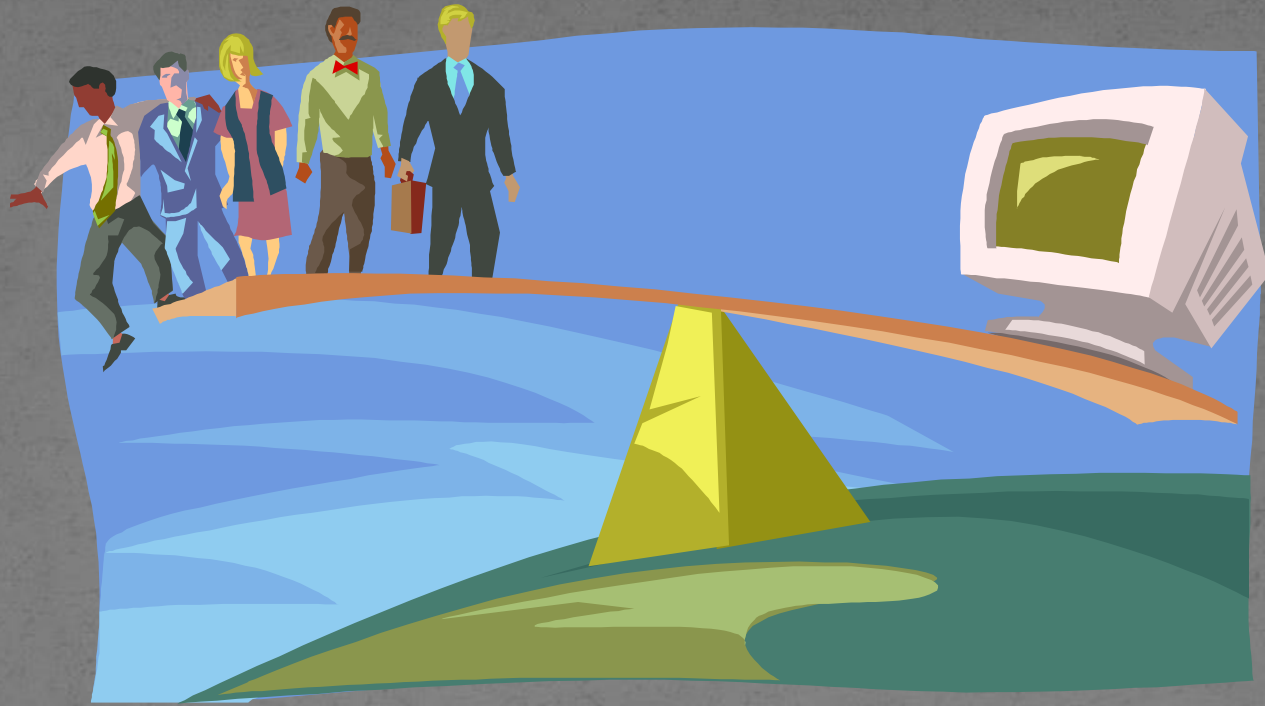

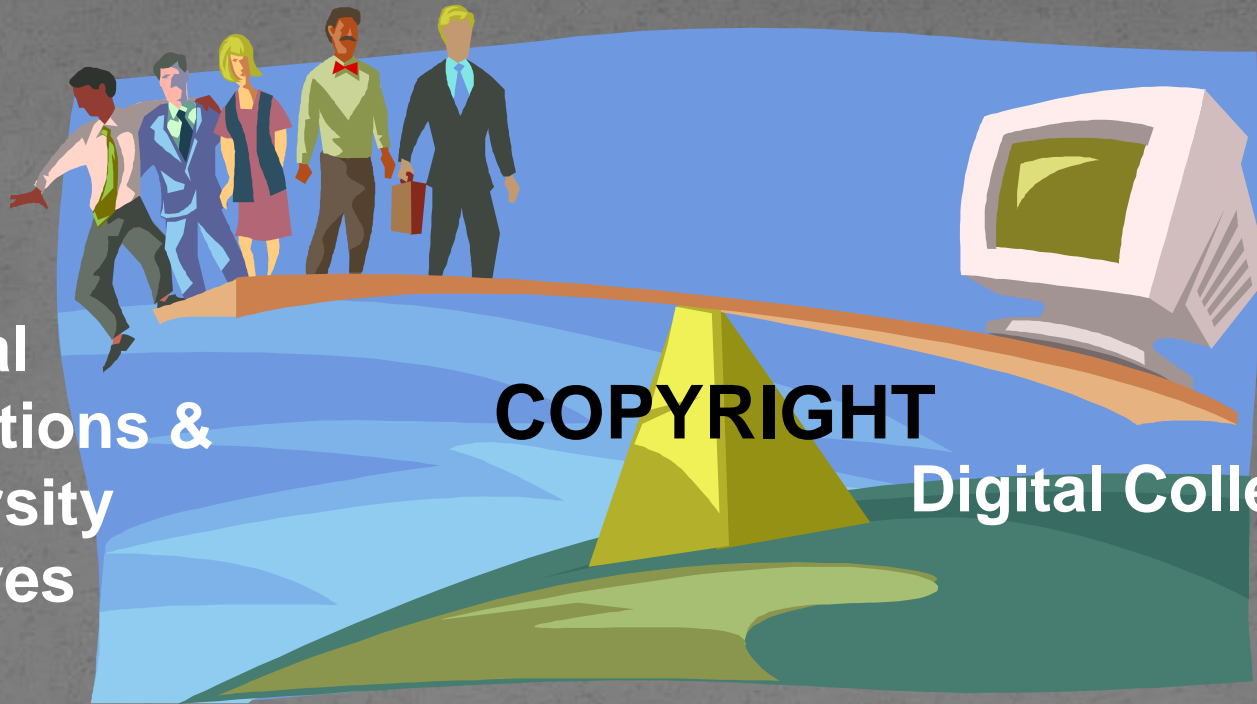

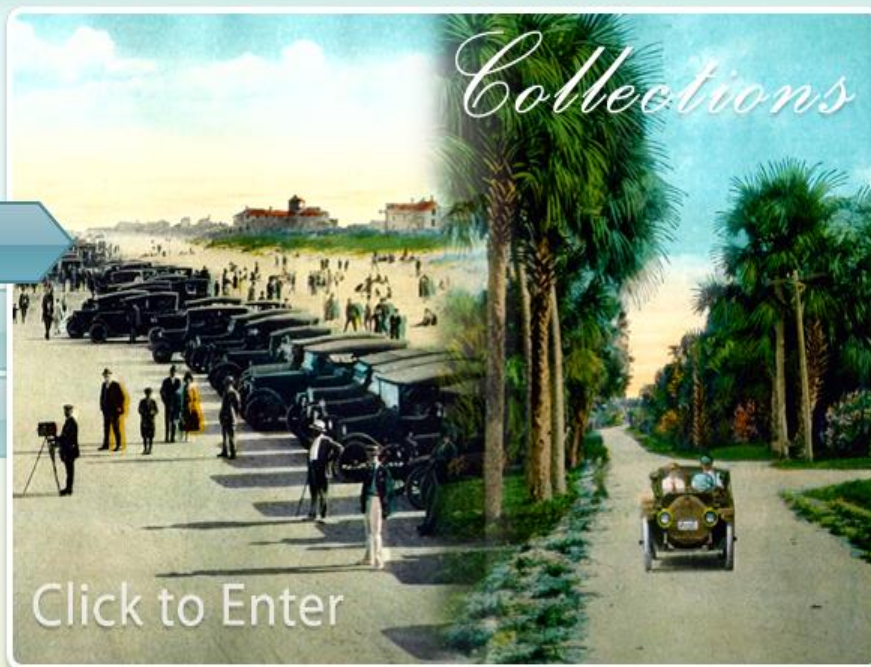

## 123 FREE BUILDING SITES ARE DEEDED TO VETERANS

### The Completion of State Road No. 24 Is Now In Sight

#### 30-Foot Paving To Start Through Here Friday

#### ALL BRIDGES FINISHED

Every bridge on every individual project of state road No. 24 (Federal highway 197) was completed yesterday. The work of paving through the city of St. Cloud will begin Friday or Saturday of this week, and, in compliance with the original plan, the road through here will be laid 30 feet wide, with curb, gutter and storm sewer.

The drainage work was directed out of the state roadway department offices in St. Cloud, B. E. Berg, project engineer, this morning, and was the occasion for numerous speeches by not only the people of St. Cloud but all Duval county and Florida as well.

It is now believed that the entire new road between Kissimmee and Melbourne will have been completed by the 15th of June, thus offering to local, state and interstate automobilists the shortest and finest cross-country highway in Florida. When this highway is opened, it will undoubtedly be the signal for continued heavy all-state motor travel.

"These members of the committee are from the state at large and three from each congressional district."
