I truly love Abigail and have not for got the comfort of the letter of the 11th of the 11th of the 11th

Dear friends Phineas and Phoebe pemberton my  
deare love salute you and your little one hoping you  
are all well and shall be very glad to heere that dear  
phoebe is got well and her illness and has her strength  
with a good if the Lord please to grant it from whom  
all our benedictions come glory to his name ever all who  
is worthy, dear friends time is short then the opportu-  
nity be large at this; and I cannot well omit dear friends  
whom I intirely love with love unforsaken I know you know  
it and want as much to see you as if I had not bene so  
lotly to visit you from whom we got pretty well  
home thro' many but thro' some difficulty, got to  
Lizaboth town well whered we staid too night  
and could not get a passage at last but went  
to swim our horses over to stattan Island whered  
we were pretty much bewidered but at last got to the  
ferry at night whered we waited a time for the boat  
and forgerd our horses and forgerd us by night which  
was 3 or 4 miles and next day comd home by an other  
things as well as we could expect our children well  
which was chiefst of my care, my friends know you  
will be glad to heere how we got home this is in short  
I am in hope I shall be very glad to heere from you  
and especially to heere that you are all well which is  
very good of lot I should be very glad to see you here  
but hardly expect it till next spring and then if  
you live and have your health I shall very much  
expect you but in the mean time if you are well  
and can spare I by all me can have a convenient  
opportunity I shall be very glad to see her here and  
shall take good care of her dear friends time

or no you have any thing from her husband my  
dear husband kind love to you all yours from  
M.G.
