the nation's top receiver.

In December of 2015, BGSU hired Mike Jinks, the associate head coach at Texas Tech, to take the wheels of the program. Bringing a similar aggressive offensive approach to the game, Jinks will have the opportunity to write the next chapter of Bowling Green football.





In a one-time game to help defray the expenses (burial and medical) of families of the 16 members of the Cal Poly San Luis Obispo football team who perished in a plane crash, Oct. 29, 1960, shortly after takeoff from Toledo Express Airport, Bowling Green and Fresno State, the undefeated champion of the California Collegiate Athletic Association, met at the historic Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

Playing before its largest crowd in school history, the Falcons, six-point favorites, were guilty, uncharacteristically, of six turnovers, which was the difference in the game. BG's defense, which was ranked fourth in the nation, yielded 468 yards, 196 more than it had given up to any opponent during the season. Quarterbacks Beau Carter and Jon Anabo were thorns in BG's side all day passing for 368 yards and two touchdowns. Carter ran for two scores, also.

BG scored its only points early in the second stanza on the two-yard run by Ray Bell which was set up on a long pass play between Larry Smith and quarterback Jim Potts.

BG fumbled on its next two possessions with FSU turning the second miscue into a touchdown on a long pass play. Bowling Green did have a pass dropped in the end zone as the first half ended which would have given them the lead. Fresno State then scored 1:44 apart midway through the third period to put the game away, the second score set up by a fumbled snap on an attempted punt. The contest netted \$170,000 for the memorial fund which aided the survivors and the relatives of the victims of the plane crash. Cal Poly SLO had played at Bowling Green the afternoon before the crash.

After a full week of events leading up to the meeting with the Pacific Coast Athletic Association champion Fresno State, the Falcons entered the game against the Bulldogs a two-touchdown underdog.

The Falcons also had to contend with a partisan sea of red squeezed into Bulldog Stadium, the home of Fresno State.

But, the Falcons drew first blood converting a Jac Tomasello interception on the final play of the first quarter into the first touchdown of the game, a Chip Otten four-yard run capping a 48-yard drive. The Falcons took a 14-0 lead to the locker room after driving 73 yards on their next possession. Sophomore quarterback Brian McClure connected with John Meek on the scoring play.

BG looked to be in the driver's seat after McClure connected with Shawn Potts from five yards out in the third stanza. But, Fresno State answered BG's score with their first of the contest later in the quarter.

Bowling Green came right back as Potts picked up a fumble by receiver Greg Taylor at the five-yard line and ran it in to put the Falcons back up by three touchdowns.

With Fresno State pinned back on its own 20-yard line and facing a third-and-ten, a Falcon stop might have put the final nail in the Fresno State coffin. But, FSU gained 15 yards on the third-down play and the comeback

With future NFL receiver Stephone Paige running and catching a pass for a touchdown, FSU closed to within six points with three minutes left. BG used up just 1:05 of the clock on its next possession and FSU moved 45 yards in eight plays with Jeff Tedford finding Vince Wesson over the middle with 11 seconds left. Scott Darrow's PAT was the deciding point.

BG gained just 26 yards on nine plays in the fourth quarter while FSU gained 220 of its 453 yards in the final 15 minutes.



The tone for what was expected to be one of the most evenly-matched California Bowls, came earlier in the week when BGSU head coach Denny Stolz told the team before their Wednesday practice he would be leaving after the bowl game to accept the head coaching job at San Diego State.

An indication of what was ahead for the Falcons in the game came early in the first quarter when, trailing 7-0, they drove to the Bulldog oneyard line where they fumbled the ball away in the end zone, the first of five on the day and the same number they had committed in the first 11 games of the season. Fresno State would score the next 37 points before BG would hit paydirt.

Not even being a double-digit underdog against Fresno State could keep the Falcons from completing its storybook season under first-year head coach Gary Blackney. And the script for this game was all Hollywood.

The first quarter would have led the fans to believe it might take 40 or 50 points to win the game as the Falcons scored touchdowns on their first two possessions and the Bulldogs would get one of those back before the quarter was over.

The scoring continued early in the second stanza as BG's Erik White and Mark Szlachcic hooked up for a second time. But, FSU came right back on their next possession with Anthony Daigle running 57 yards to cut the deficit in half going to the lockerroom.

The defenses took over in the third quarter, each allowing just 65 yards total offense. Late in the quarter, FSU placekicker Derek Mahoney missed a 26-yard field goal, the most significant scoring opportunity of the quarter.

BG scored early in the final stanza moving 80 yards after the missed field goal to build another 14-point lead.

FSU came right back to score, driving 71 yards as quarterback Mark Barsotti completed five-of-six passes, connecting with tight end Marty Thompson from five vards out.

After three changes of possession, FSU started the final drive of the game from their one-yard line, after an interception, with 2:29 remaining.

FSU used its last time out with 24 seconds left and the Bulldogs just nine yards away from the needed touchdown. After a running play for six yards and two incomplete passes, the final play of the game would determine the outcome with three seconds left.

The BG defense rose to the occasion covering all FSU receivers and Barsotti threw incomplete with BG linebacker Kevin O'Brien pressuring.

BG won its 11th game making Blackney one of only three coaches in NCAA history to win 11 games in their first season as a head coach.

In the inaugural Las Vegas Bowl, which replaced the California Bowl, the Falcons faced the high-powered offense of the University of Nevada.

In a game in which the punting game took center stage, the Falcons won the first half and Nevada the second half, but a late BG touchdown proved to be the difference.

The Falcons scored on their first four possessions to grab a 28-3 halftime lead. BG had 267 first-half yards to just 116 for the Wolfpack as they had an 18-6 edge in first downs.

In the second half, it was Nevada quarterback Chris Vargas' turn. He had engineered six Nevada comeback victories in three years coming off the bench, including an NCAA-record 35-point comeback against Weber State.

Nevada scored three touchdowns in the third quarter with punts of five and seven yards by BG setting up the first two scores. The Wolfpack's third score was set up by a high snap from center on a BG punt.

Nevada finally took the lead with 12:41 left in the game and looked to possibly put the game away with a field goal with 7:13 left, ending their run of 31 unanswered points.

Bowling Green then moved to the Nevada six-yard line before turning the ball over on downs. After holding the Wolfpack to one first down, Nevada punter Steve Lester had the center snap go through his hands setting up the Falcons at the Wolfpack 15-yard line with 1:45 remaining.

A 12-yard Erik White to Mark Szlachcic connection on first down put the Falcons on the three-yard line. After two runs and a pass did not net any yardage, White found Dave Hankins alone in the back of the end zone on fourth down with 22 seconds left. Placekicker Brian Leaver made the PAT for the winning points and BG's second consecutive bowl win.

Northwestern took away Bowling Green's running game. So Josh Harris beat the Wildcats through the air. Harris passed for 386 yards and three touchdowns to lead Bowling Green to a 28-24 victory over Northwestern in the Motor City Bowl. It was the first postseason meeting ever between schools from the MAC and Big Ten.

Bowling Green took the lead for good on Harris' 3-yard touchdown pass to Cole Magner with 4:06 left. Harris, who also ran for a TD, set a Motor City Bowl and BGSU record for completions with 38 in 50 attempts. It also marked the third fourth-quarter rally for BGSU against a Big Ten squad (Northwestern in 2001 and Purdue in 2003). Magner also set a game record for catches, finishing with 12 for 97 yards and two touchdowns.

Jason Wright ran for 237 yards on 21 carries and finished with 336 all-purpose yards for Northwestern. He had a 77-yard TD run - the secondlongest run in Motor City Bowl history - to give the Wildcats a 17-7 lead early in the third quarter and an 88-yard kickoff return early in the fourth to set up Noah Herron's 2-yard touchdown run that made it 24-21.

Bowling Green used two 80-yard scoring drives to take a 21-17 lead early in the fourth. Harris threw a 7-yard TD pass to Magner, and put the Falcons on top with an 11-yarder to Steve Sanders.

Northwestern opened the scoring on Herron's 40-yard fourth-down run in the first quarter, and made it 10-0 on Brian Huffman's 31-yard field goal. Bowling Green answered with a 67-yard drive, capped by Harris' 4-yard run.

Omar Jacobs went from Bowling Green's question mark to the Mid-American Conference's latest star quarterback. Jacobs capped a marvelous sophomore season by passing for 365 yards and five touchdowns to lead the Falcons to a 52-35 victory over Memphis in the GMAC Bowl.

The Falcons (9-3) turned a shootout into a blowout after leading 35-28 at halftime to win their fourth consecutive bowl game. Jacobs got them started with four first-half touchdown passes - two apiece to Charles Sharon and Steve Sanders helped carry them the rest of the way. Pope ran 28 times for 151 yards and a pair of 1-yard touchdowns. He also caught a 13-yard pass for the only score of the third quarter. The Tigers (8-4), playing in backto-back bowl games for the first time, couldn't keep up with the nation's No. 4 offense, which totaled 558 total yards.

Jacobs, whose 41 touchdown passes led the nation and set a Mid-American Conference record, completed 26-of-44 passes with an interception to earn Most Valuable Player honors.

At halftime, the teams seemed poised to take aim at the 2001 GMAC Bowl, the highest scoring bowl game in history with 125 combined points for Marshall and East Carolina. The offenses stopped themselves early in the third quarter. Jacobs threw only his fourth interception of the season to give the Tigers the ball at Bowling Green's 41. Memphis tried to go for it on fourth down but was twice penalized for having 12 men on the field. Bowling Green made it 42-28 on the ensuing possession with Pope slipping underneath for a 13-yard touchdown catch on third-and-7. The Tigers then squandered another trip across midfield when a scrambling Wimprine fumbled the ball and Bowling Green's Mike Thaler recovered 31 yards behind the line of scrimmage to set up a field goal. Even the weather worked in the offenses' favor, however, with a driving rainstorm subsiding a few minutes before kickoff to clear the way for Jacobs and Wimprine to go to work. They took full advantage. Jacobs capped his four-touchdown half with a 17-yarder to Sanders, who reached over defensive back Cameron Essex in the end zone with 37 seconds left.

Not surprisingly, it was a night for offensive records. Jacobs set the MAC record with his 41st overall touchdown rushing or passing in the first quarter, adding four more. He also joined Ben Roethlisberger and Byron Leftwich as the league's only 4,000-yard passers. The Falcons also set the MAC record for scoring average in a season.

Hurricane Paul Smith and the nation's top-rated offense turned a little charity into a lot of history in the GMAC Bowl.

Smith had his NCAA-record 14th consecutive 300-yard passing game, and Tulsa converted four fumble recoveries into first-half touchdowns on the way to a 63-7 win over Bowling Green in the 2007 GMAC Bowl.

With all that help, the Golden Hurricane (10-4) ran up a 35-0 halftime lead and capped coach Todd Graham's first season by reaching 10 wins for the first time since 1991.

Smith passed for 312 yards and five touchdowns. He broke the record of 13 300-yard efforts in a row he shared with BYU's Ty Detmer, whose streak stretched over the 1989 and 1990 seasons.

He and Tarrion Adams joined Houston's David Klingler and Chuck Weatherspoon as the NCAA's only 5,000-yard passing and 1,000-yard rushing tandems.

Tulsa outgained Bowling Green (8-5) 562-229 in total yards.

Adams scored touchdowns running, passing and receiving before halftime and ran for 112 yards. Trae Johnson caught two scoring passes.

Bowling Green, which had won four consecutive bowl games, lost three fumbles in its own territory in the first quarter and never recovered.

Quarterback Tyler Sheehan was helped off the field with a left ankle injury with 24 seconds left in the first half and didn't return. Sheehan passed for 141 yards and ran for another 21.

Down 42-0, Bowling Green got on the board when Roger Williams scored on a 78-yard kick return early in the third quarter for the Falcons' only points. It was the first kickoff return for a touchdown in the history of the GMAC Bowl.

The Bowling Green State University football team got a 51-yard touchdown from Freddie Barnes with 32 seconds remaining to take a 42-35 lead but surrendered a touchdown with four seconds to go, as well as a two-point conversion, to fall 43-42 to the Idaho Vandals in the 2009 Roady's Humanitarian Bowl in Boise, Idaho.

BGSU rallied back from a 28-14 and 35-28 deficits to lead with 32 seconds to go but the Vandals drove 66 yards on three plays, including a 50yard strike to open the drive to get within one at 42-41. After a timeout the Vandals elected to go for two, converting in the back of the endzone for the winning score.

The Falcons opened the scoring with senior quarterback Tyler Sheehan hooking up with Biletnikoff finalist Freddie Barnes on a 35-yard touchdown. Sheehan would call Barnes' number 16 more times, finishing with a Humanitarian Bowl records of 17 receptions for 219 yards, while Sheehan completed 33-of-47 passes for 387 yards and four touchdowns.

Barnes would finish the season with 155 receptions, smashing the alltime NCAA mark of 142, held by Manny Hazzard (Houston) since 1989. For his efforts he was named BGSU's Roady's Humanitarian Bowl Most Valuable

... Idaho started the second half off with a bang, scoring a pair of touchdowns in a four minute span to go up 28-14 with 5:30 to go in the third quarter, a spot Bowling Green has seen before and answered.

First, Sheehan connected with fellow classmate Jimmy Scheidler on a 15-yard touchdown with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter and then found Barnes on an out-route at 12:15 in the fourth to knot the score at 28 apiece.

The Vandals would answer back with a 74-yard drive to once again take the lead, this time, 35-28 with 8:32 to go in the game.

A two-yard Geter touchdown, his second of the game, pushed the score to 35-35 and following a stop by the BGSU defense Sheehan and the Falcons marched 80 yards to take a 42-35 lead with 32 seconds remaining before the final winning drive by Idaho.

After a Gabe Martin blocked punt, the Falcons would get to within one point with another field goal from Tate, this time from 33 yards out.

San Jose State would add a field goal before the half to take a 10-6 lead

After the Falcons punted to begin the second half, the defense would come up with a big play to help the struggling offense out. Charlie Walker's rush off the edge produced a huge hit on quarterback David Fales, causing him to fumble. All-American Chris Jones was there to pick it up and return it 21 yards to the San Jose State eight yard line.

On the very next play, Anthon Samuel would take a handoff and scamper into the endzone for the touchdown and a 13-10 Falcon lead.

After a three-and-out late in the third quarter, Brian Schmiedebusch's punt would be blocked by San Jose State's special teams. The ball would carry through the end zone for a safety.

On the very next drive, San Jose State would take the lead on an 18 yard pass from Fales to Chandler Jones.

. The Falcons would come right back, as John Pettigrew would find a seam and go 37 yards on a handoff down to the San Jose State one yard line. On the very next play, Pettigrew would punch it in, giving the Falcons another lead at 20-19.

With 4:43 left to play in the game, San Jose State's Austin Lopez would knock home a field goal for a two point Spartan lead. On the next drive, Matt Schilz was hit from behind and would fumble. San Jose State was there to

The Spartans would convert for a touchdown following that turnover.

Chris Blewitt's field goal with 1:17 remaining gave the University of Pittsburgh a 30-27 win over the Bowling Green State University football team in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl at Ford Field in Detroit, Mich.

Pitt freshman James Conner ran for 229 yards and a touchdown, while the Panthers' Tyler Boyd had 173 receiving yards and returned a punt 54

The Panthers had 487 yards of total offense to the Falcons' 289. BGSU quarterback Matt Johnson threw for 272 yards and a pair of scores, completing 20 of 32 passes on the night. For Pitt, Tom Savage was 8-of-13 for 124 yards before leaving the game due to injury late in the first half. Chad Voytik was 5-of-9 for 108 yards in relief.

Pitt had a total of seven quarterback sacks in the game.

On BG's second drive, Johnson found Shaun Joplin for gains of 18 and 17 yards, respectively, on back-to-back plays. Joplin led the BG receivers with six catches and 86 yards vs. the Panthers. The Falcons got into the red zone before the drive stalled, and Tyler Tate kicked a 28-yard field goal fo give the Brown and Orange the early lead.

Trailing by a touchdown at halftime, BGSU drew even at the start of the second half, as BooBoo Gates returned the opening kickoff 94 yards for a score. Tate's PAT tied the game with only 11 seconds elapsed.

That Gates return tied the school record for longest kickoff return in history, matching Leon Weathersby's 94-yard return in a 1997 game at Perry Stadium.

The next drive, however, saw the Panthers kick what proved to be the winning field goal. On the second play of that drive, Voytik rolled out and gained 19 yards, giving Pitt a first down at midfield. Conner gained 20 yards on the following play. Voytik handed the ball to Conner on each of the next three plays, gaining a total of nine yards. On that third-down play, Conner was stopped for no gain, but on fourth down, Blewitt's 39-yard kick was

With 1:04 remaining in the game, quarterback James Knapke found freshman wide receiver Roger Lewis for a 78-yard touchdown to put the Bowling Green State University football team ahead for good, 33-28, over South Alabama in the inaugural Raycom Media Camellia Bowl.

With 1:20 to play in the game, South Alabama had taken the lead on a three-yard rush by running back Terrance Timmons, overcoming a 13-point deficit to take a 28-27 lead.

But, on the first play from scrimmage, Knapke would find Lewis deep down the middle of the field and the freshman would do the rest for his second game-winning touchdown reception of the season.

James Knapke was named Bart Starr Most Valuable Player, passing for 368 yards and two touchdowns - both of which were to Lewis. Lewis finished with a team-high 137 yards receiving in the game, finishing his inaugural campaign with 1,093 receiving yards. He became just the seventh player in BGSU history to have a 1,000-yard season and was the first freshman to ever do so.

On the first drive of the night, Bowling Green would move the ball into South Alabama territory, but would face a 4th-and-2 from the USA 44 yard line. On the fourth down play, Knapke would drop back and find Lewis past his defender for a BGSU touchdown and 7-0 lead.

The Falcons would increase their lead to 14-0 later in the first quarter with a one-yard rush by Travis Greene, capping off a nine play, 93-yard drive for the score. The big play on the drive came on Gehrig Dieter's 53-yard reception from Knapke.

BGSU's Tyler Tate would add two field goals - of 39 and 22 yards - to give the Falcons a 20-7 lead going into the half.

South Alabama would score 14 straight points in the fourth quarter to take the lead, but Knapke's bomb to Lewis would allow the Falcons to come out victorious in the Camellia Bowl. The win for the Falcons marked the first bowl win for the Mid-American Conference since the 2012 season.

Georgia Southern scored 35 unanswered points in the second half to overcome Bowling Green's 27-23 halftime lead Wednesday evening to defeat the Falcons 58-27 in the GoDaddy Bowl.

Matt Johnson threw three first half touchdowns and Travis Greene scored from five vards out with 36 seconds left in the first half to put the Falcons ahead 27-23.

Bowling Green built a 20-9 second-quarter lead as the Falcons moved the ball well in the first half. Georgia Southern scored the game's first touchdown but Johnson answered by improvising on a fourth-and-one after mishandling the football. He found Roger Lewis for a 45-yard touchdown but Georgia Southern went ahead 9-6 after blocking the extra point and returning it for two points.

Over the next two Georgia Southern drives, the Eagles had just nine yards on six plays and failed to pick up a first down. That gave the Falcons the opportunity to build a lead as Johnson found Ronnie Moore with a shovel pass on an end around for a 15-yard touchdown to make it 13-9.

On the first play of BGSU's first drive of the second quarter, Johnson found Gehrig Dieter streaking down the sideline for a 51-yard touchdown. The eight-second drive was the second-fastest of the season and gave the Falcons a 20-9 lead with 11:42 to play in the first half.

With just 1:27 left in the first half, the Falcons got the ball back and Greene took over. After a seven-yard pass to Dieter to the 41-yard line, Greene ripped off a 52-yard rush to the seven-yard line. Two plays later, he scored from five yards out to give the Falcons a 27-23 halftime lead.

Georgia Southern put the game away in the second half with three third-quarter touchdowns and two more in the fourth.

DOYT L. PERRY

1988 College Football Hall of Fame Inductee

The year 1988 will be fondly remembered by many who are associated with the football program at BGSU. That year Doyt L. Perry, a former player, coach and administrator was recognized by the National Football Foundation with its top honor, induction into the College Football Hall of Fame.

Perry traveled to New York in December of 1988 for the Foundation's Hall of Fame dinner and was officially enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame in June, 1989, in ceremonies held at Kings Island, Ohio.


Perry's association with BGSU dates back to the 1920s when he lettered nine times in three sports (football, basketball and baseball). The Croton, Ohio native received his degree in 1932. He began coaching on the high school level before becoming an assistant at Ohio State in 1951.

Perry returned to his alma mater in 1955, leading the football program to a 77-11-5 (.855) record over the next 11 years. His teams won five Mid-American Conference titles and one national college division championship in 1959. Perry's winning percentage ranks fifth on the all-time NCAA list.

Perry, who retired from coaching in 1964 to become BGSU's athletic director, developed such outstanding coaches as Bill Mallory, Don Nehlen, Larry Smith, and the late Dave McClain. Many more of Perry's former assistants and players have gone on to enjoy success in the coaching profession.

Perry passed away in February of 1992. At his memorial service former Michigan coach Bo Schembechler, an assistant on Perry's 1955 staff, said, "I don't believe I can name a coach, anywhere, anytime, anyhow, who did it better than Doyt Perry."

A documentary on Perry's career was released in May of 1998. It was produced by WBGU-TV.

WHY ORANGE AND BROWN?

Orange and brown have been the school colors at Bowling Green State University since 1914, the first year of classes. Legend has it that Leon Winslow, an industrial arts faculty member, got the idea from watching a women's hat on a bus to nearby Toledo, Ohio. He liked the brown and orange color combination. So, too, did former Cleveland Browns' head coach Paul Brown. Following a trip to BGSU in the 1940s, Brown used the colors for his All-America Conference team.

Ay Ziggy Zoomba is Bowling Green's unofficial fight song. Gil Fox, an Air Force bombadier in World War II stationed in Italy, brought a loose translation of a Zulu war chant back with him, and since its introduction in 1946 to a campus spirit assembly, it has kept its place in BGSU history. The Falcon football team traditionally sings "Ay Ziggy Zoomba" after each victory.

Retired Jersey

The only football jersey retired at Bowling Green is #29. It was worn by Paul Miles from 1971-73. Miles rushed for 3,239 yards and 25 touchdowns in his career and was a three-time first team All-MAC selection. He was just the third back in NCAA history to rush for 1,000 or more yards in three consecutive seasons.

Frieda & Freddie Falcon

Frieda and Freddie Falcon are the official mascots of the Bowling Green Falcons. Together with the BGSU cheerleaders, Frieda and Freddie boost spirit at intercollegiate athletic events. Tryouts are held each spring, and winners remain anonymous to the student body until each is unveiled at the last home basketball and hockey game. The Freddie Falcon tradition began in 1950 while Frieda Falcon was added for the 1979-80 athletic year.



Why The Falcons?

The 2016-17 athletic year marks the 89th anniversary of Bowling Green's nickname, Falcons. Before 1927, BG teams were called the Normals or Teachers. Ivan Lake '23 suggested the nickname after reading an article on falconry. Lake, managing editor and sports editor of the Sentinel Tribune in Bowling Green at the time, proposed the name change because it fit headline space and because falcons were "the most powerful bird for their size and often attacked birds two or three times their size."





PEACE PIPE AWARD

The Peace Pipe was a traveling award that went to the winner of the annual gridiron battle between Bowling Green and Toledo. The Peace Pipe tradition actually began on the basketball court during the 1947-48 season. At that time, the teams exchanged a six-foot long wooden peace pipe. The original basketball Peace Pipe disappeared, so, in 1980, the Peace Pipe was reinstated for football with former UT football player Frank Kralik creating the present trophy. Today's Peace Pipe is a smaller version of the original pipe, resting atop a trophy. The Peace Pipe was eliminated prior to the 2011 season and replaced by the "Battle of I-75" Trophy.



ANNIVERSARY AWARD

The Anniversary Award is a traveling award that goes to the winner of the football game between Bowling Green and Kent State. Established in 1985 by the respective alumni departments at BGSU and KSU, the Anniversary Award commemorates the founding of BGSU and KSU in the year 1910.

DOYT L. PERRY STADIUM



Doyt L. Perry Stadium has added lights, a new scoreboard, turf, chairback seating and the Sebo Athletic Center since 2001

Doyt L. Perry Stadium, with its 24,000 seating capacity, is celebrating its 50th year as the home of Bowling Green State University football. In 2001 permanent lighting was installed at the venue and home attendance doubled. In 2007 FieldTurf and the Sebo Athletic Center were added and in 2012 a high definition video board in the south endzone was installed. A new synthetic turf surface, featuring Shaw Sports Turf's PowerBlade Pro system, was installed in the summer of 2016.

Built in 1966 for approximately \$3 million as a replacement for the 43-year-old University Stadium, Perry Stadium had a capacity of 23,272 until bleacher seats were installed in both end zones in 1982 (Those bleachers have been removed to give way for the Sebo Athletic Center, giving BGSU the 24,000 current capacity). One of the largest and most attractive athletic facilities in the Mid-American Conference, Perry Stadium set the conference record for single-game attendance.

On Oct. 8, 1983, a huge crowd of 33,527 packed into Perry Stadium for

the annual Northwest Ohio rivalry between Bowling Green and Toledo, establishing a school and MAC record for single-game attendance. The Falcons went on to set a season record, breaking the six-digit figure for five games with a total draw of 100,021. It marked the first time in history that Bowling Green averaged more than 20,000 fans for five home football games.

That figure was topped in 1985, when Bowling Green posted a perfect record (11-0) in the regular season and clinched the MAC Championship by shutting out Toledo at Perry Stadium in November. More than 28,000 fans turned out that day, raising Bowling Green's season attendance to an average of 22,422. In 1994, BG fans bettered the mark of 1985 as 114,802 fans, an average of 22,960, attended the five home games.

In 2003, Falcon faithful attended sellout games against Northern Illinois and Toledo as ESPN broadcast three games live from the facility and brought its weekly college football show, College Gameday, to Bowling Green. That year, BGSU averaged more than 21,000 per home game and Perry Stadium remains the only MAC football stadium to have hosted College Gameday.

Perry Stadium is more than just a football facility. The east side of the stadium includes locker rooms, equipment rooms, and some Athletic Department offices. The west side is the home of the BGSU Golf Training Center, filled with a 1,200 square foot putting green, locker rooms and hitting bays, as well as offices for both men's and women's soccer.

Sitting atop the press box on the west side of the stadium is the plush Stadium Club. The Stadium Club's 106 theatre-type seats provide loyal BGSU fans with the best view of the game. The President's Box, located at the top of the east side of the stadium, provides luxury seating for the University President and her guests, along with other supporters of Falcon football.

The construction of elevators on both sides of the stadium, completed in early 1998, has made the stadium more accessible for all fans. Renovations to all boxes on both sides and the stadium club have taken place over the last few years making for a more fan-friendly atmosphere. Bowling Green won the first game ever played in Perry Stadium, defeating Dayton, 13-0, on Oct. 1, 1966. Since that time, the Falcons have won over 65 percent of their home games, compiling a 162-85-6 record in the 253 games played at Perry Stadium.

Perry Stadium is named in honor of the man who led Bowling Green to a 77-11-5 record in his 10 years as the head coach of the Falcons. Doyt L. Perry was simply one of the greatest football coaches of his day. His .855 winning percentage over 10 seasons in the 1950s and 1960s remains one of the highest in football history. In fact, Perry is fifth all-time behind Bob Reade (Augustana), Knute Rockne (Notre Dame), Frank Leahy (Notre Dame), and Larry Kehres (Mount Union) in winning percentage among coaches with at least 10 years of service on the collegiate level. Perry served as the BGSU athletic director for seven years (1965-71) after stepping down as football coach.

PRESIDENT MARY ELLEN MAZEY, PHD



Mary Ellen Mazey became the 11th president of Bowling Green State University on July 1, 2011. Prior to assuming the presidency, she served as Provost and Vice-President of Academic Affairs at Auburn University, as Dean of the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences at West Virginia University, and as Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at Wright State University. In 1996-97 she had an Intergovernmental Personnel Assignment and served as Director of the Office of University Partnerships at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. A first-generation college graduate, Dr. Mazey earned bachelor's and master's degrees from West Virginia University and a Ph.D. in geography from the University of Cincinnati.

President Mazey is deeply committed to student success and to providing a high quality education that leads to long-term career value for students. Her vision for BGSU is focused on building regional, state, national and global partnerships that enhance the student experience, facilities, revenues and ensure that BGSU is positioned in the global marketplace. She is committed to a diverse campus environment that serves all students.

With her emphasis on strategic planning and partnership building, BGSU has partnered with a local hospital for a new student health center, with the State of Ohio for a new crime laboratory, and with North Star Aviation for a new hangar/classroom

building. There is an emphasis on providing new classroom space for innovative, new academic programming. The campus has renovated or opened 10 new buildings in the last three years.

Dr. Mazey has served as a consultant on strategic planning and as an evaluator for the Higher Learning Commission. She currently serves on the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities (APLU) Voluntary System of Accountability (VSA) Board and as Chair-elect of the board for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA). In addition, she serves on the board of directors of the Toledo Chamber of Commerce and the northwest Ohio Regional Growth Partnership.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS BOB MOOSBRUGGER



Bowling Green State University named Bob Moosbrugger (pronounced MOOSE-brugger) as its 14th Director of Athletics in May of 2016. A 1994 graduate of BGSU, Moosbrugger left his post as Deputy Director of Athletics / Chief Operating Officer at San Diego State University.

"We are pleased to welcome Bob Moosbrugger home to BGSU," said Mary Ellen Mazey, Ph.D., president of Bowling Green State University. "He brings a wealth of experience in athletics operations as well as in donor, alumni and community outreach. Most importantly, he has an unparalleled commitment to student success. I look forward to working with him to take BGSU Athletics to the next level."

Moosbrugger has served at San Diego State in two stints, starting in March of 2000 as the assistant director for the Aztec Athletic Foundation. He was promoted to assistant athletic director/director of the Aztec Foundation in 2004. He was named the director of business development at the San Diego International Sports Council in February 2006 before returning to the Aztecs in September 2007 as the associate athletic director for development. In June 2015, he was promoted to his most recent role.

Prior to his time at San Diego State, Moosbrugger was as an assistant ticket manager and athletic ticket manager at Fresno State from 1996-2000. He was a graduate assistant at Ball State from 1994-96.

"I'm excited to be back in Bowling Green," Moosbrugger said. "It's amazing to think that I started here as a student 26 years ago. I am humbled and honored to serve as Director of Athletics.
