This book presents a selection of papers given at the Tenth International April Conference held at the Jagiellonian University in Kraków on April 20–22, 2005. It was the tenth meeting in a series of triennial congresses which have been organized by the English Department of the Jagiellonian University since 1978. This year, 130 scholars took part in the Conference, 110 papers were read, and almost 90 papers were submitted for publication.

The title of this book, "Language and Identity: English and American Studies in the Age of Globalization," echoes the theme of the Conference. As usual, the wide scope of the Conference produced a great variety of papers which address the topic from many different perspectives. This book is the second of two volumes of Conference proceedings.
