In nearby Idyllwild high up in the cool of the beautiful mountains sits a First Class resort owned and operated by Christians who are African-Americans. The place is Alhatti. The Christian Retreat hide away is available for a unique experience. Recently, George Bargainer of Southern California Edison, assembled a community group at Alhatti to speak about resources available in the Black community and to discuss some of the challenges they face.

Al and Hatti Hollingsworth are fulfilling a dream that blesses God. According to the Hollingsworths, "The goal is to have a first class Four Star resort where our people can get away from the hustle and bustle of everyday life and commune with the Lord. It is also a

place where unbelievers can come and find Jesus in the process."

The decorum is exquisite and elegant. Guest are housed in cottages or in dormitories. The cottages are each uniquely decorated, some in floral pattern and others in exciting African print designs. "I personally decorated each cabin," said Mrs Hatti Hollingsworth. "She is meticulous about detail," said her co-manager. True to her meticulous nature, as the interview proceeded she straightened pillows, rearranged furniture, buffed non visible spots (to me) getting ready for the group of men from Life Church of God In Christ who were arriving at 6:00 p.m. for their annual Men's Retreat.

While communing with God in the abundance of nature the men could not help but to visit one of two

worship areas.

Away from the camp and the buildings high atop the mountain is Chapel Hill, and ideal setting for fellowship with God.

The Amphitheater is surrounded by beautiful trees, a babbling brook and tropical waterfalls. In any season this area provides a place for a service or to be alone.

Located on this 121 acre site is a one acre lake stocked with trout, bluegill, and catfish. The area is a natural bird sanctuary. Watching the squirrels fill in the holes in the trees made by woodpeckers as they prepare for winter is enjoyable.

The resort boasts a spa with a jacuzzi and dry sauna/steam room. The added sports courts for basketball, volleyball, softball and other games add to the

Community Stands-Up For San Bernardino

"I'm mad as hell and I'm not going to take it anymore," says Sam Catalano, President of the San Bernardino Downtown Business Association and Manager of the Carousel Mall referring to malicious articles that inaccurately represent the city of San Bernardino as a terrible place to live. "So on Monday, November 6th, 12:00 p.m. on the steps of City Hall, businesses, politicians, and civic associations led by San Bernardino Mayor Tom Minor will 'Stand-Up for San Bernardino' in a major Press Conference and Rally to tell our side of the story," he added.

Mayor Minor will speak before a crowd expected to be the largest ever for this kind of event. He will talk about the good things that San Bernardino has to offer.

Among other things he will tell the participants and the media that violent crime is down significantly; over 10,000 new jobs have been added in the region and 3,000 to the city in past two years; major manufacturing, retail, transportation and industrial companies have moved to, or expanded in San Bernardino; we have a virtually unlimited supply of mountain spring water including a pre-piped source of geothermal hot water; and the city boasts the most affordable single-family homes in the state.

There are other positive accomplishments including, "unemployment has been reduced to 8.2%. This is lower

than the counties of Los Angeles and Riverside and no different than the rest of the Inland Empire," says William L. Bopf, Executive Director of the Inland Valley Development Association (IVDA) and member of the San Bernardino Chamber of Commerce.

With respect to the city's strategic location, Atkinson and other members of the Chamber of Commerce are emphasizing the message, the message that San Bernardino is home to it's own state university, California State University at San Bernardino and Community College, San Bernardino Valley College. "The city is a close neighbor of such distinguished colleges as the University of Redlands, University of California at Riverside, Loma Linda University & Medical Center and California Baptist College," said Atkinson.

San Bernardino is centrally located between the San Bernardino Mountains with the best skiing, hiking and lakes in Southern California, the desert communities, home to the nation's best golf courses, and the Orange County Beaches.

The city is also the site of many events: The Western Regional Little League tournaments which hosts thousands of parents, the NAACP Inland Empire Minority Job Fair, the San Bernardino Soap Box Derby, Spirit Baseball (L.A. Dodgers farm team), and the Renaissance Pleasure Faire.

The annual event will be hosted by KTTV Fox News anchor, Christine Devine, and will highlight a historic year in the history of African-Americans in this country.

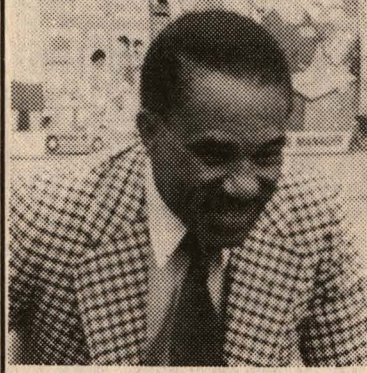

Safe Sex Post Heart Attack

Our Bodies

DEAR DR. LEVISTER: I experience a heart attack six weeks ago. Is it safe to have sex with my partner? H.A.

DEAR H.A.: A recent survey of 88 men with coronary heart disease who were enrolled in a long term cardiac program suggests that sexual intercourse poses little or no risk for people without ischemia (inadequate blood flow to the heart).

As part of the study, the men performed exercise tests during which they rode a stationary bicycle while hooked up to an electrocardiogram. This is a machine that records changes in the heart's electrical activity. For 24 hours the patients also wore portable monitors that monitored the electrical activity of their heart while performing their usual daily activities.

All the patients were asked to have intercourse with their partners while wearing this monitor. Medications such as beta blockers, calcium channel blockers and nitroglycerine were stopped during the period of evaluation.

The study showed most patient's heart rate was higher during the bicycle exercise test than during sexual intercourse. The average heart rate is limited, so the physical stress on the heart is high only for a brief period. The average heart rate was 138 beats per minute

during the stress test vs. only 118 during intercourse. Presumably because the greater cardiac demands are on the bicycle test, more than 60% of the patients have evidence of ischemia during the exercise stress test - only 31% of the patients had ischemia during sex. The study further suggests that the percentage of patients experiencing ischemia or decreased blood flow to the heart was high due to the elimination of medication during the evaluation.

Although the studies suggest that sexual intercourse is safe for people with coronary artery disease, common sense should prevail. Taking cardiac medications as prescribed is important in the protection of your heart. Regular medical check ups are highly recommended. You and your mate should discuss this with your personal physician.

Anti-Voter Fraud Bill Signed By Governor

Assembly Bill 1532, a bill which helps prevent for voter registration fraud, was recently signed by Governor Wilson.

Authored by Assemblyman Kevin Murray (D-Los Angeles), AB 1532 expands the ability to track so-called "bounty hunters" who register voters in exchange for payment. Under the new law, bounty hunters must record their address and telephone number directly on the voter registration cards. In addition, various information concerning the organization, known as a bounty organization, which hired the bounty hunter is required.

weeks at one session per week. The program is free to anyone who will train to ensure its success. It is only available through a church.

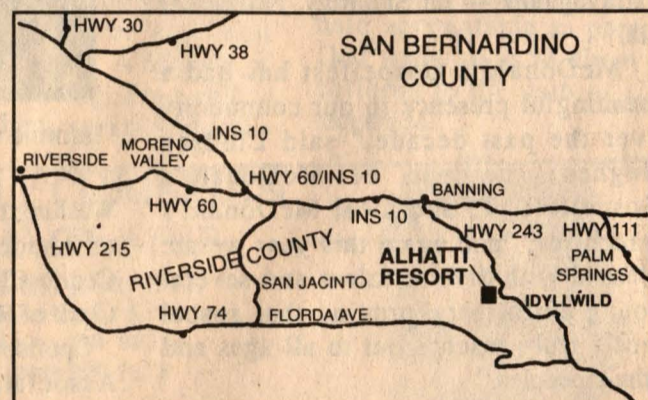
Hollingsworth has BOSS programs internationally in Africa, Japan and Switzerland.

PASADENA - Will the buck stop here? Take that question mark away from this sentence.

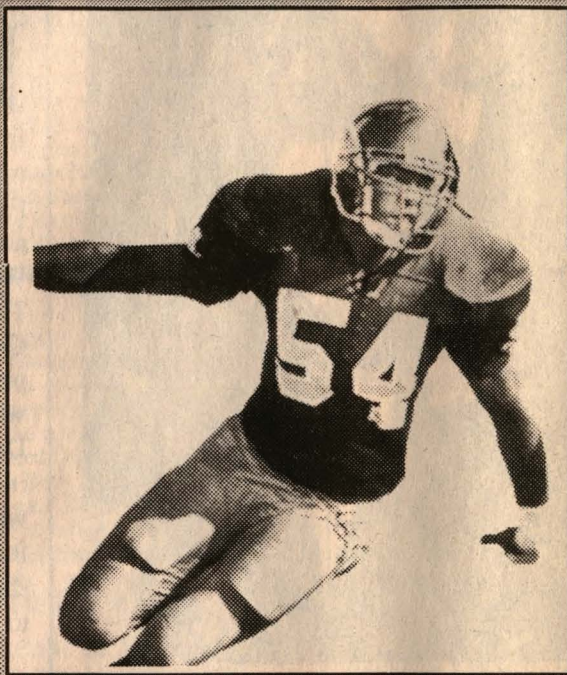

Added UCLA Coach Terry Donahue: "Karim is the most competitive player on this team, both in practice and in games. He's a coaches dream, a special person on and off the field."

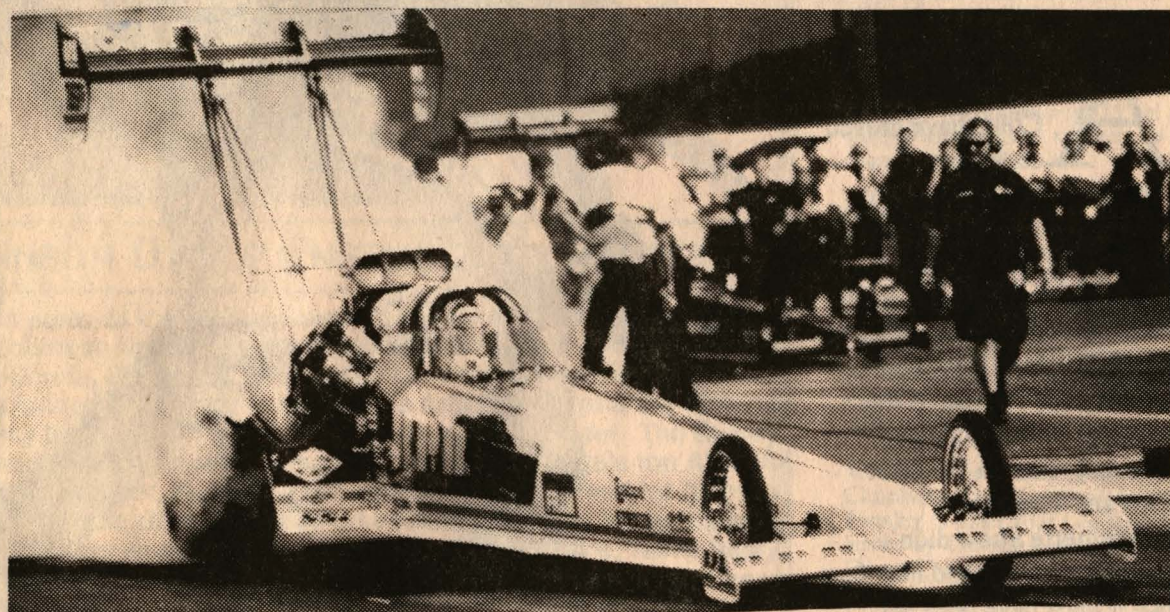

"We wanted to make a statement early in qualifying," Force said, "and that's what we did. My crew is the best and they deserve credit for this, too."

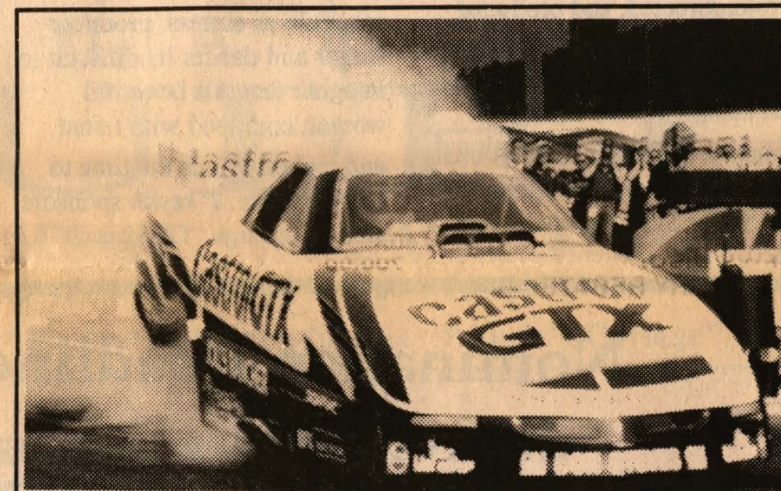
The Winston Select Finals winners were: Al Hoffmann in the funny car series, moving at

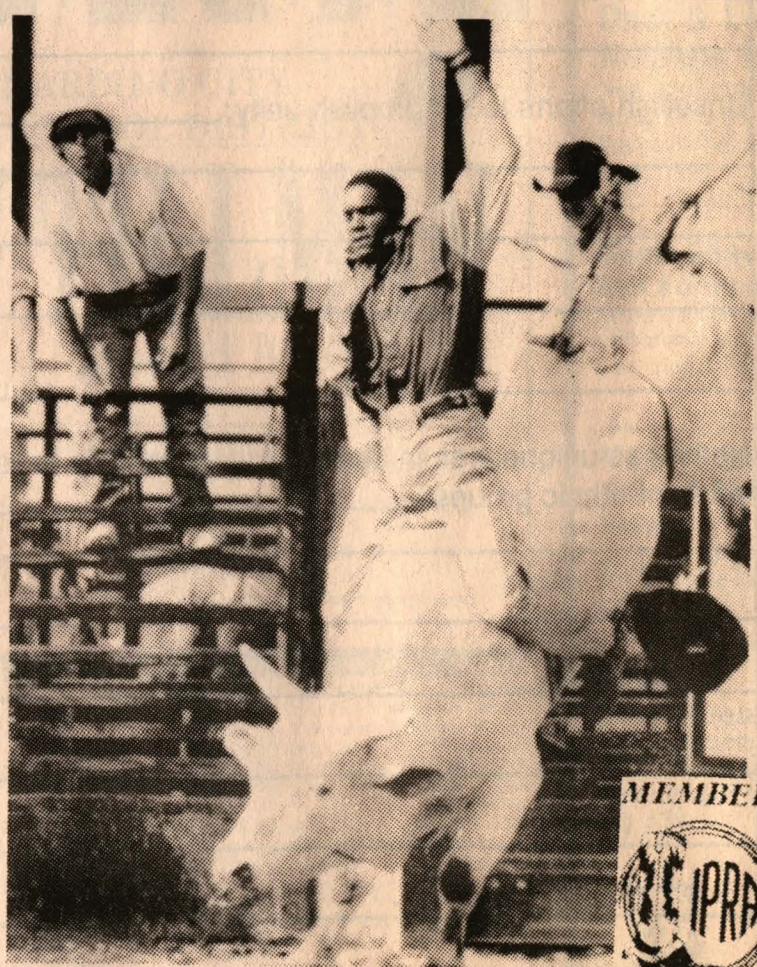
