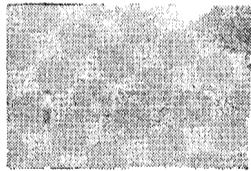

DEAR READER,

As the year comes to a close, we take the time to reflect on everything which has occurred in our lives during this school season. We remember the tests, the teachers, the projects, the parties. We remember other classmates and the fun, or the fights, we've had. We remember the missed balls in tennis, the home runs in softball, and the scratched balls in pool.

It is a time when we ask ourselves whether we have done all that we've done to the best of our ability; whether we have made the proper contributions to our school, our friends, and our lives.

Recently, an "alternative newspaper" to the Bear Facts was released in our school. It is apparent from the articles in this publication that the collaborators of this "alternative newspaper" are less than even semi-satisfied with the college here. They seem to feel the instructors are so worthless they should be demonstrated against; practically the only worthwhile course ("History of Women") is due to be cancelled because of lack of interest (or could it really be because it was put in a time slot opposite several required courses in Biology, English, Drama, Literature, Math, Physical Sciences, Psychology, and the Secretarial Studies?); the quarter system needs abolishing for financial and learning reasons (to remove the "fact factory" status from this school); and, alas, the Bear Facts has been deficient in reporting those things important to the lives of our student body. Since it appears that most of the problems being experienced by this school must ultimately be solved by the administration, it is only reasonable to assume that the "official" school newspaper bring these injustices to the attention of the people in charge.

It is unfortunate that those people who are so angry with this school had to wait until the end of the year to come out of hiding. If they would have even attempted to consult with the staff of the Facts, more people could have been reached and better results expected. As it is, there won't be another paper printed until September, and most of what has happened this year will be considered ancient history.

It is the sincere hope of the editors that those of us in the student body, whether we are on the staff or not, will remember that the Bear Facts is OUR paper, and that we as students have a release for the anger, or joy, we feel toward all the things which happen here. So, please, remember the paper in the fall, and contribute generously. That's the only way it can truly be the voice of the students...

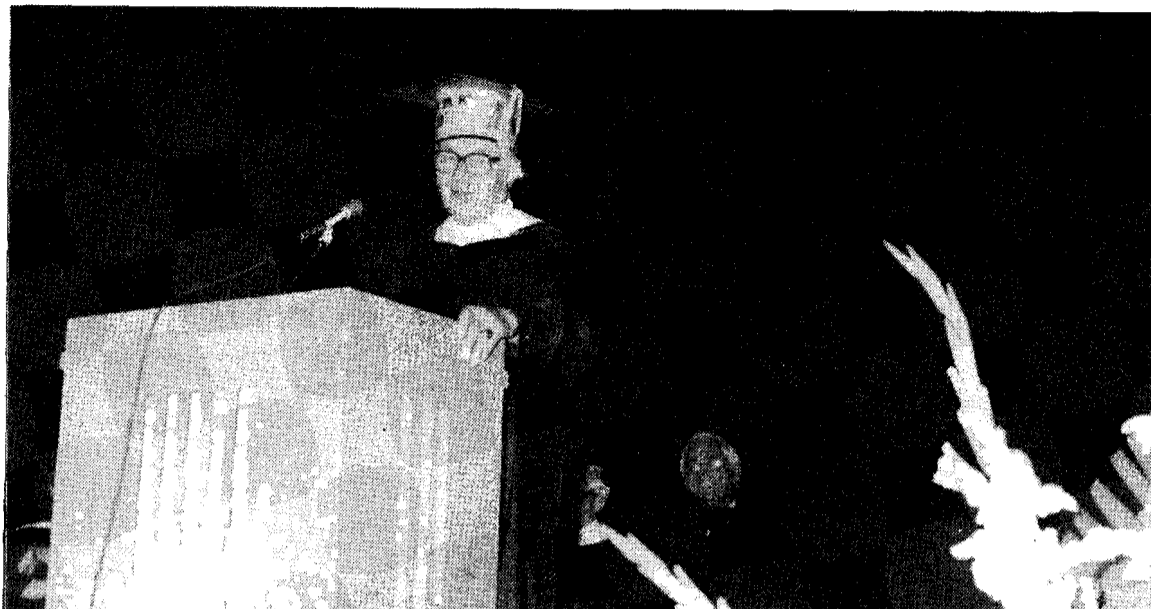

She was a member of the National Council for Social Studies and was a long-time member of the Iowa Council for Social Studies; she edited the Council's professional journal for several years and is currently active in Delta Kappa Gamma, serving as the state chairperson at the Professional Affairs Committee. She is a former board member and secretary-treasurer of the Iowa Association of Community Colleges and Vocational-Technical Institutes.

Mrs. Hartley retired from teaching at the Boone Campus at the end of the Summer session in 1973. She and her husband have since enjoyed travel extensively.

Other members of the planning party will include Father Thomas Nash, pastor of Sacred Heart Church, giving the invocation; Paul Lowery, President of the Des Moines Area Community College, introducing the speaker; Clair Abbott, Chairman of the Boone Campus Scholarship Committee, presenting the Grace Blosson Scholarship Award, the J.M. Pritchard Memorial Award, the E. Sherrill Brown Award and the J.R. Thornber Social Science Award; Byron Hamilton, Dean of the Boone Campus, presenting the graduates; Ray Clark, board member of the Des Moines Area Community College, presenting the degrees and diplomas and Larry Applebee, student at the Boone Campus, calling the roll of the graduates.

The 1979 Commencement will be held in the Boone Campus Auditorium; the public is invited to attend.
