In much reverence & dearness of love which the Lord in
his great love hath raised in my heart which
is beyond expression out ^{of} ^{my} heart which
doth feel & joy for mee in doe I dearly salute thee
with thy dear son & daughter & little ones dear son
by these thou must know that we are every way
throughout the Lords providence which wee daily witness
blessed bee his holy name forever: my husband
hall his dear love remember to you all: wee parted
with mine the 3 of this month at John prestons of
siccell hee had mee remember his dear love to
thee & left thee knowing that see was well & intended
for London as ^{safely} as she could conveniently
our dear love to all friends with thee as if I knowed
them I desire to know whether shes be fitted with
cloth for a waistcoat as soon as I may be my love to
sare & as that art I tell her that shes comd
desired that she may doe well & serve them
that she dwells with ⁱⁿ simpleness of heart & pure
words that she may ^{seepe} gods judgements
which others brings upon them by their ungodly
ways I was much troubled at a letter she
described to her father wherein she sent her
word she would not go into the new plantation
nor have her ^{sister} ~~with~~ which I ^{was} ^{very} ^{glad}
from her for I had bin at great ^{trouble} with her I
could doe ^{me} less but lett thee know: also I had
great deal to have written to thee concerning
Aldabe & I nor loe But it is something ~~removd~~
because I expect to see her ^{very} ^{soon} ⁱⁿ ^{the}
minds of sum then they can be ^{concerning} ^{there}
there proceeding: I must ^{not} ^{write}

any that is doubtful: if they find freedom
 I judge it very desirable so that I can give the
 no account at present when we shall go I do much
 desire to see you I hope I shall have opportunity
 I understand in this business absent you cannot come
 over so I have my confidence in the Lord that as
 we both in his great love & preservation in all our
 exercises: with him only do I commit my
 self with these all the Lord children I desire
 to hear from thee I am in haste
