We are about to begin excavating (it's almost 9:30am), & we have Spent the last two hours setting up posts for structure #104. This will be our first day of work, & I will begin on the north side of N/strench, which has 178° orientation & a width of I meter leigh \*Anne will be excavating the other end of this trench moving S/N, and we will meet in the middle after each excavating. There excavation units. Brad will be concentrating on the E/W axis (88° crientation), subop. O. I'm C & leigh Anne is Subop. D. Even though this is a little out of order, I should also mention it's sunny now though it was overcast this morning & I'm feeling Kind of fired.

0-10cm B6s 50-C/001: Unit I is the N. most unit. I will measure my depth using my SE post (because it should be highest). The soil is full of limestone w/ a down black clay-seems very dry of Crumbly. We encantered no timble or cultural features. If few shorts, lithics, of bajareque pieces were found. I will now continue on to the next lot (10-20 cm 65)

SO-C/002: This lot was excavated 10-20 cm BGS se corner The soil appears to be the same, & when we began most EU #1, N excavating an 5-2-02; n this brit, we had only found a couple of large pieces of bajareque + a few pieces of pottery.

It's 10 minutes to 8, and we got off to a slow start because Brad needed some help extending his trench. It's already much sunnier than yesterday and will probably be warmer today as well I am continuing excavations on the northern most excavation unit of structure # 104, lot 2. I am working with Manuel de Jesus Aguilau & Luis Aguilar Amaya again today. Both seem to really enjoy the work, & I know I'm definetely teeling better.

After 2 lithics & 34 shods, I think we're ready to move on to the next lot. Thuris one large rock sticking out of the SE corner; still waiting to see what it will be. The workers told me that floors & walls are normally found below 40 cm, but Brad exchally found a lot of flat rocks Closer to the surface (less than 20 cm) that Covid be part of a larger structure.


