Nursing Curriculum Redesign of Information Literacy

Past:

- Basic and Advanced at 200 level (2 sessions)
- Advanced at 400 level (1 session)

Redesign:

- Basic at 200 level (1 session)
- Advanced at 300 level
 - 1 session
 - Graded assignment
- Advanced at 400 level (1 session)

Objectives of New 300 Level Information Literacy Instruction


- 1. Create advanced search strategies in using subject terms, subheadings, and filters.
- 2. Access articles through library holdings or interlibrary loan.
- 3. Reflect about how they can create search strategies for future research projects.
- 4. Greater individualized contact with the librarian through personalized feedback.

Outcomes of Information Literacy Assignment

Librarian graded 114 assignments. Provided grades to classroom faculty.

57 nursing students, 1 CINAHL Worksheet each, 1 PubMed worksheet each

Grades: Scale ranged from 0-3 points. Average grade = 2.23 (74%)



Contact with Librarian: 36 individual consultations.

Previous year's contact for research paper in this course: a few emails.

Future Directions and Suggestions

- 1. Incorporate <u>reflection</u> component such as graded discussion forum on learning management system
- In-class and audio ppt instruction (both formats)
- 3. Confirm assignment process and parameters a few weeks before semester begins to avoid lastminute changes at hectic time of semester.

Student Learning Example:

Topic: The effect of nursing care on sleep deprivation

Initial search 8,113 articles. Few relevant in first few pages of results.

Structured search
91 articles, Many relevant

Faculty Feedback:

I think that the paper topics were much better focused in the review of literature last spring compared to previous years. This was my 5th year reading the papers. I attribute that to better searching as a result of your involvement.
