Middletown, Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> 1823

Wt. Rev & very Dear Sir  
I did not ~~arrive until~~ <sup>you</sup> come to board  
until two late yesterday (though I  
sent to the office at the hour of open-  
ing it) ~~until two late~~ <sup>from</sup>  
~~yesterday~~ to take the stage & I suppose from  
your letter & from the papers that you  
embark to day. otherwise I should have  
been in New York this evening. So it  
has happened my anxiety to see you  
without fail, probably will prevent  
the pleasure I had anticipated. Will  
If I can ascertain that you do not  
sail to day I shall be in New York  
on Friday Evening.

I am glad to see that you are  
unmoved & determined to pursue  
notwithstanding the measures taken to  
discourage & discountenance the under-  
taking. May the Great head of the Church  
bless & prosper you —



If I should not see you do remem-  
ber <sup>me</sup> in the kind to write you are going,  
& write to me often & particularly let  
me know all that has befallen you,  
the circumstances of your voyage, the  
receptions & success of your mission.  
I have many very many things  
to say to you, but advise, your own  
good judgement will point out  
your course & I trust heaven will  
assist & assist you.

~~Should~~ Though Br W. has been  
hastened off in consequence of your  
contemplated visit to England & so  
far in opposition, I hope your objects  
will not interfere, yet there is one point  
which has been mentioned that I may  
be allowed to say a word or two upon. A  
~~union~~ & scheme in success may have been  
proposed. By this you would have little  
to gain, be much. I entertain no doubt  
of your success. of his much doubt for  
with us the success of our college is

doubtful, though no one is more  
deeply interested than I am in its  
success -

tion & blessing of him, to whom you  
have so solemnly committed your  
self & your interests.
