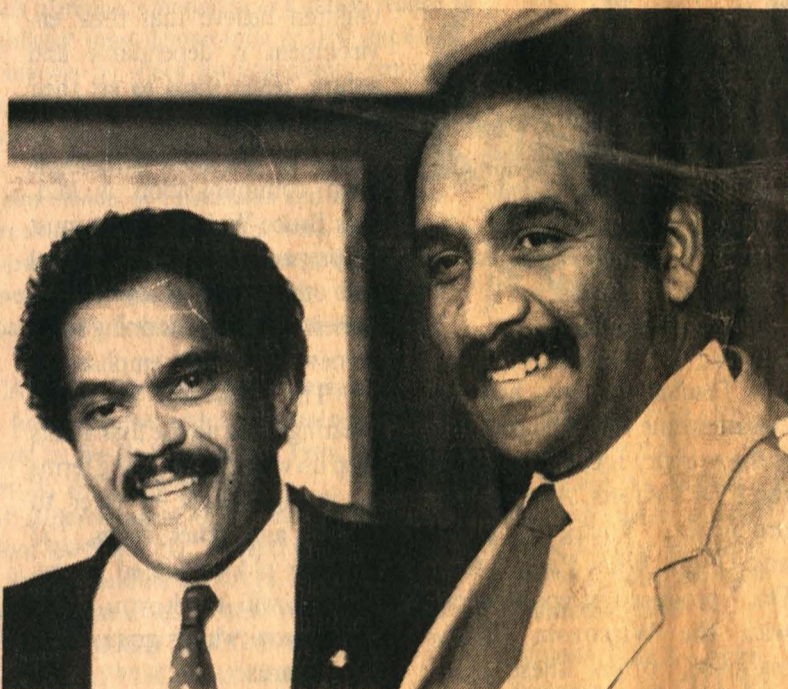

Mitchells Fight Back - Charge Meese Conspiracy

BALTIMORE, MD - Sons of the late Clarence M. Mitchell, Jr., NAACP's veteran civil rights leader, Maryland's former State Senator Clarence M. Mitchell, III and State Senator Michael Bowen Mitchell, charged that Edwin Meese, U.S. Attorney General, conspired with Maryland U.S. Attorney Breckinridge Wilcox, to turn around a proper legal retainer and fee of \$50,000 to perform general legal services into a big lie and a criminal frameup in political retaliation.

Clarence, founder of the National Black Caucus of State Legislators of which he was 7 year president, was a leader in the defeat of the racist Selma, Alabama U.S. prosecutor for a federal judgeship and the defeat of William Bradford Reynolds for higher office. He was an outspoken member of the Maryland State Legislature for 24 years.

Maryland U.S. prosecutors admitted in motions hearings that on at least four occasions contact was made with the Washington U.S. Attorney General's office to determine what to charge the Mitchell brothers with.

They were subsequently charged in indictments with conspiracy with officials of Wedtech, a Bronx, N.Y. defense contractor, to influence their uncle, Congressman Parren J. Mitchell, to stop a congressional investigation into the corporation's minority status. He testified that his nephews had never asked him to do anything about Wedtech.

A federal jury in the U.S. District Court of Maryland found them not guilty of the basic charge of conspiracy, but guilty of wire fraud and other acts flowing from the conspiracy.

Lawyers for the Mitchell brothers prepared to file motions this week to set aside the inconsistent verdicts.

Clarence and Michael have steadfastly maintained their innocence of all charges and vowed to fight for their total vindication through all the appeal courts.

Former State Senator Clarence Mitchell charged that the two year federal investigation of them accompanied by the harassing constant leaks to the press prior to their indictment, was part of a nationwide plan by the Reagan Administration to poison the climate of public opinion and to drive

outspoken Black elected officials from public office, as in post Reconstruction days.

Veteran political leaders see this as the Reagan plot to dilute Black political gains from the 1965 Voting Rights Act, whose passage through the Congress was spearheaded by their late father, Clarence M. Mitchell, Jr., Director of the Washington Bureau NAACP. The historic Baltimore City Court House is named for him.

"We are being victimized by a corrupt justice department conspiracy far worse than Nazi Germany or Communist Russia, orchestrated by U.S. Attorney General Edwin Meese himself," said former State Senator Clarence Mitchell. "In Nazi Germany and Communist countries, you knew there was no justice. Meese is carrying out his conspiracy in the name of democracy, relegating dissenters to the status of criminals."

"Meese and his cohorts are thieves of the highest order because they are trying to steal Black dignity and Black political progress by destroying our leaders," he continued.

"Meese has been systematically stacking the courts with racist judges, filling the U.S. Attorneys offices with racist prosecutors who are forced to resign if they refuse to do his will. An example is the U.S. Attorney for North Carolina, who resigned a few months ago, charging Meese with obstructing justice in the Jim and Tammy Bakker investigation," Mitchell continued.

Michael, an attorney, former assistant state's attorney for Baltimore City, and two

term City Councilman, currently the State Senator for the 39th district of Baltimore City, has a reputation for expertise in minority businesses and 8-A contracts. Michael vigorously contended that he was retained to perform general legal services for Wedtech and to improve its Black minority image as its first Black minority law firm. He was

also to recruit Black subcontractors, and help to organize joint ventures. A retainer contract for legal services was entered into with Wedtech officials, before any word of a federal investigation surfaced. Actually, the retainer contract for his legal services was signed shortly after Wedtech, a Hispanic firm, received the widely publicized

Nation Mourns Chicago's First Black Mayor

President Ronald Reagan, two Democratic presidential candidates, a former presidential candidate and the mayors of the nation's largest cities eulogized Chicago Mayor Harold Washington Wednesday for his leadership and humanity, and said he will be missed.

Washington, the first Black mayor of the nation's third largest city, collapsed in his City Hall office during a meeting and was pronounced dead at Northwestern Memorial Hospital. He was 65.

Doctors said Washington died of cardiac arrest.

The news of Washington's death sent a shock throughout the city, and brought expressions of sorrow from across the

country and as far away as Kuwait.

Democratic presidential candidate and civil rights leader Jesse Jackson cut short his tour of the Persian Gulf to return to Chicago to preside over Washington's funeral. "This is one of the saddest days of my life," Jackson said.

"There is no doubt when a tree of Harold's magnitude falls, there is sorrow in the forest," Jackson told reporters less than three hours after arriving in Kuwait at the start of a gulf tour that had been expected to last a week.

"He has left a great legacy. Harold is for all of us," Jackson said.

Noted mezzo-soprano Faye Coates will perform in a Christmas jubilee concert on December 20 to help raise funds to support a variety of events and programs for the Black community.

Coates, a Rialto resident, has studied as well as performed before audiences in Germany and France and appeared with operatic or civic light opera groups in San Bernardino, Rialto, Washington, D.C., Illinois, Oklahoma and other locations.

She is the official songstress laureate of the city of Rialto.

The program will be held in the recently opened Sturges Center for Fine Arts, 798 N. "E" Street., San Bernardino, starting at 3 p.m. The event is co-sponsored by the San Bernardino Black Culture Foundation and the Southern California Gas Co.

Coates will sing classical selections, followed by a variety of traditional Christmas music. A special guest performer will be lyric soprano Ann Hendricks-Jones. Pianist Robert Derrick of Riverside will accompany the vocalists.

Jim King, SoCalGas district manager, said funds from the afternoon concert will help support activities of the San Bernardino Black Culture Foundation, including its

"We are striving to bring a diversity of Black culture to share with other ethnic groups in the San Bernardino area," said King, who also serves as president of the Foundation. "This program should be a must for all who love music."

Children, Drugs & Alcohol: Prevention Begins At Home

When a ten-year-old girl asked Bruce Weitz, who portrayed Mick Belker on NBC-TV's "Hill Street Blues," how she could help a friend who was abusing drugs, the mouths of parents in the room dropped. As more of the seven to thirteen-year-olds asked similar questions of Weitz, many of the adults present realized for the first time that drug and alcohol use is not limited to high school students.

That is one of the reasons Weitz is devoted much of his spare time to serve as Honorary Chairman of the National PTA Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Project.

"Parents say, 'My son is only seven years old. I don't have to worry about alcohol or drugs yet,'" Weitz says. "I tell them it's never too early to talk to young people about drugs and drinking."

The facts support Weitz's statement. The National Institute on Drug Abuse reports that by the time children reach the fourth grade - nine and ten-year-olds - they may have knowledge of the drug scene and may be feeling pressure to use drugs or alcohol. There are some three million alcoholics in this country under the age of eighteen.

"We are trying to teach parents how to influence their children's decisions about drinking and drugs," explains Elaine Stienkemeyer, 1983-1985 National PTA president. "Children and their parents often have a difficult time communicating their feelings to each other," she says. "Parents are afraid to face the fact that young children are exposed to drugs and children are afraid that if they tell their parents the truth, they won't understand," Stienkemeyer adds.



Teaching parents how to communicate with their children is the primary focus of most of the PTA's efforts. A new PTA brochure, "Young Children and Drugs: What Parents Can Do," produced in cooperation with the Wisconsin Clearinghouse, offers these suggestions.

*Teach children how to express their feelings. They need to believe it's safe and appropriate for them to do so. Since children learn by example, parents must also learn to express feelings honestly.

*Teach children to take responsibility at an early age. Give them meaningful tasks that demand the use of their mental and physical abilities - tasks for which they are accountable.

*Create opportunities for children to think through what they would do in situations where they have to make choices. The ability to make judgments and decisions are valuable tools in helping children resist the crowd that offers them drugs.

*Listen to what children have to say. Help them talk free-

ly without fear of judgment or reprimand. Ask each child's opinion about family problems and decisions. And, don't talk down to children, rather treat them with respect.

*Set firm limits with children and make it clear what is expected of them and the consequences if they act otherwise. Firm, reasonable limits help children believe that their environment is dependable and secure. Teach them to set their own limits, too.

Once the ground work of open communication is laid, says Bruce Weitz, parents must be prepared to discuss alcohol and other drugs when to time comes. "This means doing some homework," Weitz emphasizes.

The PTA and Wisconsin Clearinghouse advise that adults keep up with current slang terms by young people to refer to alcohol and other drugs. "If you use old, outdated terms, children will think you really don't know what's going on," Weitz warns.

A mistake many parents make, according to the PTA, is sitting their children down for a one-shot talk about drugs. "You must talk about it regular-

ly to have impact," says Elaine Stienkemeyer. She suggests using TV programs, newspaper articles and movies to start discussions about drugs.

The discussions young people have with their friends about drugs are equally important. Contrary to many adults' perceptions, children generally feel more pressure to use drugs from friends rather than from "drug pushers" lurking around the playground. Getting to know their friends and finding opportunities to meet their friends' parents can help adults recognize potential troublesome relationships.

And finally, the PTA recommends teaching children how to play and have fun without drugs. Children often experiment with drugs out of boredom.

Perhaps the most important thing parents can do for their children, Stienkemeyer and Weitz believe, is to set good examples for them at home. "Your habits send a powerful message to your children," Weitz notes. "Make sure it's the message you want them to hear."

award for Minority Entrepreneur of the Year at The White House, presented by Vice President George Bush for President Reagan who personally commended the company.

On the first trial date, Wednesday, October 21st, Judge Norman Ramsey declared a mistrial, because four prospective jurors reported overhearing another White jury member in the jury room threaten "to shoot or kill the Mitchells", if selected to hear the case.

Following the mistrial and dismissal of the panel of 90 prospective jurors, Judge Ramsey called for a Grand Jury investigation into the threats.

The second trial began the following Monday, October 26th, with a new panel of jurors. Normal judicial practice should have required a postponement of the trial to clear the atmosphere of bias against the defendants.

The Mitchell brothers charge gross prosecutorial misconduct. During jury selection, prosecutors used seven of their ten strikes to remove Blacks. One other strike was used to remove a White citizen who admitted participation in civil rights demonstrations during the 60's and 70's. Eight of their ten strikes were based on color or civil rights activity.

Prosecutors constantly referred to "bribery" during the trial in spite of the judge's warning that no bribery was charged or in evidence.

Not one solitary piece of evidence of wrongdoing by the brothers was presented during the trial.

"The prosecutors were out to legally lynch us," said Clarence Mitchell. "They appealed to the racism of the nine White jurors because even their own witnesses never accused my brother or me of any wrongdoing."

Courtroom observers, the majority of Maryland's Black community and a substantial segment of the White community, expressed concern that the testimony against the Mitchells was by four Government witnesses, all of whom have been convicted of Wedtech-related charges and who were

identified by the prosecution as former "liars who are now telling you the truth."

Citing the inconsistencies between their conspiracy acquittal and the other findings, the Mitchells are committed to carry their fight, if motions to set aside are denied, to the U.S. Courts of Appeal until "we are totally vindicated."

Essentially, the Mitchells have been convicted of agreeing to lobby although in the court record there is no indication that they did anything improper, or that they knew that Wedtech was a corrupt company. In fact, the evidence was quite clear that the Wedtech officers hid their various illegal activities from the Mitchells and provided them with indications that it was a bonafide corporation.

Their mother, Juanita, founder of the NAACP Youth Movement, stated: "My sons are freedom fighters and have been from their youth. This long harassment has been aimed at silencing strong voices."

The Mitchells and their supports, locally and nationally, who have established a Mitchell defense fund, view the confrontation as an ongoing attempt by the lame duck Reagan Administration to discredit Black political leadership everywhere.

They cite problems now facing other Black elected officials and civil rights leaders throughout the nation.

The Mitchell Defense Fund leaders include C. Delores Tucker, former Secretary of State of Pennsylvania, Co-Chairperson of the Fund; Rev. Maurice Dawkins, retired OIC Congressional Liaison, Co-Chairperson; and Howard T. Robinson, Sr., Coordinator. Congressman Paren J. Mitchell; George Haley, Esquire; Mayor Andrew Young Atlanta; former Mayor Richard Hatcher, Gary; Mayor Johnny Ford, Tuskegee; Dick Gregory; Dorothy Height; Julius Chambers, Esquire; Chris Eltey; Rev. Willie Barrow; Bishop John Hurst Adams; Coretta Scott King; Eleanor Holmes Norton, Esquire; Dr. Al Poussiant; Juanita Jackson Mitchell, Esquire; Dr. Benjamin Hooks; and Robert M. McGotten.

The keynote speaker was Sandra Hicks Cox, Vice President and Regional Counsel of the Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, Inc. Cox spoke about why health care is essential. She said the state of health is in critical condition in the United States. Health care providers are struggling to deliver health care. Physicians are overworked, "we are deprived of liberty and too sick to pursue happiness."

She said there is \$600 million between Medicare payments and its cost. Pulling out as some hospitals have done, makes it worse. The problems are not limited to the MediCal population. The devastation of a catastrophic illness on the middle-age or elderly person can totally wipe-out people with a secure future. We can now expect more devastation from younger people with the advent of A.I.D.S.

"We can eliminate this nation's two-tiered system," by increasing support for the Inland Empire Health Center. Hospitals like Loma Linda and

Kaiser must remain in the forefront of medical service.

"America is on the move and health care is on the way up," she said, "there has been significant progress. Health care is no longer a closed domain. Nurses have entered into the equation, and patients rights are important."

Chiropractors

Dear Dr. Levister: Why would a person go to a chiropractor? J.R.

Dear J.R.: I have referred your question to Dr. Augustine Amerigo, a chiropractor, who practices in San Bernardino.

"Doctors of Chiropractic (or chiropractors as they are more commonly known) provide non-surgical, non-medical treatment for a variety of conditions. Most of these conditions involve pain in a muscle or joint. 'Pinched nerves', 'slipped discs', sprained joints (leg, arm, or back) also fall into these categories. Fractures, infections, or organ problems are referred to medical specialists.

In this day and age all chiropractors are licensed. As a chiropractic doctor he/she must complete the minimum of six years of college study and clinical internship at an accredited institution. They then must pass a state board examination. They must take postgraduate courses to remain current and to maintain their licenses.

Upon your first visit to the chiropractor he will diagnose your condition. He may take x-rays and/or refer you to a lab for additional tests. If other forms of treatment are indicated you will be referred to a proper specialist. If your condition is determined to be one that could respond to chiropractic methods, treatment will consist of spinal or joint manipulation, physical therapy, therapeutic exercises and advice.

Insurance covers most treatment. Costs are generally equal to, or less than, medical care for similar conditions.

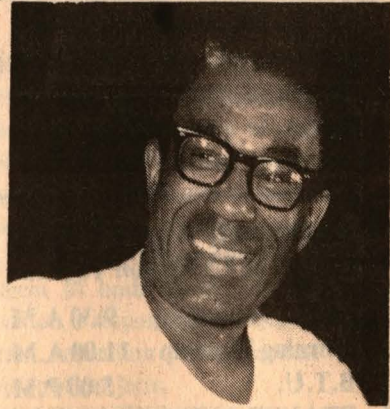
Moreno Valley News By Charles Ledbetter

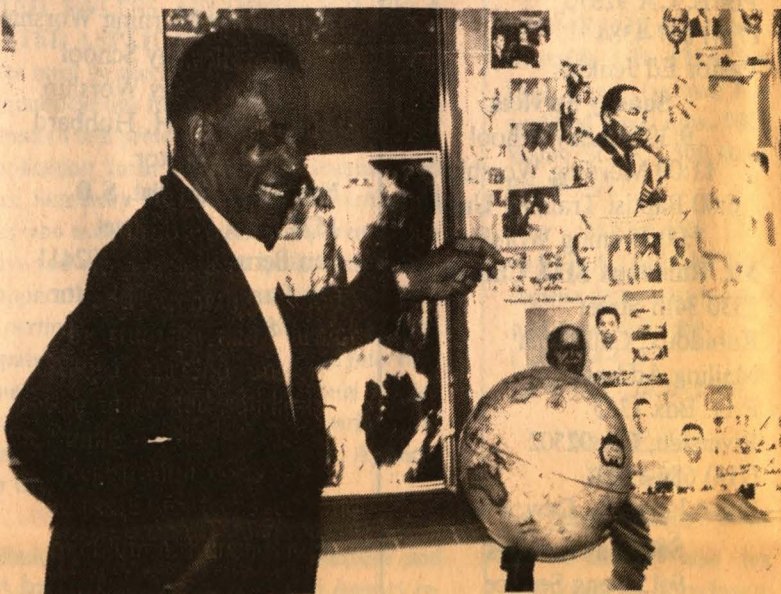

A Tribute To Floyd Brown

February 15, 1907 - December 1, 1987



Some people dream dreams and say if I only had been born rich I would have accomplished great things.

Floyd Brown dreamed dreams of making this world a better place. He finished high school only after his nine children were grown. He never went to college, and he was not a academic scholar.

He was raised on a sharecropper's farm in Jones County North Carolina and grew up with great insight in human behavior and what made people tick.

He started early in life volunteering his time with baseball teams he organized. For the past fifty years he held every position possible in the local Boy Scouts of America. He served his Elks and Mason Lodges faithfully. He was still until his death serving as a Steward and Sunday School teacher at St. Matthew AME Zion Church.

At the age of 72, after the medical doctors gave up on his life, he answered God's call into the ministry and served preaching the gospel about the "good news".

For the past thirty years every local, state and national politician seeking votes out of a three county area would seek guidance and counsel from Floyd Brown.

He would sit for hours and talk about his experiences before Blacks were

allowed to vote in Jones County. However, he never blamed an entire race of people for the faults of a few and always spoke of those Whites who were helping the cause for voting rights.

When politicians came to the house he built with his own hands in the 1930's he never apologized for not having material things. He said, "good people accept you for what you stand for, not for your material wealth."

Floyd Brown was the kind of man every man wants his daughter to marry, every girl and boy would want as a brother, every parent wants as a son, and the kind of family man every family needs. He was the kind of man who had so much love for mankind he shared it with the world.

It gives us great pleasure to share this brief tribute to a great human being, who answered God's call and closed his eyes December 1, 1987, he was 80 years old.

He leaves to cherish his memory, a loving wife, nine children, 39 grandchildren, 16 great grandchildren and host of other relatives and friends

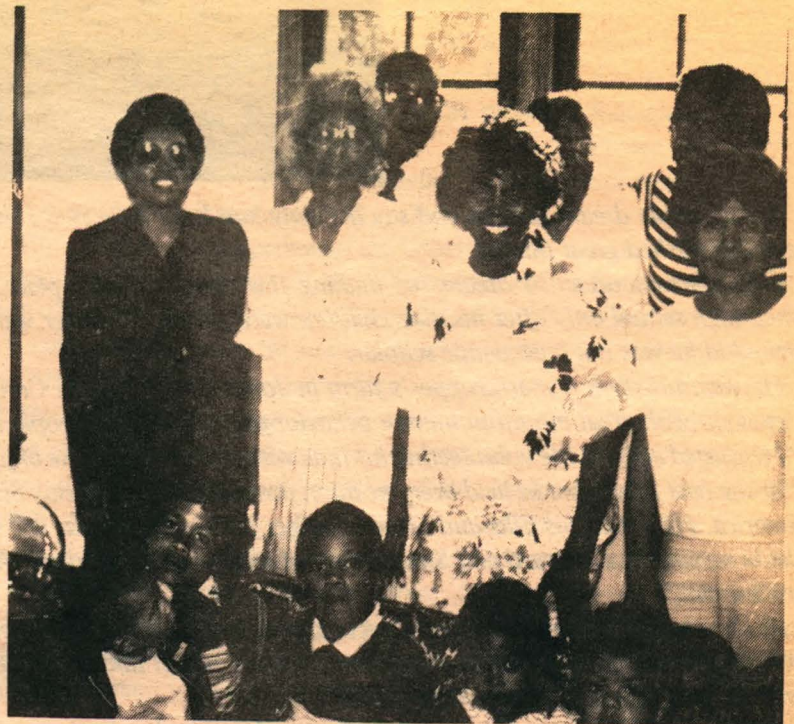

Publisher's Father Receives State's Highest Honors

N.C. Gov. Hunt and Elks Honor Floyd Brown

NORTH CAROLINA

-When the Governor of North Carolina sets aside a day in honor of any individual, it is a big day, when the person lives in the state, it is a double honor, because the Governor's proclamation is usually saved, for high powered visitors to the state. Add to that special award, the presentation of the Order of Long Life Pine, the highest award the state gives to its citizen's for outstanding service to the State and add to this that this person is your father, then you really have a combination which can't be beat and you see how Floyd Brown of North Carolina and Hardy Brown, publisher of the Black Voice feel about what happened on December 5, 1982.

When Governor Jim Hunt heard that Zeno Council no.16 of the Elks (IBPOE) were planning to honor, Past Exalted Ruler, and Past State President, Floyd Brown he seized the opportunity to make the special award for his outstanding contributions to the Governor's office and the state in working to make the quality of life better for all "Tarheels," according to Ben Ruffin, the Governor's assistant.

Ruffin said, in a special telephone interview with the Black Voice, "Mr. Floyd Brown is among the few Black's in the state to receive the Order of the Long Leaf Pine and to have a day declared for any native is unheard of, I can safely say he is the first Black man in Jones County to have this honor."

Further Ruffin said the Governor highly respects Mr. Brown, he has been a leader and

supporter since the early days, and he has stuck with him since before he ran for Lt. Governor.

"You don't know what he means to young guys in North Carolina, he is a role model, a symbol of hope - remember he came from a time when a Black person had to count the bubbles in a bar of soap in order to vote and now North Carolina has over 400 Black elected officials and 3 Black Sheriffs," Ruffin said emphatically.

St. Matthew A.M.E. Zion Church was the place for the tribute. The church was overflowing with people. The Sunday morning service was opened by Rev. Richardson and St. Matthew choir and after missionary offering the Elks took charge. P.G.E.R. Alexander Foxe was splendid as the master of Ceremonies. As is traditional, the Elks gave a large donation to the church.

In addition to the proclamation, which said in part, Floyd Brown is a symbol of strength and courage, wisdom and understanding and particularly recognized his unending battle against bigotry, in the state, he was presented with awards from Zeno Council no. 16, and a Certificate of Award from New River Lodge No. 1109 District Number 1.

Brown received flowers from Judge and Mrs. Walter Henderson, of Trenton, a bouquet of balloons from the Senior Citizens, a money collar, and money from Zeno Temple 166 of New Bern and No. 1101 of Beaufort, N.C. plus many individual gifts.

Telegrams were received from Senator Harold Hardison of Deep Run, Congressman Charlie Whitley of Mt. Olive, Judge Henderson of Trenton and Judge William Stevenson.

State Representative Wendell Murphy spoke and presented him with a famous North Carolina smoked ham.

Who is this man and what has he done to deserve such honors, one may ask. He is a kind simple man with a genuine love for his fellow man and a man who bloomed after retirement as a janitor in the public school.

He is a Sunday School Superintendent, class leader, chairperson of the Usher Board, teacher of the adult class and Trustee in his church. For 34 years he was a boy scout leader and received many awards including the Greenband award for service. He has been an influential member of the Jones County Voters League, served as Chairman for several years and presently serves as Vice Chairman.

He is currently a member of the 100 Club of Jones Coun-

ty, board member of White Oak Medical Center, a member of the Jones County Board of Elections and has served two terms on the Jones County Jury Commission.

He has devoted much of his life to Senior Citizens affairs, activities, and concerns.

He is presently President of the United Tri-County Senior Citizens organization, a member of the Jones County Council on Aging and a member of the North Carolina Governor's Coordinating Council on Aging.

He has been affiliated with the Elks Lodge and served as Exalted Ruler of Trent River Lodge No. 134 and a member of Enloe's Past State President's Council.

Additionally, he is a member and key person of the 1st and 3rd Congressional District's Black Caucus. He headed up the Jimmy Carter campaign in 3 counties. He is one of those people Carter didn't forget when he won the Presidency, once he personally called him to extend an invitation to join him for a function in Raleigh, N.C., however Mr. Brown was very ill and could not attend.

Gov. Hunt says he has been a staunch supporter of the Democratic Party, and has never wavered in his support.

He and his wife of 52 years live in the same house he built some 40 years ago while he was sharecropping. Nine of the eleven living children born to them live in North Carolina, California, and Maryland.

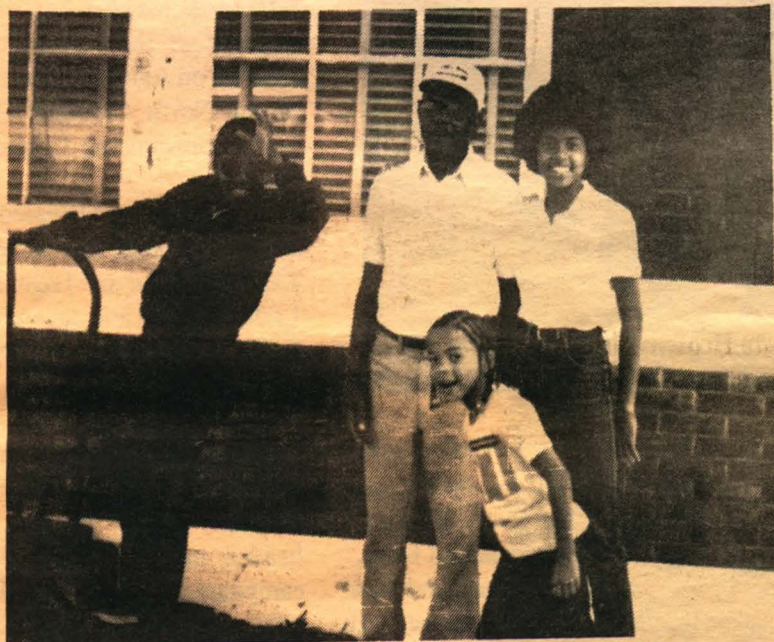
"I just didn't expect it to be that big," said Brown, who was well pleased and pleasantly surprised with the event.

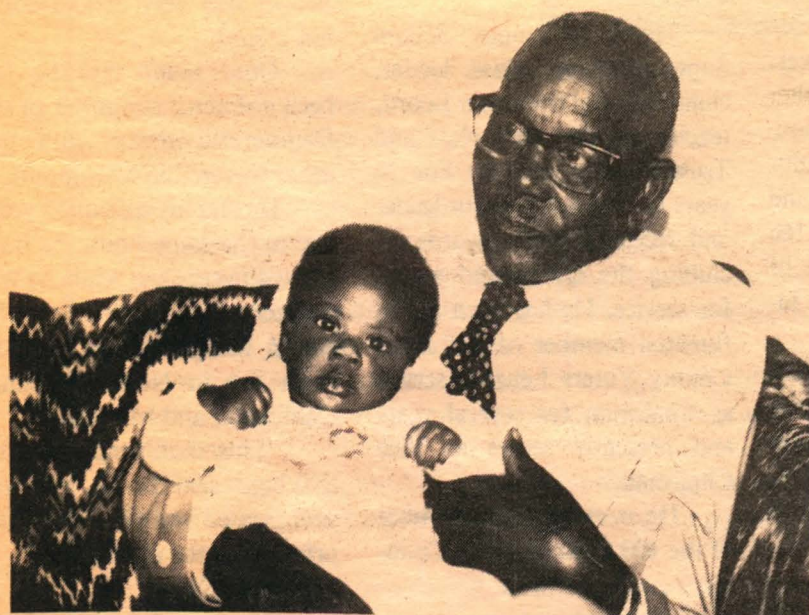
