The Bangor Symphony Orchestra, 1896 - 1968

The concert of the Bangor Symphony Orchestra to be played in the Bangor Municipal Auditorium on May 22 will conclude the 72nd season of the third oldest community orchestra in the United States. The first concert was given in City Hall on November 2, 1896. The orchestra had been organized through the efforts of Abbie N. Garland, a pianist and teacher, and Horace Mann Pullen, the leader of a professional "business", orchestra. The players were paid. The leading number of the first program was Schubert's *Unfinished Symphony*.

From 1896 until the end of the season of 1904-05 the series went by the name of Pullen Symphony Concerts. Pullen was the conductor from the first through the 6th seasons, Melville H. Andrews, music store proprietor, from the 7th through the 9th, and Pullen, again, from the 10th through the 24th (1919-20), when he resigned.

In the 11th season (1906-07), after a year of suspension (yet with rehearsals) caused by financial difficulties, the orchestra was reorganized, took the name Bangor Symphony Orchestra, and renewed playing. With fifty and more musicians, who were unpaid, it progressed from little symphony strength to full symphony strength.

With the opening of the 25th season (1920-21) Adelbert Wells Sprague became the director. He continued through the 56th season (1951-52), when he resigned. Popularly known as the composer, during his college days, of the *Maine Stein Song*, he was through most of his Symphony conductorship, the head of the music department of the University and conductor of the Bangor Band. He was succeeded, at the opening of the 57th season, by A. Stanley Cayting, then and now a violinist and director of the Northern Conservatory of Music, who remained in office through the 68th season. Upon Cayting's resignation, Peter Re, the present leader, an assistant professor of music at Colby College and a composer, became director and conductor with the opening of the 69th season (1964-65).

During the years the orchestra has played principally in Society Hall, City Hall, and Peakes Auditorium. Some concerts were given at the old Bangor Auditorium, the Memorial Gymnasium at the University, and the old Bangor High School. The orchestra has played variously with the Bangor Festival Chorus, the Eastern Maine Music Festival, the choir of Bangor Theological Seminary, and the orchestra of the University. Many distinguished musicians have been its guest artists. Among "alumni" to have become nationally known in music are Paul White and Rudolph Ringwall. It has given young people's concerts, pop concerts, concerts in connection with the Convocation Week of Bangor Theological Seminary, and concerts for conventions of the Maine Teachers' Association.

In 1929 the successful completion of a community-wide fund raising effort permitted the orchestra to acquire a fine old mansion on Union Street, built in 1833-36, to provide a home and focus for the musical activities of the city. Here the Northern Conservatory, a separately managed, state approved institution granting the Bachelor of Music degree, was opened in the same year. In the buildings are now located, beside the Conservatory, the Symphony office, the Music Branch of the Bangor Public Library, and the rehearsal room of the Bangor Band.

On its 20th anniversary the Orchestra adopted as its signature the motif of Mendelssohn's *Fingals Cave Overture* (op. 26), a composition that it had first played in 1909. This, as seen below, was affixed to every program during all the seasons from the 21st through the 60th.

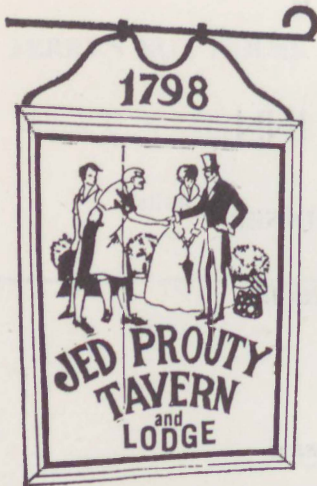

State wide "dinners with the Symphonies" were held in conjunction with the Portland Symphony Orchestra and resulted in obtaining financial contributions to the Bangor Symphony Orchestra exceeding \$1,000.00 in each year. The Symphony Women have in addition, sold season tickets, provided concert ushers, and extended hospitality for visiting guest artists.

The Symphony Women believe that the cultural contribution made by the Orchestra to the people of Eastern Maine is inestimable and it is their desire to promote interest and support to insure that future generations may continue to enjoy these excellent programs.

It is a pleasure and honor for the Symphony Women to sponsor tonight's performance of "Finian's Rainbow." The kind generosity of the many advertisers combined with the support of the audience should make possible a major step forward in the ever brightening future of the Bangor Symphony Orchestra.

SYMPHONY HOUSE

166 Union Street, Bangor

Symphony House was designed for Isaac Farrar, a pioneer Maine lumberman, by Richard Upjohn, famous architect of Trinity Church in New York City. It was built in the years 1833-36. In 1865 it was bought by Captain Charles B. Sanford, operator of the Sanford Line of steamships which was operated between Bangor and Boston.

Between the years 1871 and 1892, while owned by the Bangor Savings Bank, Symphony House was occupied by Gene Sawyer, later famous as the author of the Nick Carter stories, and by Owen Davis, eminent playwright.

In 1893-95 the building was substantially remodelled by Isaac H. Merrill, banker; and from 1911 until 1919, under the name of Stewart Hall, it was the seat of the College of Law of the University of Maine. It was acquired in 1929 by the Bangor Symphony Orchestra, given the name of Symphony House, and opened as the quarters of the Northern Conservatory of Music.
