Robert H. Whittaker came to Bowling Green State University in 1941 as head football coach with a reputation for producing winners in high school circles at Sandusky.

A WAR BABY

Bowling Green's gridiron relations with Alma originated in wartime a year ago under the V-12 program when the Falcons entertained the Michigan school at Homecoming and won by a score of 24 to 0 before the smallest homecoming crowd in history. It was the week-end that the V-12 was closing a leave of a week's duration.

HOMECOMING DAY

Next week-end the Falcons entertain Ohio Wesleyan here and the occasion will be the 23rd annual Homecoming Day of Bee Gee. Though the Falcons downed the Bishops 13 to 6 earlier in the season at Delaware the foe outgained B.G. during the game and will be a definite threat to reverse the tables this time.

Coach George Gauthier turned the tables on Bowling Green last year in the second game, winning 32 to 20 after the Falcons had won the opener 18 to 7.

The Homecoming Committee is anticipating the return to the campus of a large number of former students and graduates. A full program is being planned.

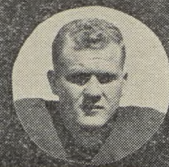

Record Of All Sports For Year 1943-1944

Bowling Green State University's athletic record last year was one of the best in its history if not the best. The football team would have ranked with the best in Ohio had not the season extended beyond the first term of the V-12 when withdrawals of seniors to officers training depleted the squad and resulted in the loss of the last two games.

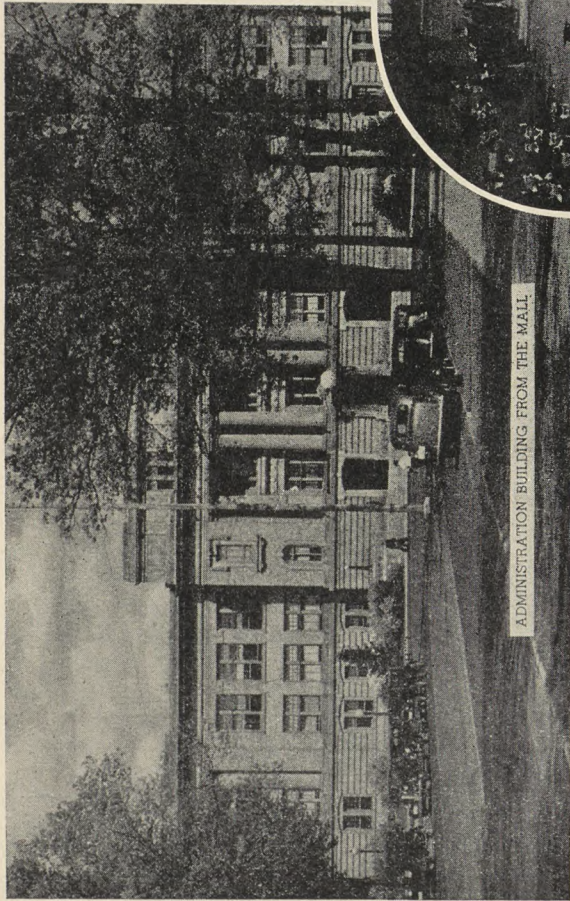
The basketball team shared the Ohio College title with Denison and then accepted an invitation to play in the Annual Madison Square Garden Invitational tournament in New York City losing in the first game to the ultimate champion, St. Johns College of New York.

The track team was undefeated in dual competition, won the Northeast Ohio A.A.U. meet at Berea and the Ohio College meet at Ohio Wesleyan, including among their victims, Ohio State, and thereby being undisputed state champion.

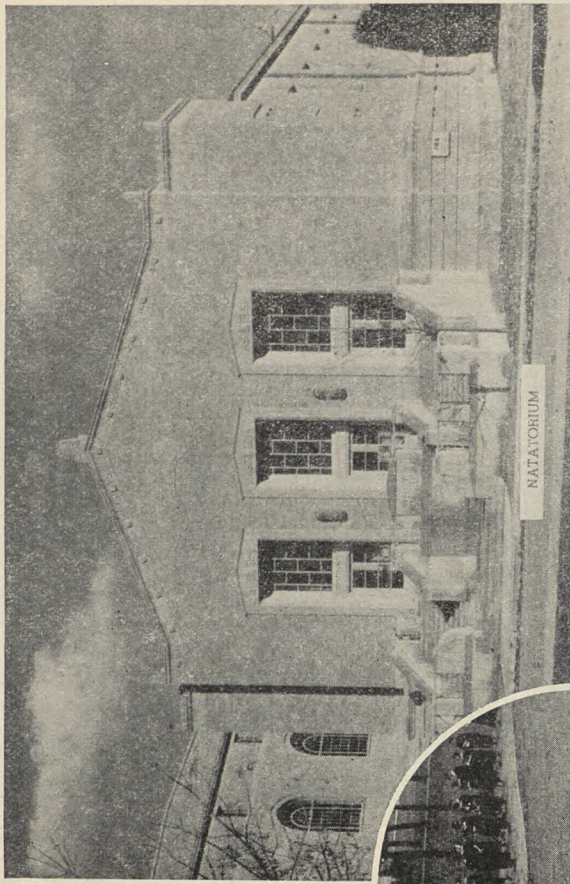
The baseball team won the Ohio College title last spring. They also won three out of four from Camp Perry, the service-team champion in the middlewest.

The record of each sport—Football—won 5, lost 3, tied 1; basketball—won 22, lost 4; swimming—won 1, lost 5; baseball—won 20, lost 3; trackwon 6, lost 0. Totals for the year—Victories 54. Losses 15, ties 1.

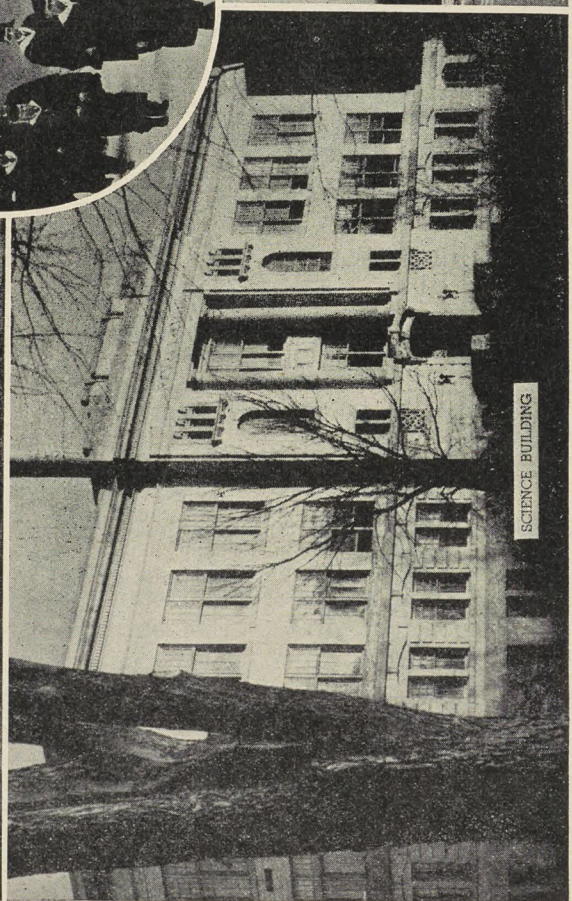
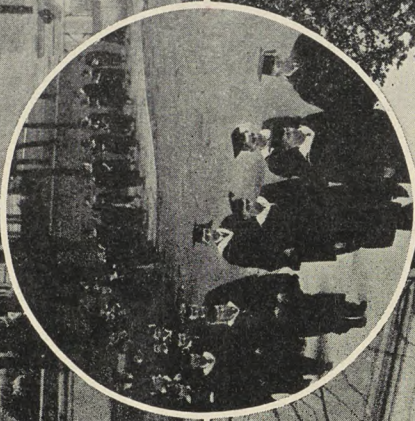
SCENES OF BOWLING GREEN STATE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS



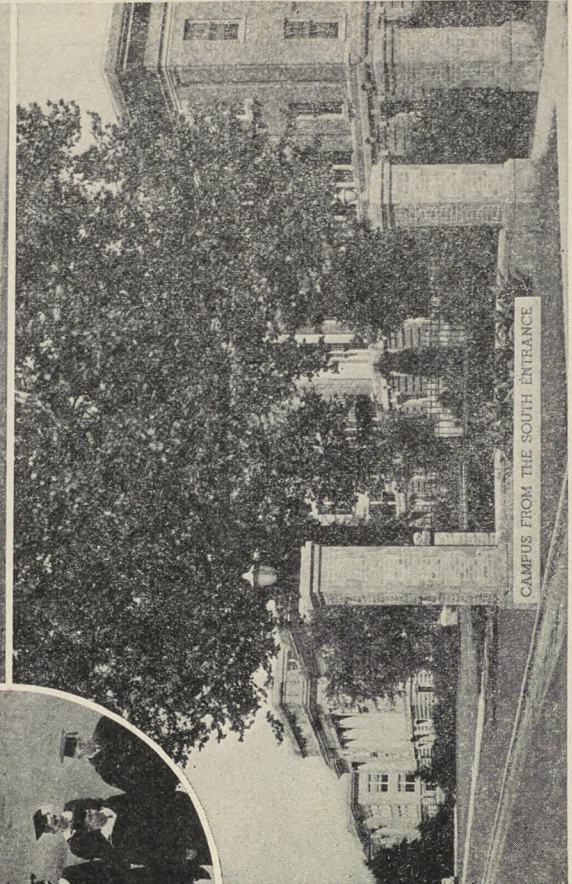
