

## OKLAHOMAN IS NEW DEAN

Dr. Schiller Scroggs, who served as dean of the College of Arts and Scien-ces of Oklahoma State University since 1935, has been named Dean of the College at Rollins. He received his A.B. from Southeastern State College in Oklahoma, his M.A. from Columbia and his Ph.D. from Yale. A public school teacher, principal and superintendent he was Professor of Education at Southeastern State College and Director of Administrative Research at Oklahoma State University. ceeds Dean Sidney J. French.

Arthur Edwin Dean, Assistant Professor of Mathematics, has had eighteen years of service in the Navy. He attended the University of Mississippi and received his B.S. from the U.S. Navy Postgraduate School at Monterey, Calif. He earned the M.A. in Mathematics at the University of North Carolina. He has taught as part-time in-structor at Mississippi and North Ca-

Dudley E. DeGroot, Assistant Professor of Sociology, attended Stanford for two years and received his A.B. from the University of West Virginia in 1950, the M.A. from the University of New Mexico in 1953 and the Ph.D. from Ohio State in 1957. He has taught at Emory since 1953.

of 220 freshmen and 50 transfer students for the beginning of its 73rd academic year. These new students came from 31 states and 11 foreign countries.

The most impressive feature of the college opening, outside of an excellent freshmen class, was the number of new, remodeled and renovated buildings on the campus.

Two newly completed buildings are being used for the first time this fall, a 136 unit women's dormitory and a dining hall. Last year a new men's dormitory, the Rex Beach Hall, was added to the campus.

Lyman Hall has been moved to make room for the new dining hall and has been completely remodeled to provide better classrooms plus offices for professors. Redecorating in the lobbies of Cloverleaf and Chase Hall has added comfort and charm to these housing uits. The old "beanery" has been redecorated and assigned to the art department. The Ollie street studio with some necessary alterations is the new home of the Community Courses.

President McKean and his wife have been the busiest people on the campus this summer for the tasteful redecorating, and refurbishing of the old buildings and the colorful decorating of the new buildings are products of their hard work.

The student dispensary has been moved to a building nearer the campus as a convenience to the students. A long awaited sand beach on Lake Virginia was pumped in this summer for student recreation and waterfront activities. This new beach along with the new dining hall have been long and loudly praised by the students both new and old.

Rollins will continue emphasis on the Conference Plan which makes the student more responsible for his learning by minimizing lectures and placing emphasis on student research and active class discussions under the guidance of a fully qualified professor.
