Fragment of a hollow, middle prade figure. Here is a five core which extends to within action the fragmence walls and is down diameter. There is no five cloud or burning. Handness 1.7. The experior surface is quite smooth and shows exidence of burnshing, especially on the surfaces of the raised areas and on the flat area between them. The indexion surface is shightly rougher, but still quite compact. The design is composed of a raised, rounded strip 2cm long and it in wide which runs dragoroully across the fragment and extend 2 cm from the surface of the Short. There is another raised strip which runs vertically along the fragment which is 3 cm tong, 46 cm unde, and extends pass than it am from the body of the fragment. The back of the fragments is quite that. There are two grooms which separate the raised areas From the flat surface.
