SMU Libraries has retained its status as the 'Most Preferred Place' by SMU students for many years running, according to the 2018 annual SMUSA (SMU Students Association) survey. I am sure you would agree with me that what makes a great space is a combination of many aspects, facilities, services, light, sounds, people, ambience, one's feelings or perception of the Library, the values that the Library and the library staff represent to the users and so on.

Whenever I meet SMU Alumni, the first thing they usually share with me is their fond memories of the Library and how much they miss the spaces and how they love coming back to visit the Library whenever they are on campus. Of course the Library is not only a physical space, but it is a combination of all the services, expertise, resources and experiences it makes available to the entire SMU community.

2018 was another year full of fabulous offerings, experiences, interactions and achievements. Almost 2 million entries were

recorded for Li Ka Shing and Kwa Geok Choo Law Libraries in 2018. SMU students, faculty and staff had over 2 and a half million digital interactions with the Library which includes use of virtual services, resources and expertise. SMU academic papers have been downloaded 2 million times from SMU's Institutional Knowledge, InK by people from all over the world as of 6 July 2018.

Many innovative services took off in 2018 too, for example the new Reading List Management System which aims to help faculty to streamline their reading list preparation and to help students with their learning experience in using and accessing these lists, all via elearn. Another new initiative has been making 150 most popular textbooks available as e-textbooks for use anytime and anyplace through a new platform enhancing students' experience and convenience.

Finally, let me acknowledge the Library team which includes many student helpers for their outstanding work, commitment and enthusiasm in supporting the SMU community.

What happened in a typical month at SMU Libraries



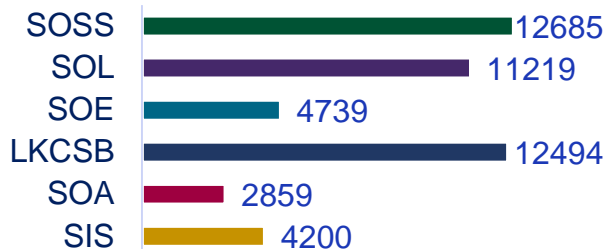

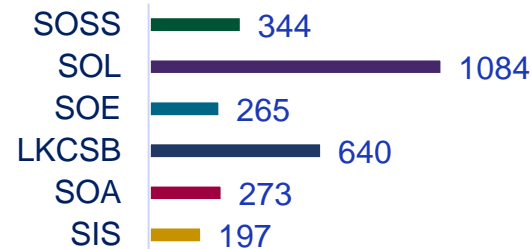


Book chapters accessed by school

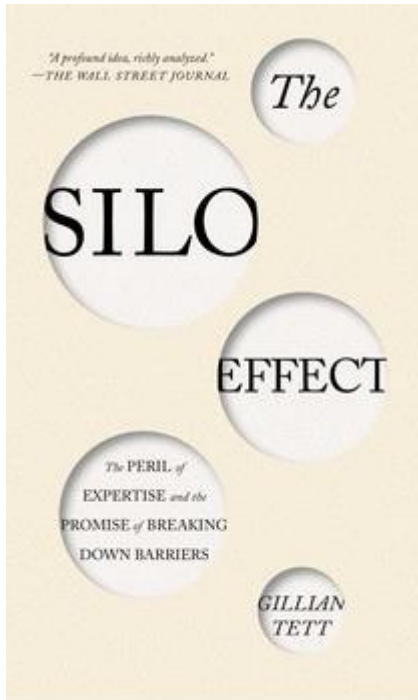
