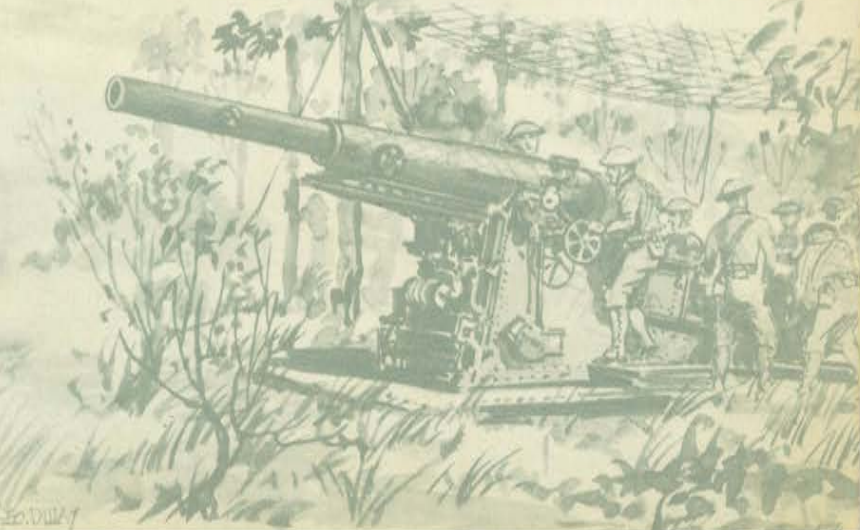
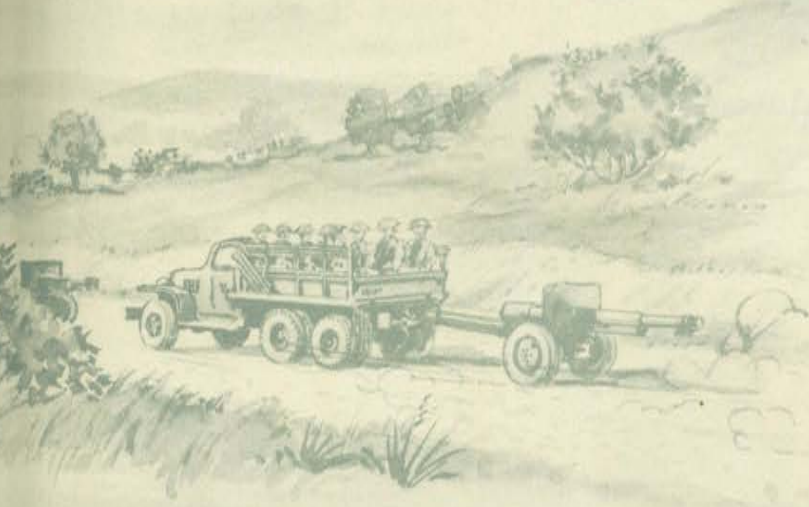

General Lewis was born March 23, 1888, at Washington, D. C., where he attended public schools until November, 1906, at which time he moved to Lansing, Michigan, where he has since resided.

He began his military career March 30, 1908, as an enlisted man and has, with the exception of a short period following the World War, continued in the military service of the State of Michigan and the United States since that time.

He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Field Artillery February 20, 1912, and First Lieutenant January 8, 1915. He served in Federal service on the Mexican border from June 19, 1916, until March 23, 1917. After his return from this service he was commissioned and served as a Captain from June 1, 1917, until July 14, 1917.

General Lewis entered Federal service in World War I as a Captain on July 15, 1917, was promoted to Major October 25, 1918, and remained in that capacity until June 2, 1919, when he was discharged upon returning to the United States from France, where he served as a Battalion Commander in the 119th Field Artillery.

He again accepted a commission as a Captain of Field Artillery in the Michigan National Guard November 9, 1920, was promoted to Major July 22, 1921, to Lieutenant Colonel October 5, 1921, and to Colonel February 20, 1922. During this period he served with the 119th Field Artillery, which he commanded from its inception after the war until he assumed command of the 57th Field Artillery Brigade in 1939.

The General was a Colonel of Field Artillery in the Officers Reserve Corps from September 15, 1923, until March 29, 1927. He is a graduate of the Army War College G-1 Course, 1925, of the Command and General Staff School, National Guard Officers Course, 1926, and of the Field Artillery School of Fire at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1917.

From May 20, 1938, until November 15, 1940, General Lewis was on active duty with the National Guard Bureau in Washington, D. C.

R.O.T.C. duty at Fort Knox, Kentucky, and later at Yale University, New Haven, Conn; 7th Field Artillery, Fort Ethan Allen, Vermont; 4th Field Artillery (Pack and Portee), in Panama; 17th Field Artillery, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; 10th Field Artillery, Fort Lewis, Washington. Instructor, 343rd and 349th Field Artillery, Fort Worth, Texas, and of the 345th and 53rd Field Artillery and on 90th Division Headquarters Staff, San Antonio, Texas. Headquarters Battery, 4th Field Artillery Brigade and Field Artillery School Detachment (White), Fort Sill, Oklahoma. Instructor, 258th F. A. 155mm Gun, New York National Guard, New York, N. Member of the American Plebiscitary Commission, Tacna-Arica, South America, 1926, and of the American Electoral Missions in Nicaragua in 1928 and 1930.

Colonel Tate joined the brigade on September 6, 1941, serving as Inspector from that date until November 10th, when he was appointed Executive Officer.

Brigade as Aide to Brigadier General Joseph H. Lewis. Graduated Battery Officers Course, Number 24, Field Artillery School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1941.

Major Edward J. Eisele enlisted in 1st Battalion Hq., 119th F.A., July 12, 1921. He was promoted to Corporal, Sergeant and First Sergeant. In June, 1926, he was commissioned 2nd Lieutenant and transferred to Battery B, 119th, as a reconnaissance officer. On May 12, 1930, he was transferred to the Regimental Staff as liaison officer and commissioned 1st Lieutenant. On July 6, 1936, he was transferred to 1st Battalion Staff as Battalion Executive. On October 12, 1938, he was commissioned as Captain. On October 15, 1940, Major Eisele was transferred to the newly-organized 72nd Brigade Staff as S-3, and on October 17, 1940, commissioned Major. Major Conway was born at Jackson, Michigan, July 1, 1906. He was graduated from the public schools of Jackson and received A.B. and LL.B. Degrees from the University of Michigan. In private life he is a practicing lawyer.

His first military experience came as a student in the Citizens Military Training Camps in the summers of 1923-25. He enlisted as a private in the Enlisted Reserve Corps for a period of three years beginning August 28, 1924.

He was appointed Second Lieutenant, Quartermaster Reserves, February 25, 1932, which commission he held until June 6, 1934.

Major Conway enlisted as a Private in Battery E, 119th Field Artillery, October 24, 1933, was promoted to Sergeant and was discharged May 2, 1934, to accept a commission of Second Lieutenant of the Field Artillery on the following day. He served as Reconnaissance Officer and as Assistant Executive Officer of Battery E until June 28, 1937. On that date he was promoted to First Lieutenant and assigned to Second Battalion Headquarters as Plans and Training Officer. He was promoted to Captain August 18, 1940, and assumed command of Battery C November 18, 1940. He was transferred to Headquarters, 72nd Field Artillery Brigade, June 1, 1941. He was promoted to Major September 25, 1941.

Major Conway was graduated from the National Guard and Reserve Officers Course, Field Artillery School, in 1938, and the Third Special Course, Command and General Staff School, 1941.

HISTORY OF THE 72nd

The 72nd Field Artillery Brigade, although composed of veteran troops, is a comparatively new organization. It is made up of the 119th Field Artillery, the 177th Field Artillery, and the 182nd Field Artillery and was formed in September, 1940, under the command of Colonel Joseph H. Lewis, who has since been promoted to the rank of Brigadier General. General Lewis formerly commanded the 57th Field Artillery Brigade.

The 119th Field Artillery, a World War Artillery Regiment of the 32nd Division, was converted from a light artillery regiment to a 155 millimeter gun regiment by Special Order 224, Adjutant General's Office, State of Michigan, September 18, 1940, and assigned to the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade. It is commanded by Colonel Glenn W. Carey.

The 182nd Field Artillery, formerly medium artillery of the Sixth Corps, was likewise transferred to the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade, remaining a 155 millimeter howitzer regiment. Colonel George V. N. Lothrop is in command.

Fire power was completed by the addition of the second Howitzer Regiment, the 177th Field Artillery. The regiment was formed from all the Michigan units of the First Squadron, 106th Cavalry, and of the 107th Quartermaster Regiment, and is commanded by Colonel Russell G. Simpson.

On the 7th day of April, 1941, the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade was inducted into Federal Service in accordance with a Presidential Order dated January 11, 1941. Induction having been completed, the Brigade proceeded by rail and motor convoy to Fort Knox, Kentucky, where it began the early stages of its preliminary training. While at Fort Knox, the Brigade lived under canvas and experienced many uncomfortable periods of inclement weather, which alternately subjected the personnel to deep mud and fine dust, indoors and out. The Brigade remained at Fort Knox until June 1, 1941, and then proceeded to its first permanent station at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, arriving there June 2nd.

Here again the Brigade experienced many hardships, including an unusual amount of mud that had hampered the camp's construction. However, the command immediately set out to make the quarters and grounds habitable, constructed gravel paths and roads, and generally put the place in order. Then came hard work to prepare for any eventuality that it might be called upon to face.

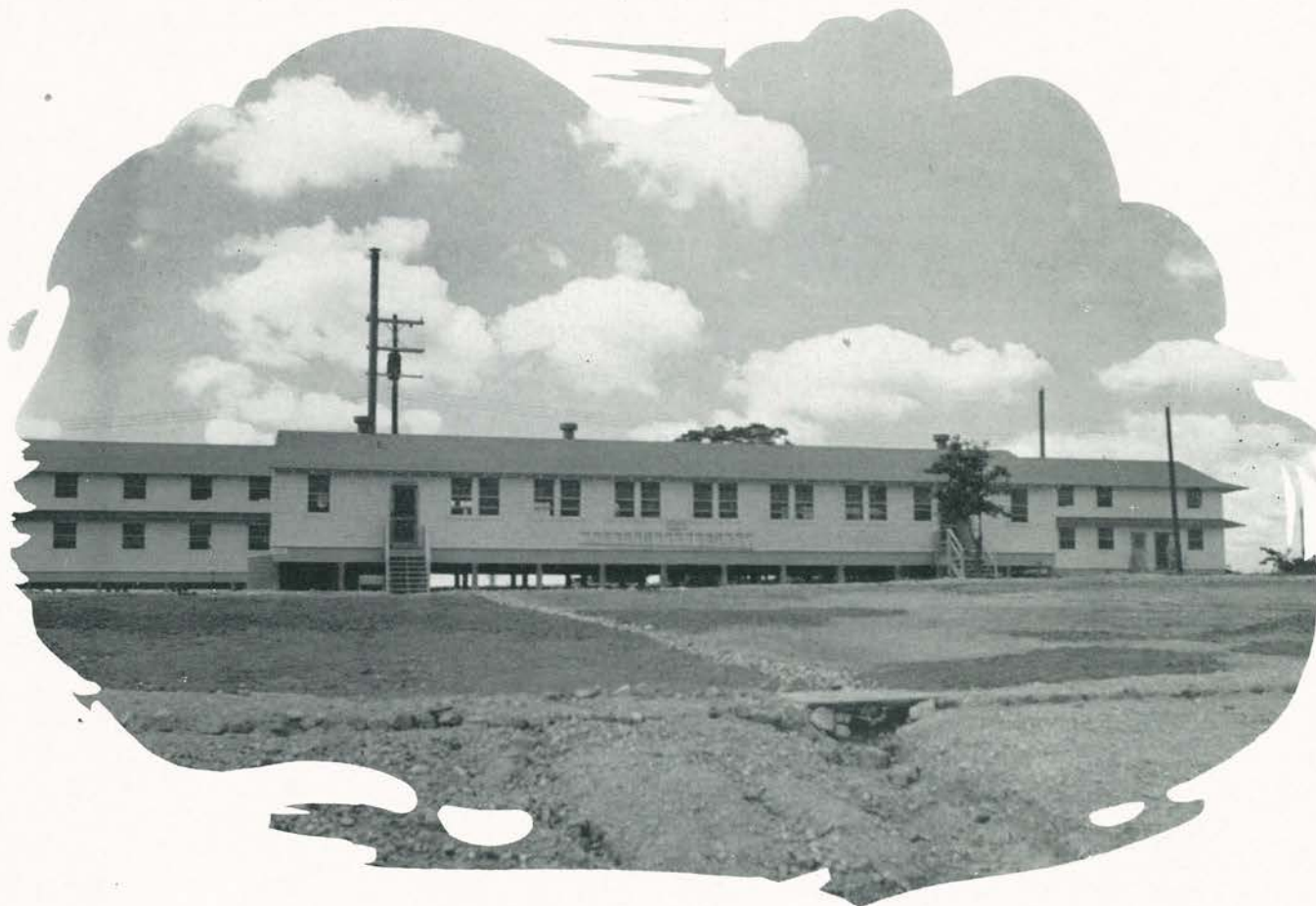
By War Department directive and by order of the Sixth Division to which the Brigade was attached for administration, the 72nd Brigade Antitank Battalion was formed, being composed of the

Antitank Batteries from the Howitzer Regiments, from Anti-Aircraft and Antitank platoons of the Regimental Headquarters Batteries of the 119th Field Artillery, and from the Battalion Headquarters Batteries of the 177th and 182nd Field Artillery. This Battalion was activated on August 5, 1941, under the command of Lieutenant Colonel George B. Ely and immediately prepared to participate in the Second Army Maneuvers as a part of the VII Army Corps. It followed into the Maneuver Area the Second Battalion, 119th Field Artillery, who participated in the maneuvers as Second Army Special Troops.

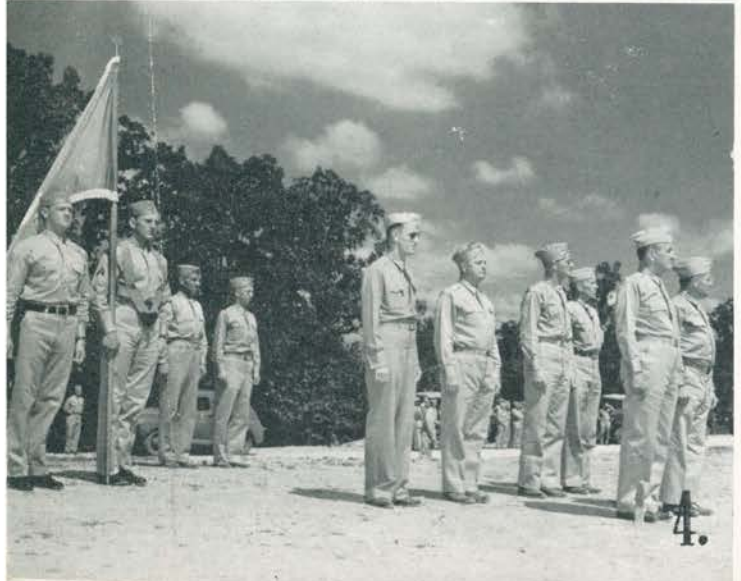
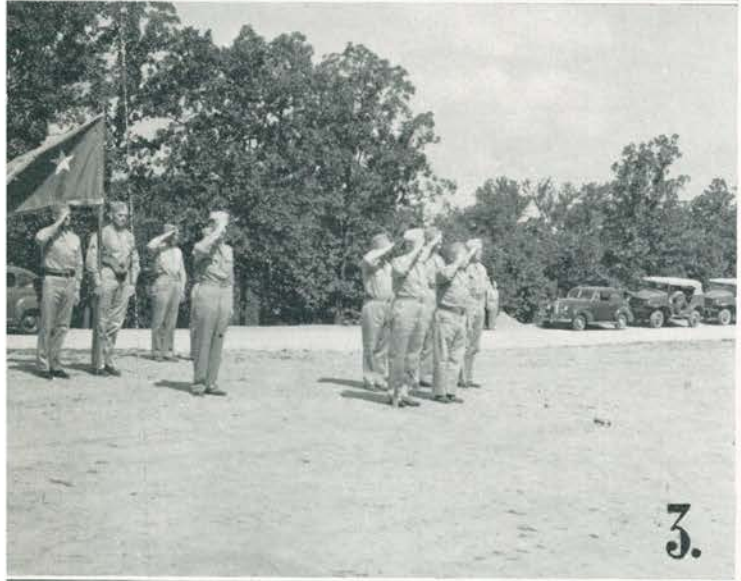
The Brigade was completed by the activation of the Brigade Headquarters Battery under the provisions of Special Order 249, the Adjutant General's Office, State of Michigan. This organization of 89 men, designed primarily to carry out the functions of Brigade administration and communications, is commanded by Captain Leslie B. Keeny.

HEADQUARTERS BUILDING, 72nd FIELD ARTILLERY BRIGADE

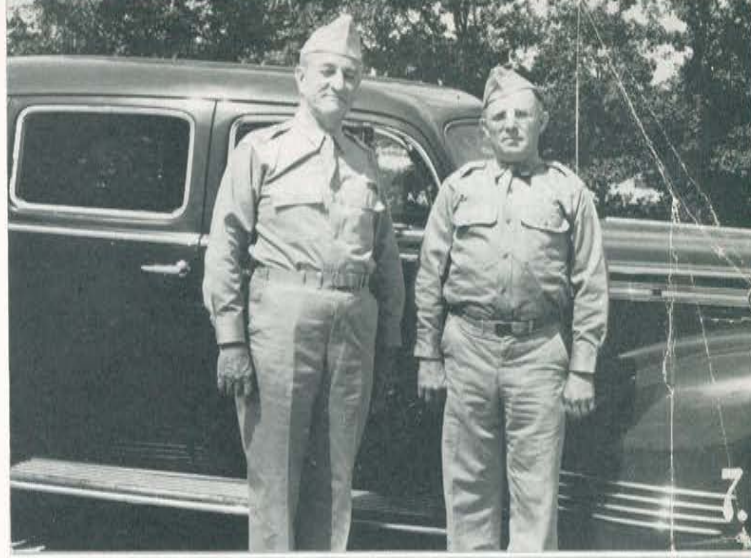

HISTORY OF THE 182nd FIELD ARTILLERY



Coat of Arms: Approved June 26, 1930.
Shield: Gules, seme of quatrefoils voided or a fess sable fimbriated of the second.
Crest: That for regiments of Michigan National Guard.
Wreath: Or and gules.
Motto: Might If Right.

Description: The background of the shield, seme of quatrefoils in gold on a field of red, is from the coat of arms of Count Pontchartrain, the Minister of Marine in France at the time Detroit was founded. The black fess across the center of the shield is from the coat of arms of Cadillac, the founder of Detroit, sent there by Count Pontchartrain. The field of red has been substituted for the field of blue of Pontchartrain's arms, symbolizing the arm of the service, Artillery, to which this regiment belongs.

The organization of the 182nd Field Artillery was started early in 1922 under the leadership and inspiration of Colonel Heinrich A. Pickert, who headed a group of men who had served either as officers or enlisted men during the World War. The majority of the group, like Colonel Pickert, had served with the 119th Field Artillery, although other Artillery regiments, such as the 329th, were well represented.

Armory quarters were secured in an old street car house at Woodward and Amsterdam Avenues, Detroit, Michigan, where a considerable amount of repairs, alterations and construction was found necessary to make the quarters habitable. At this armory, the first unit, Battery F, was mustered for Federal recognition on June 12, 1922, followed by the other units until the recognition of regimental headquarters was received as of December 6, 1922. The organization of the Second Battalion could not be accomplished for some seventeen years, through lack of War Department funds for maintenance.

Better quarters were secured in 1927, when the regiment moved to a building at the corner of Vermont and Kirby Streets. The increased amount of floor space made it possible for each unit to have more suitable quarters and resulted in improved efficiency.

In 1935, the regiment moved to a modern building at the corner of Brush and Piquette, but this building being sold early in 1936, the regiment again moved, this time to its present quarters in a block of former Studebaker factory buildings at 285 Piquette.

In 1926, the regiment set a record for other motorized units of its day to shoot at—a march of 230 miles to Camp Grayling, Michigan, without the loss of a single vehicle and without a casualty. The march required five days, averaging around 40 miles per day, which was not bad for tractors of wartime manufacture.

In 1935, the personnel of the regiment went to camp for the first time in modern motor vehicles, the tractors and howitzers being shipped by rail. In the year following, the entire regiment marched to the Allegan area to participate in the Second Army Maneuvers, this being the first long march in which all units traveled under their own power.

The year of 1935 also saw the promotion of Colonel Pickert to the command of the 63rd Infantry Brigade. The present regimental commander, Colonel George V. N. Lothrop, succeeded him.

In the spring of 1939, Lieutenant Colonel Miles N. Culehan organized the Second Battalion of the regiment, thus completing the organization started 17 years before.

In 1940, the regiment marched about 800 miles to Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, again to participate in Second Army Maneuvers, this time for a three-week's period. Six days were spent in travel to and from this area, and this march, like all others, was completed without serious accident or delay.

The majority of the officers of the regiment have come from the ranks of the regiment. Of the original group who attended the first field encampment in 1923, only a few remain. Several have transferred to other regiments of the Michigan National Guard, but the majority have retired to civilian life.

The regiment was inducted into federal service on April 7, 1941. After ten days spent in the Armory, going through physical examination, checking of records, and the multiplicity of detail attendant on entry into the service, the regiment left Detroit on April 17, 1941 for Fort Knox, Kentucky. The movement was accomplished by overland and rail serials.

A period of six weeks was spent at this station. Those who underwent this period can never forget it to their dying day, for, during this time we were "nobody's children," unasked for and unwanted. The unsatisfactory conditions, the tottering tentage, the miserable experimental field ration, so called, and above all the never ending dust are just a few of the irritations that beset us constantly. It was with a sigh of relief that we were finally ordered to proceed to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri.

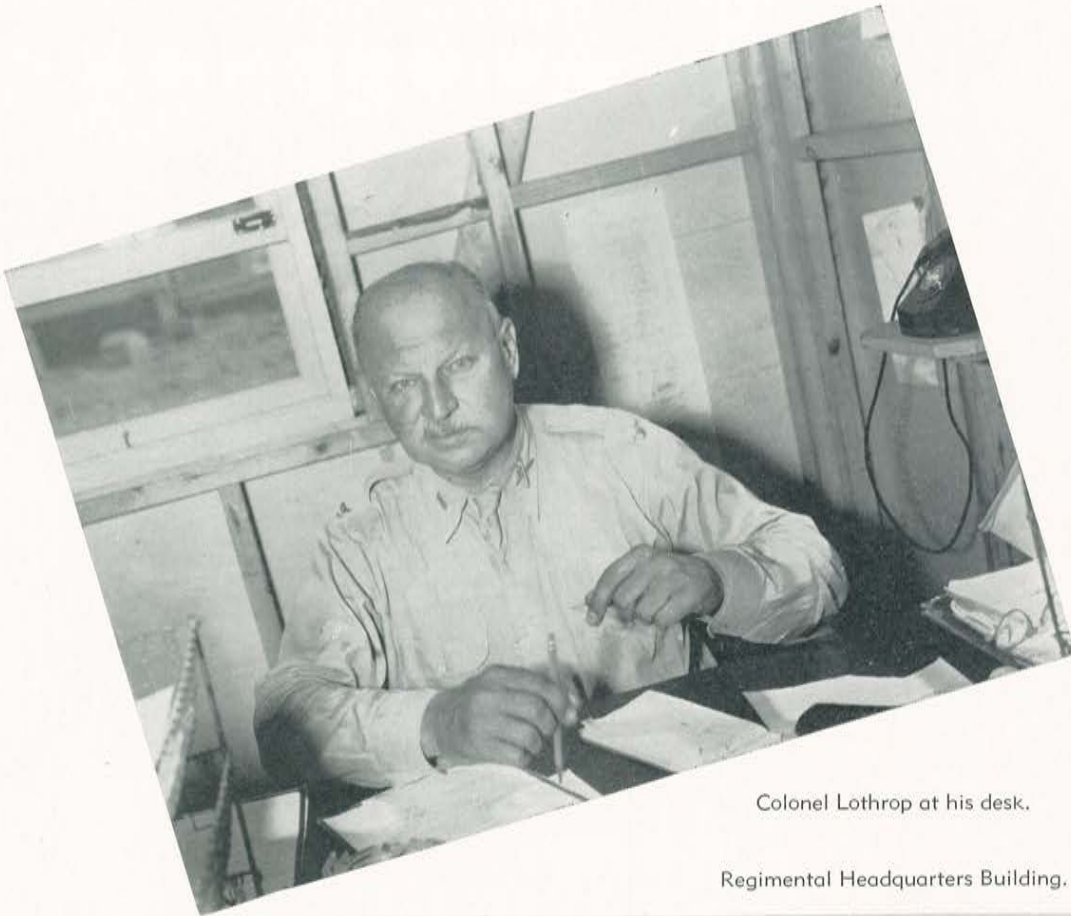
Regardless of the shortage of vehicular equipment and the poor state of repair, due to the inability to get repair parts at Fort Knox, the regiment moved on Sunday, June 1, 1941. The overland move was accomplished in two days, and we rolled into Fort Leonard Wood on the afternoon of June 2, 1941, our permanent station.

Although the regiment was not in existence during the World War and, consequently has no war record, the original roster of its officers shows all of them to have served during the War, with more than 90 per cent service overseas.

It has always been the aim of the entire personnel to attain and maintain the highest standard of duty and patriotism. The effect of this high standard must surely be felt in the efficiency, both tactical and technical, of the future operations of the 182nd Field Artillery.

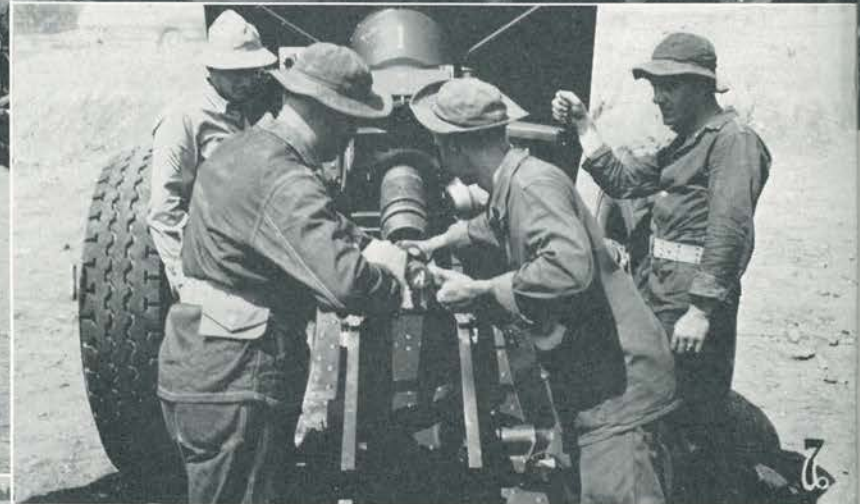

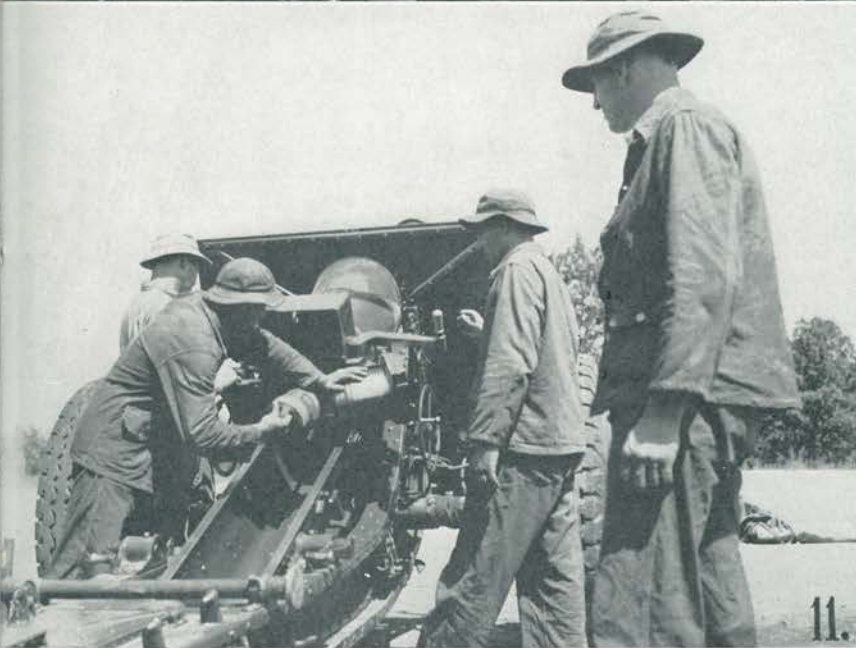

HISTORY OF THE 119th FIELD ARTILLERY



Coat of Arms: Approved April 18, 1925.

Shield: Gules, in sinister chief the badge of the First Corps of the Spanish War argent and in base issuant a demilion rampant or, on a canton of the last (or) a bend of the first (gules) charged with three alerions of the third (or).

Crest: That for regiments of Michigan National Guard. Wreath: Argent and gules.

Motto: Viam Praeparamus (We prepare the way).

Description: The baptism of fire of this regiment occurred in the Toul Sector; this is represented by the canton, the arms of Lorraine. The silver badge of Second Division, First Corps, of the Spanish War is displayed in sinister chief. History shows that for many years the district around what is now the city of El Paso, Texas, was known as Ponce de Leon's Ranch, having been settled and colonized by a group of the followers of that explorer, and who named their new home after their leader. The lion issuant is therefore taken from Ponce de Leon's crest to denote service on the Mexican border at El Paso, Texas.

The 119th Field Artillery was first organized as such during the World War period on September 22, 1917, when the following units of the Michigan National Guard were merged to form the regiment: First Battalion Field Artillery First Squadron Cavalry and Headquarters and Supply Companies of the 31st Infantry.

Although the 119th Field Artillery as a regiment dates only to 1917, some of its units trace their histories back to the 1870's, and they are credited with prior service as follows:

Company K, First Infantry, was organized June 16, 1877, and redesignated Company F, First Infantry, July 3, 1885. Company H, First Infantry, was organized March 17, 1876, and was redesignated Company E, First Infantry, July 3, 1885. The First Infantry entered Federal service for the Spanish-American War on April 26, 1898, and was redesignated the 31st Michigan Volunteers. After serving in Cuba from February 1 to April 13, 1899, it was mustered out at Savannah, Georgia, May 17, 1899, the units reverting to their former State status.

Company F, First Infantry, was redesignated Company B, First Independent Battalion, July 10, 1899, and again redesignated Fourth Section, First Battery, May 20, 1905. The First Battery was redesignated Battery A, First Field Artillery, May 18, 1911. Company E, First Infantry, was redesignated Company E, Second Infantry, July 19, 1899, and then redesignated Battery B, First Field Artillery, on November 6, 1911.

Both Batteries A and B, First Field Artillery, entered Federal service for Mexican border duty on June 19, 1916, and were stationed at El Paso, Texas. They were mustered out on March 23, 1917.

Besides the Field Artillery units, two Cavalry troops and two Infantry companies, which later became part of the 119th Field Artillery, served on the Mexican border. Troop A, First Cavalry, which had been organized June 1, 1905, and Troop B, First Cavalry, which had been organized January 30, 1908, entered Federal service for Mexican border duty on June 19, 1916. They were stationed at El Paso, Texas, and were mustered out March 28, 1917. Headquarters and Supply Companies, 31st Michigan Infantry, which were organized January 21, 1915, also entered Federal service for Mexican border duty on June 19, 1916. They were also stationed at El Paso, Texas, and mustered out January 20, 1917.

During the period between the Mexican border disturbance and the World War, several other predecessor units of the 119th Field Artillery were organized. Battery C was organized May 28, 1917, while Troops C and D were organized and combined with Troops A and B to form the First Cavalry Squadron on June 26, 1917.

All these units entered Federal service for the World War on July 15, 1917, and on September 22, 1917, as stated above, the First Battalion Field Artillery, First Squadron Cavalry and Headquarters and Supply Companies, 31st Infantry, were combined to form the 119th Field Artillery, which was assigned to the 32nd Division and served with that division in France. The regiment was mustered out May 16, 1919.

From June to November, 1918, the regiment was in the fight. In their five months of continuous fighting, the regiment smashed the way for 11 Infantry divisions in combat in recovering a total of 70 kilometers of French territory. On board ship on the trip back to the United States, Colonel Chester B. McCormick, regimental commander, wrote the officers and enlisted men of his regiment, giving the activity of the organization in France, and in one sentence he summed up the spirit of the men under his command when he said:

"The missions entrusted to you have been ably performed with a spirit of cheerfulness and steadfast self-sacrifice and devotion to duty, serving under conditions of extreme hardship and danger, you have acquitted yourselves in a highly gratifying and satisfactory manner."

Because of its gallant participation in the engagements named, the regiment is authorized the following World War streamers: Aisne-Marne, Oise-Aisne, Meuse-Argonne, Lorraine, Alsace and Champagne. The regiment also received the following foreign decoration: French Croix de Guerre with silver star.

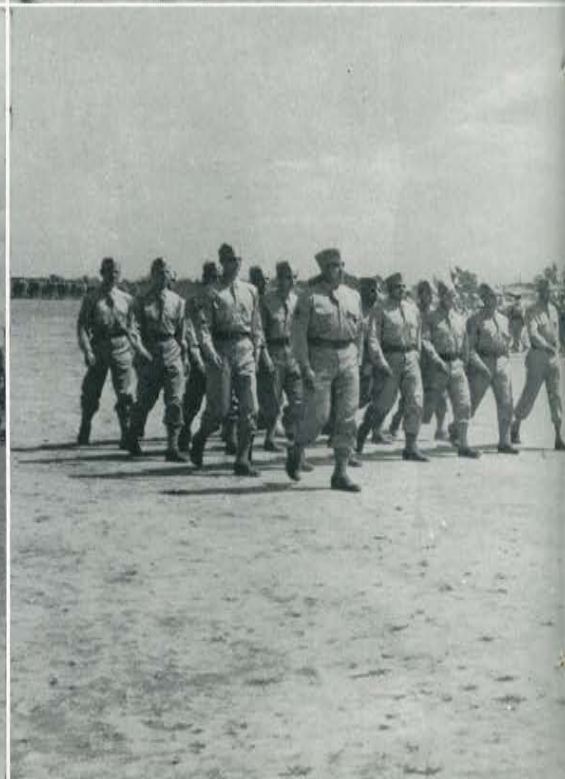
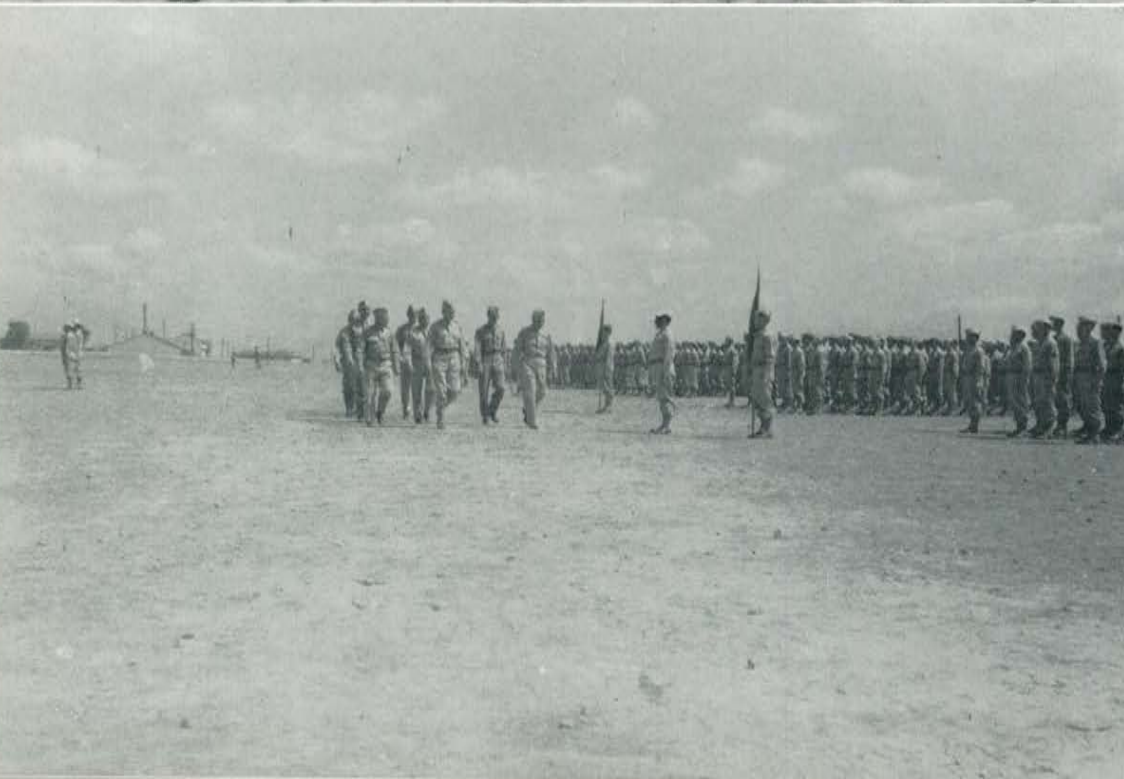
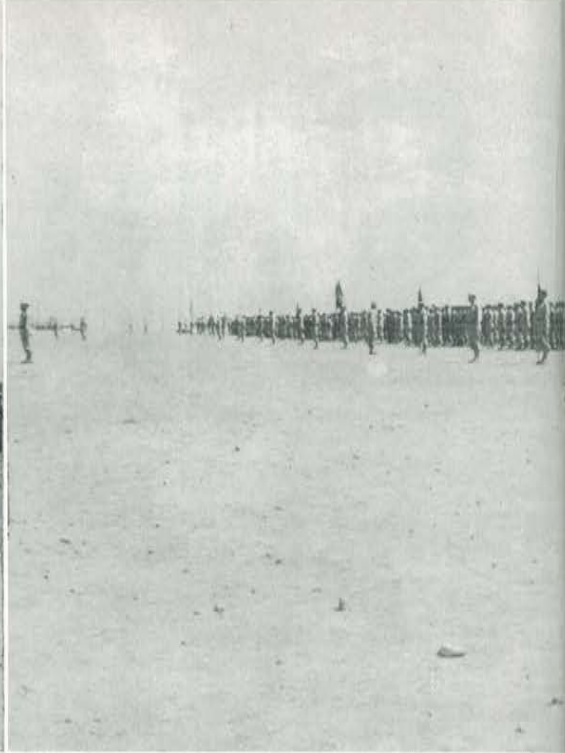
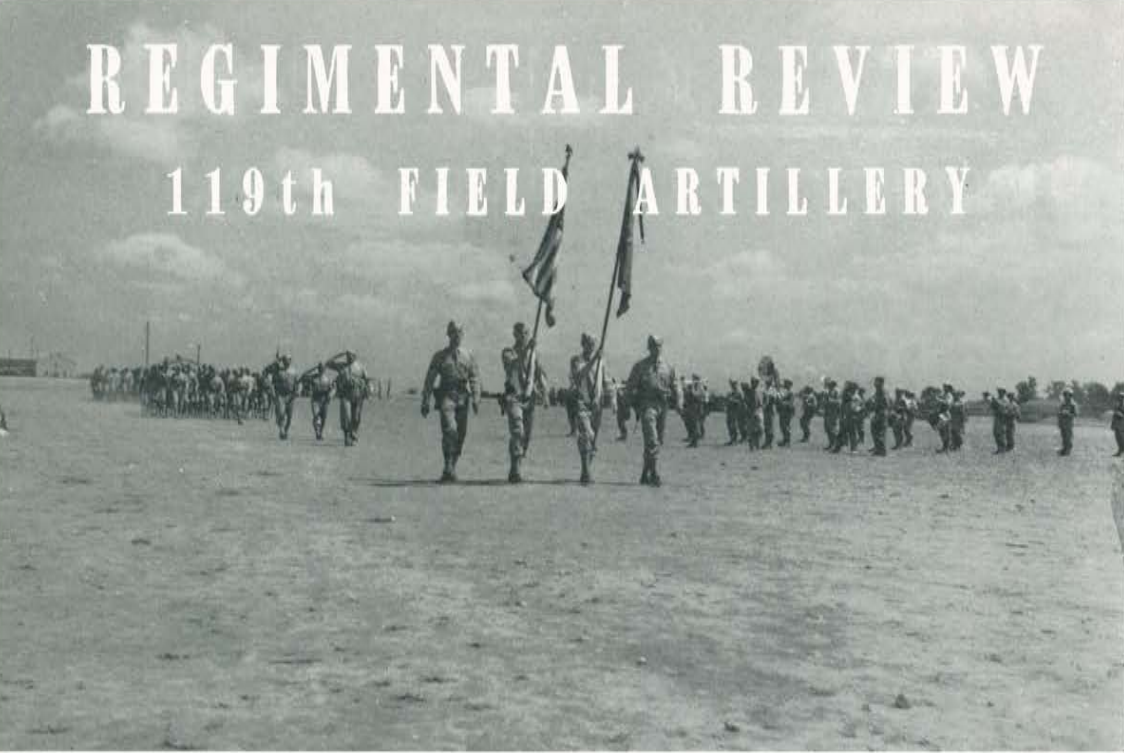
With such a proud record, the designation—119th Field Artillery—could not be allowed to pass into history but had to be carried on, so on July 22, 1921, the First Battalion, 119th Field Artillery, was reorganized. Expanded into a regiment, it was redesignated the 119th Field Artillery (AD) on February 10, 1922, and redesignated the 119th Field Artillery (truck-drawn) on July 1, 1933.

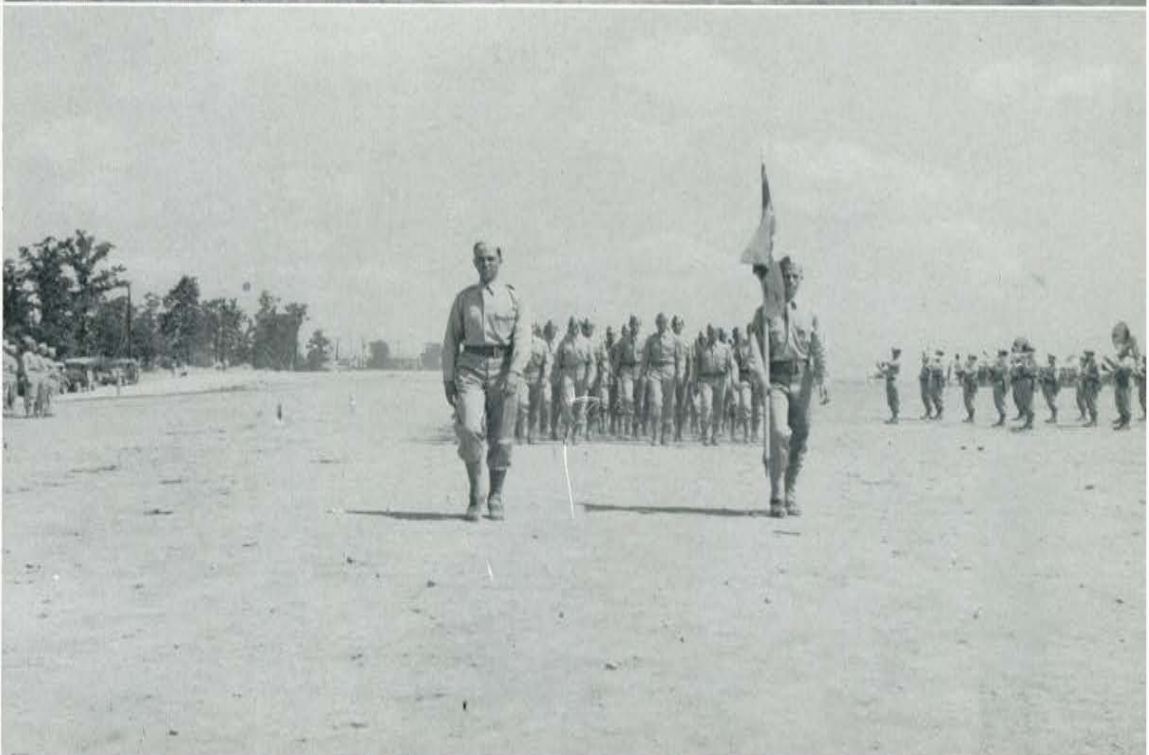
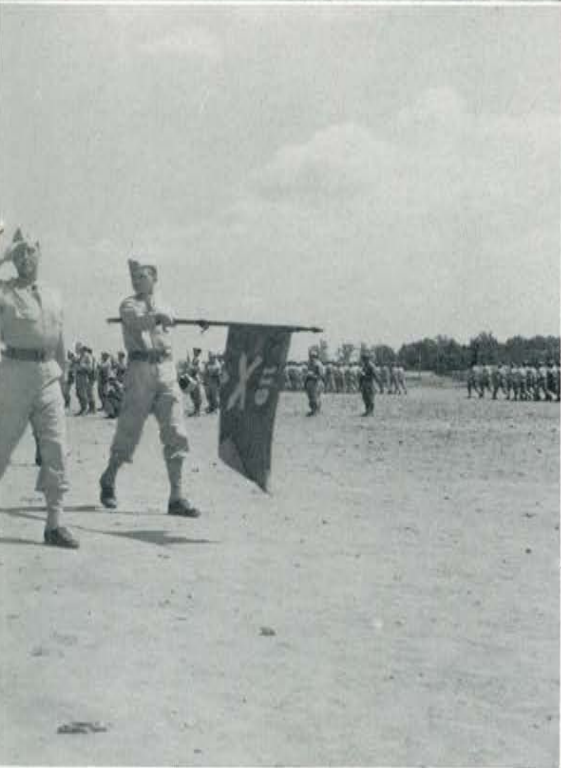
Until September 18, 1940, the regiment was equipped with 75 millimeter guns, but on that date it was reorganized as a 155 millimeter gun regiment. In this reorganization, the regiment was also changed from a two-battalion to a three-battalion regiment and Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, Third Battalion, had to be organized. It was

HISTORY OF THE 177th FIELD ARTILLERY

The 177th Field Artillery was authorized on September 18, 1940 and organized effective September 20, 1940 by converting all the Michigan units of the 107th Quartermaster Regiment and the First Squadron, 106th Cavalry, as indicated below:

Colonel Russell G. Simpson, Commanding Officer of the 107th Quartermaster Regiment, was assigned to the command of the 177th Field Artillery and was given the task of organizing four additional units at Detroit to complete the authorized strength of the Regiment. These units were:

Headquarters Battery, 177th Field Artillery Headquarters Battery 3rd Bn., 177th Field Artillery
Headquarters Battery 2nd Bn., 177th Field Artillery Medical Detachment, 177th Field Artillery

The Regiment was assigned as a part of the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade.

On February 6, 1941 orders were received to reorganize the Regiment as a two battalion Truck Drawn (155 mm Howitzer) Field Artillery Regiment to conform with the new streamlining plans of the War Department. This was accomplished by redesignating three units and a portion of a fourth unit and organizing three new units as follows:

On April 7, 1941 the Regiment was inducted into active Federal Service by Executive order of the President of the United States. The first eleven days of active service were spent at the home stations of the respective units. On April 18, 1941 the entire Regiment moved by motor convoy and rail to Fort Knox, Kentucky where a program of intensive training was begun.

On June 1, 1941 the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade including this Regiment moved by motor convoy and rail to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, arriving there on June 2, 1941. Training was continued at Fort Wood and 622 selective service men were assigned to the Regiment from June 15 to June 21, 1941, increasing the personnel to approximate authorized strength.

On July 12, 1941 the Anti-Tank Batteries of the Regiment, together with the Anti-Tank Platoons from each Battalion Headquarters Battery were detailed on Special Duty to form a portion of the 72nd Field Artillery Anti-Tank Battalion (Provisional).

The Regiment began service practice at Fort Leonard Wood on July 18, 1941, the first shot being fired by Captain Burns of Battery A and the first volley by Captain Larkey of Battery E.

Although some units of the Regiment are new and others trace their history back to 1898 and through the World War, all are bending their efforts towards creating an outstanding Field Artillery Regiment by cheerfully tackling any job assigned to them.

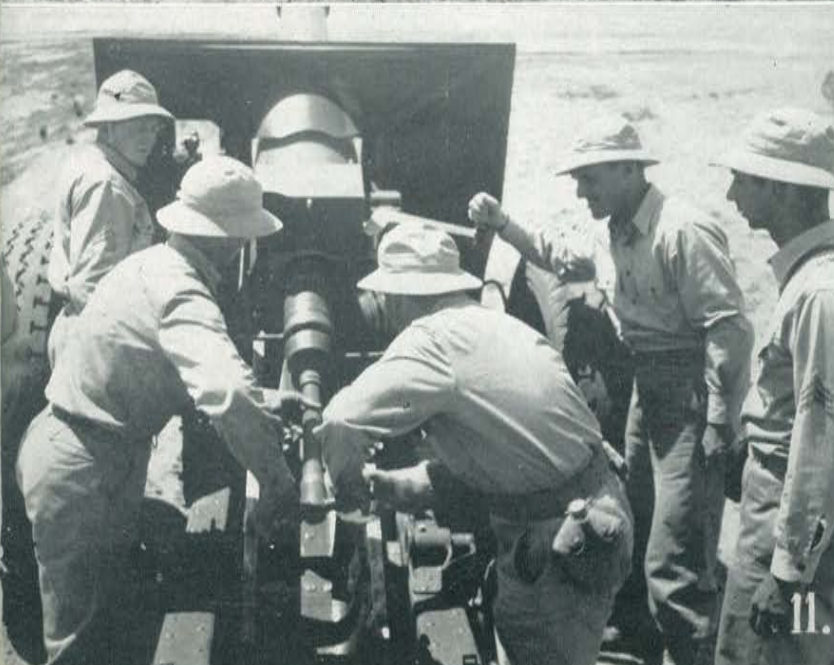

George B. Ely, Lt. Col. F. A., was born at Olivet, Michigan, January 11, 1889, and graduated from Purdue University as B.S.E.E. in 1914. He enlisted in 1918 and attended the Third Officers Training Camp at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio. Being appointed 2nd Lt. F. A. July 12, 1918, he served with Battery A, 146th F.A. in France throughout the World War I, returning to the United States and being discharged as a 1st Lieutenant July 11, 1919. He organized and commanded Battery F, 119th F.A., Charlotte, Michigan, which was federally recognized October 5, 1921. He was promoted from Captain to Major July 3, 1929, and was assigned to command the 2nd Battalion, 119th F.A., and later commanded the 1st Battalion of the same regiment. He was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel on August 2, 1940. After returning from summer maneuvers at Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, he was assigned to the 72nd F.A. Brigade as Brigade Executive, serving until the formation of the 72nd F.A. Brigade Antitank Battalion in July, 1941, at which time he was assigned to command this new organization.

He attended and graduated from the Field Artillery Officers School, Saumur, France, in 1918, the Battery Officers Course at Fort Sill in 1922, the Advance Course in 1930, and the Special Course at the Command and General School at Fort Leavenworth in 1934.

HISTORY OF THE 72nd FIELD ARTILLERY BRIGADE

ANTITANK BATTALION (PROV.)

On the 24th of June, 1941 the War Department directed by letter that the 72nd F. A. Brig. form a provisional antitank battalion, composed of the antitank elements then existing within the brigade. Accordingly on July 12, 1941 the 72nd F. A. Brig. issued General Order No. 4, directing that the 72nd F. A. Antitank Bn. (Prov.) be formed and commanded by Lt. Col. George G. Ely. The battalion was formed at once and consisted of the following composition:

Bn. Hqrs. and Hqrs. Battery
Batteries A, B, C and D

The Bn. Hqrs. Battery was composed of 29 enlisted men from each of the following organizations: Hqrs. Btry. 1st Bn, 182nd F. A.; Hqrs. Btry. 2nd Bn., 182nd F. A.; Hqrs. Btry. 1st Bn., 177th F. A.; Hqrs. Btry. 2nd Bn., 177th F. A.; and Regimental Hqrs. Btry., 119th F. A. These men were from the anti-aircraft and antitank platoons of these batteries and were reconnaissance, communication and pioneer personnel. The 1st and 2nd Antitank Batteries of the 177th F. A. were transferred from that regiment as "A" Btry. and "B" Btry., which the 1st and 2nd Antitank Batteries of the 182nd F. A. were transferred as "C" Btry. and "D" Btry.

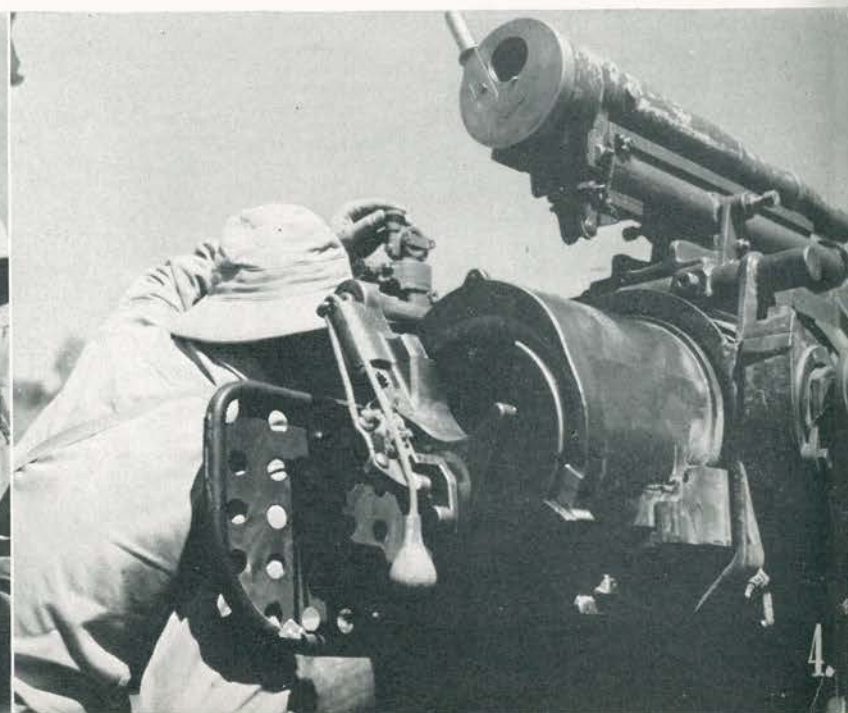
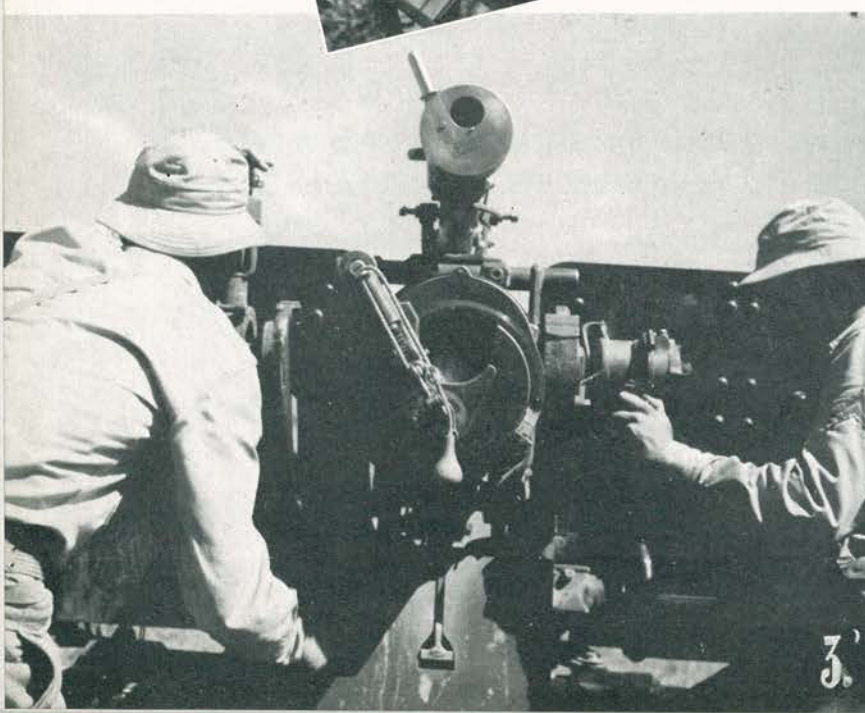
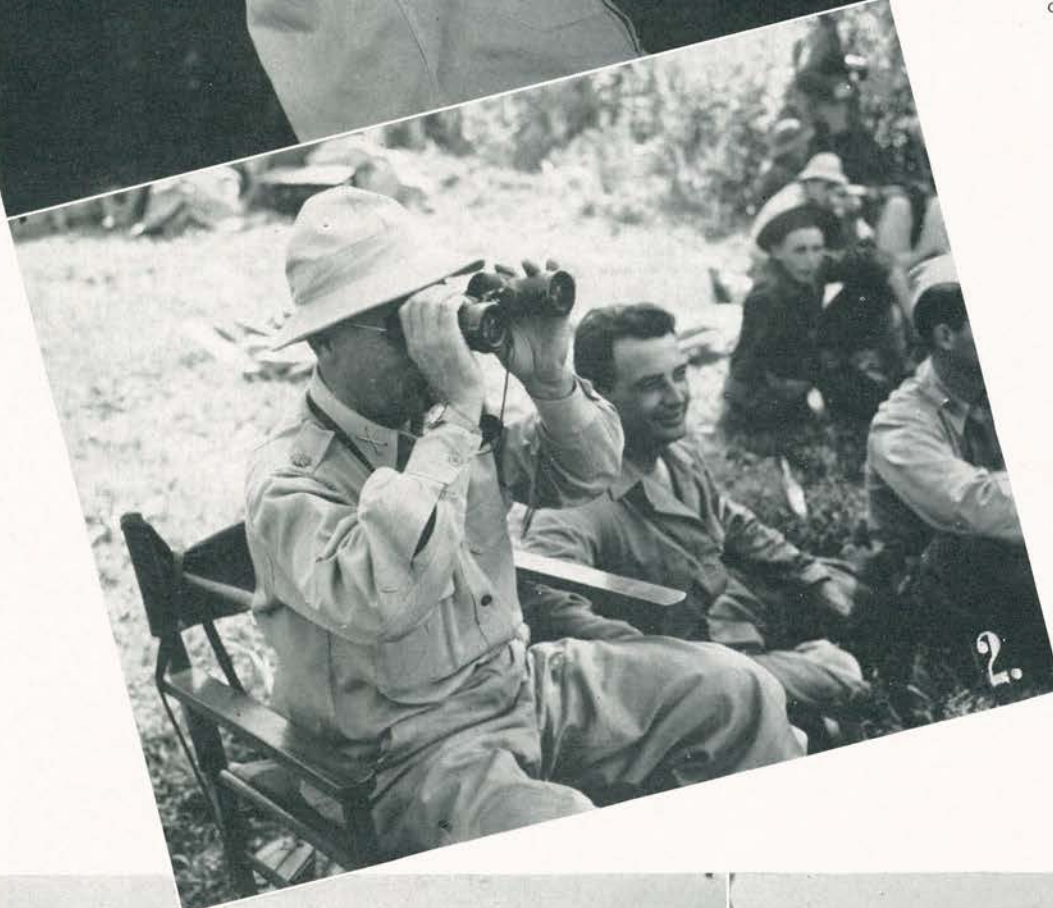
At the time of formation the Battalion was composed of 545 men and 30 officers—145 men in Bn. Hqrs. Btry. and four gun batteries of 100 men each. The officer personnel was drawn from the entire 72nd F. A. Brigade to officer and staff the Battalion.

The Battalion tackled at once the problem of welding a compact and workable organization from these units in preparation for its participation in the 1941 fall maneuvers of the Second Army.

Lieutenant Colonel Matthys was born at Lima, Ohio, June 7, 1891, and spent his early life in Van Wert, Ohio, where he was graduated from the public schools. He later went to Cleveland, where he resided until he moved to Detroit, Michigan, in 1915. With the exception of the period of the First World War he has since remained in Detroit, where he has been associated with the Federal Motor Truck Company as a sales executive.

He enlisted in the Ohio National Guard June 15, 1909, and served in the various grades from private to 1st Sergeant in Battery A, 1st Battalion, Ohio Field Artillery.

Colonel Matthys served with that organization on the Mexican border at El Paso, Texas, during 1916-17, being commissioned 2nd Lieutenant September 1, 1916. The organization was in continuous Federal service from the border assignment until after the World War.

Being made a Captain of the Field Artillery, July 11, 1917, he organized and commanded Battery F, 134th Field Artillery, serving with that organization and the 37th Division in France and Belgium, and was discharged May 3, 1919.

He accepted a commission as Captain, Field Artillery Reserve, June 20, 1919, and was promoted to Major November 2, 1922. He was commissioned a Captain in the 182nd Field Artillery, Michigan National Guard, December 6, 1922, and served as a battery commander and Battalion Executive until November 16, 1926, continuing his reserve status from that time on.

He was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, Field Artillery Reserve, April 26, 1929, and assigned to command the 328th Field Artillery, later being promoted to Colonel, Field Artillery Reserve, April 29, 1938.

Colonel Matthys resigned his reserve commission and was commissioned Lieutenant Colonel, Field Artillery, Michigan National Guard, October 2, 1940, being assigned as Executive Officer of the 177th Field Artillery and later being detailed as Executive Officer, 72nd Field Artillery Brigade, July 12, 1941.

He was graduated from the Command and General Staff School, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, 1939, and the Advanced Course Field Artillery School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1941.

also reassigned from the 57th Field Artillery Brigade, 32nd Division, to the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade, Corps Artillery.

On February 22, 1941, the 119th Field Artillery was again reorganized into a two-battalion regiment, and 1st Battalion and 2nd Battalion Service Batteries organized. At this time the 119th Field Artillery Band was reorganized.

On April 7, 1941, the 119th Field Artillery was inducted into the Federal Service, remaining at their home stations until April 17, 1941, at which time the regiment moved to Fort Knox, Kentucky, and enjoyed training at this post until May 31, 1941, at which time movement was made to permanent station, Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, arriving June 1, 1941.

Tracing the military heritage of their organization back over more than half a century, the present members of the 119th Field Artillery, under the command of Colonel Glenn W. Carey, are ready to fulfill any duty for their country.
