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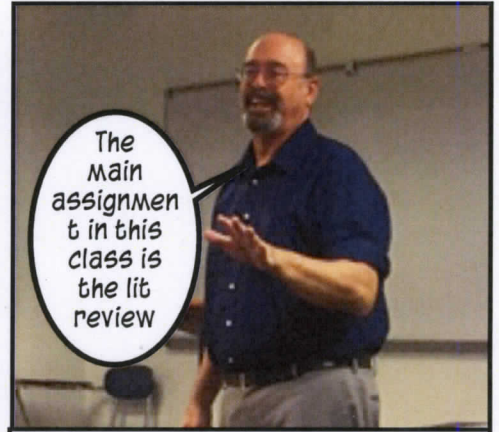
# Lit review story

Yeah...yeah its too soon.

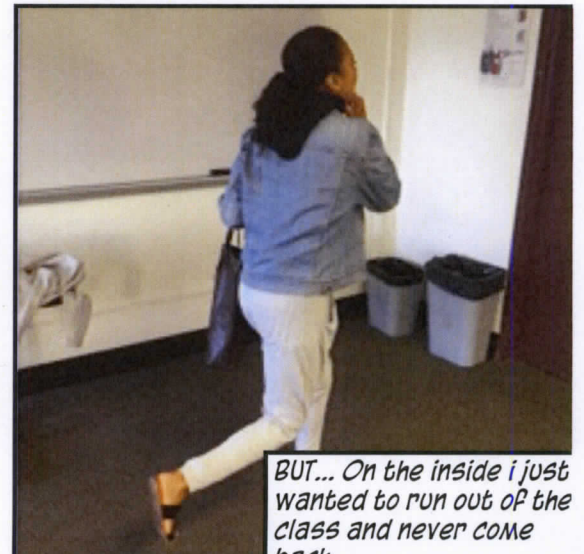
NOOOOOOO

But then suddenly, realization sets in and idea strikes



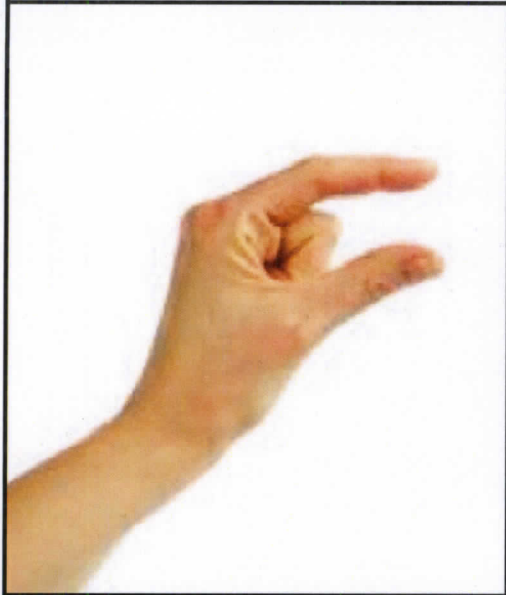
and enthusiasm takes over

So i just nod, smile, and pretend to think of new ways to narrow it down.

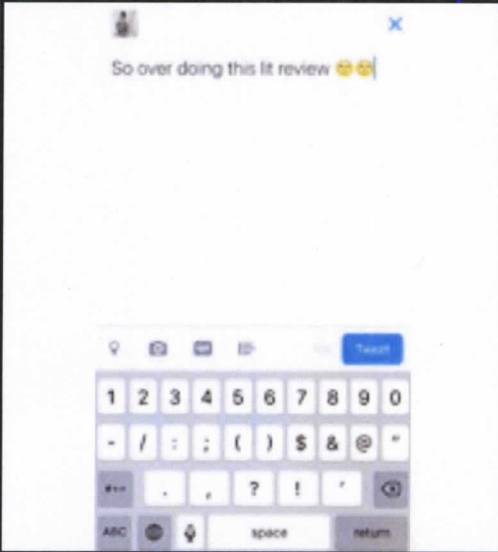

Then an idea emerged



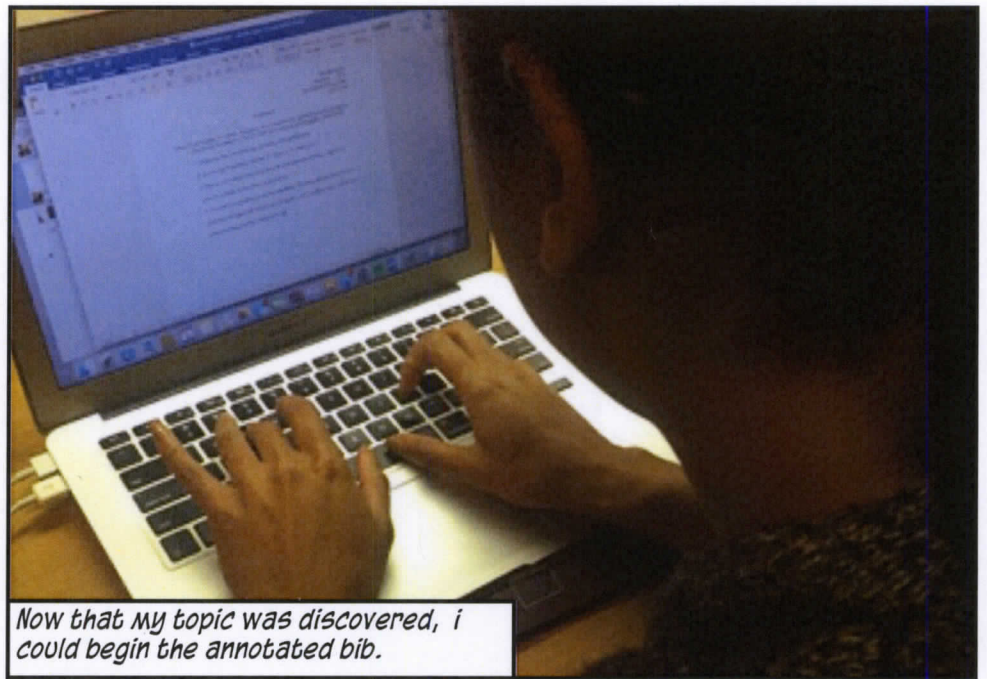
I was just complaining on twitter, twitter is a social media, can this be added?

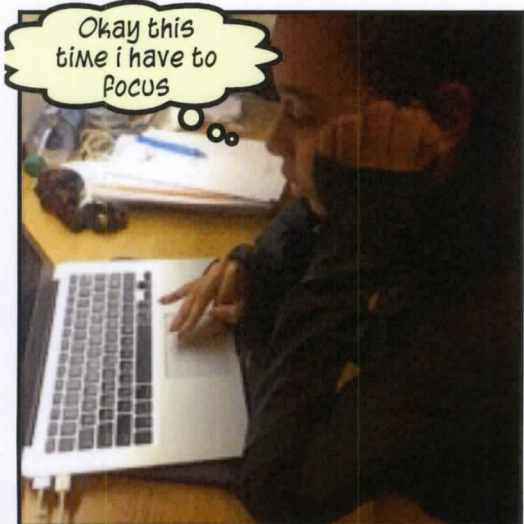
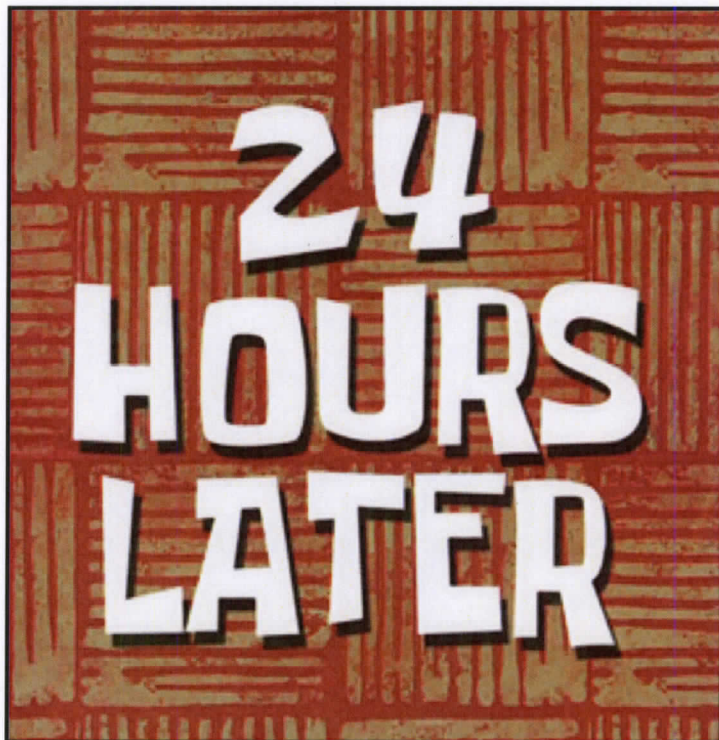
Days even weeks pass by but MY annotated bib remains untouched.



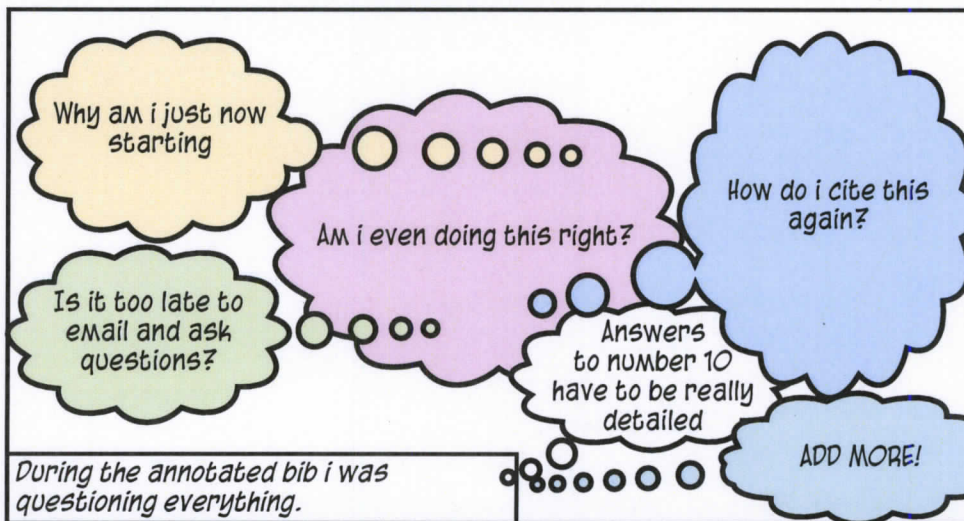
3 days later, i started again.

How do i cite this again?

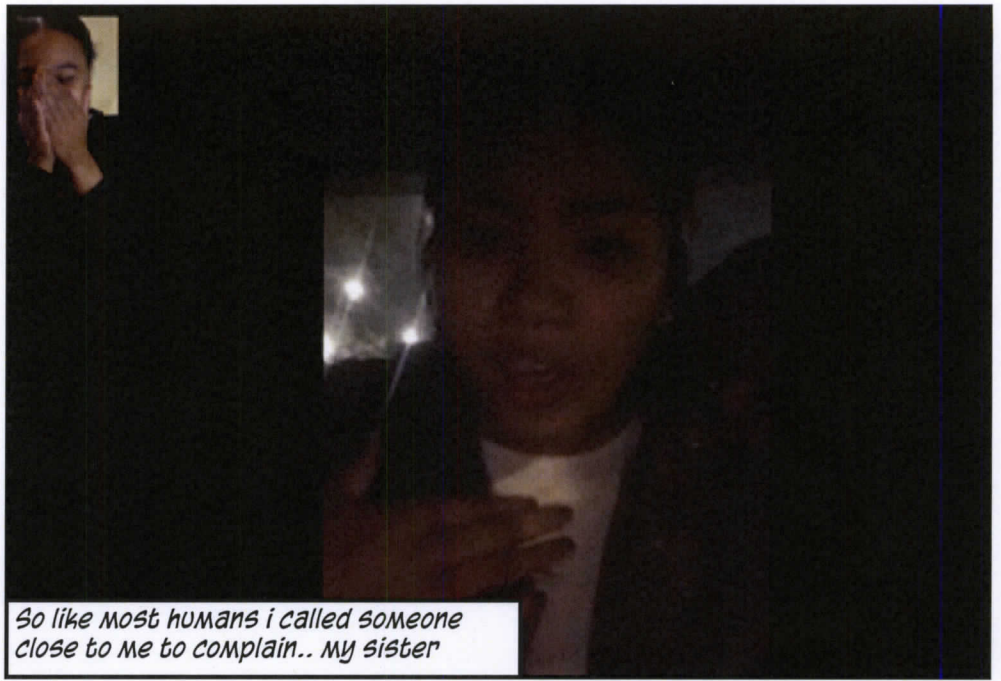
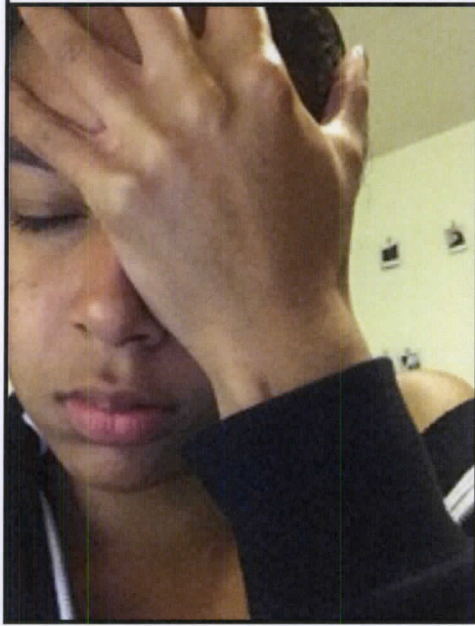
Is it too late to email and ask questions?

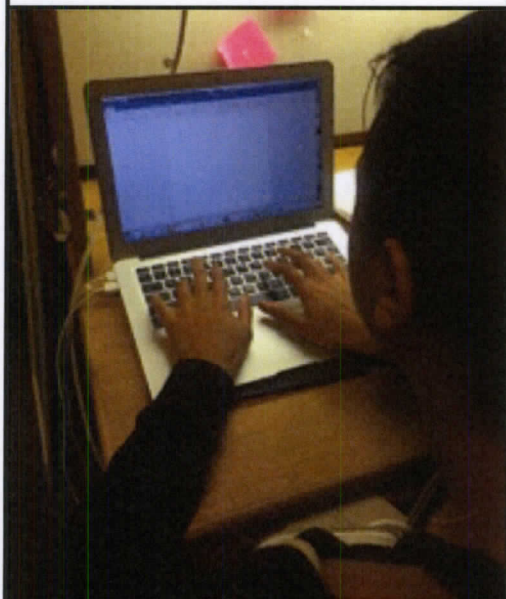

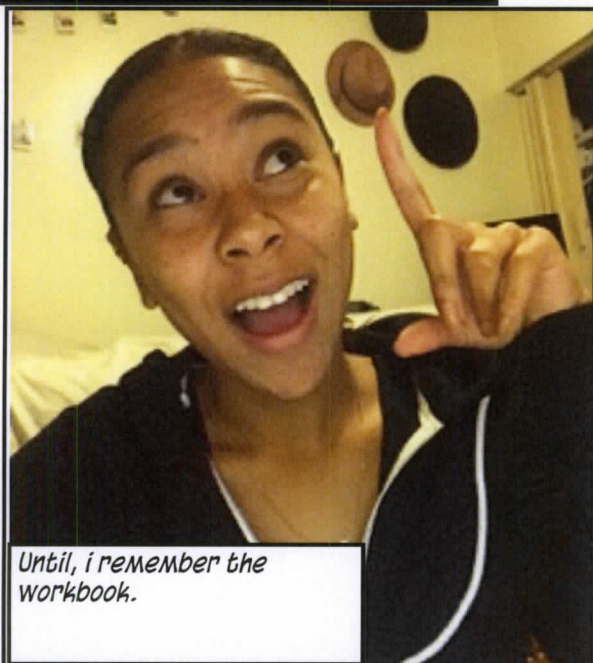

**TYPES OF ARGUMENTS USED IN LITERATURE REVIEWS**

Scholarly publications want to persuade you to their point of view. To do so, they use a variety of types of arguments. Some of the strategies include:

1. By citing other academic sources in the area of interest to show that the general topic is important.
2. By citing non-academic sources (e.g., *Newsweek*, *Surfer*, the *Los Angeles Times*, and citing television shows, movies) to demonstrate that there is a something going on in the "real world" worthy of study.
3. By citing others who have argued that there is little research in the area of interest, and therefore, the study you are proposing is justified.
4. By presenting a compelling argument that the general phenomenon is a significant one for the field of communication, but that the particular area of interest has received little attention so far.
5. By showing that other academic disciplines have studied the

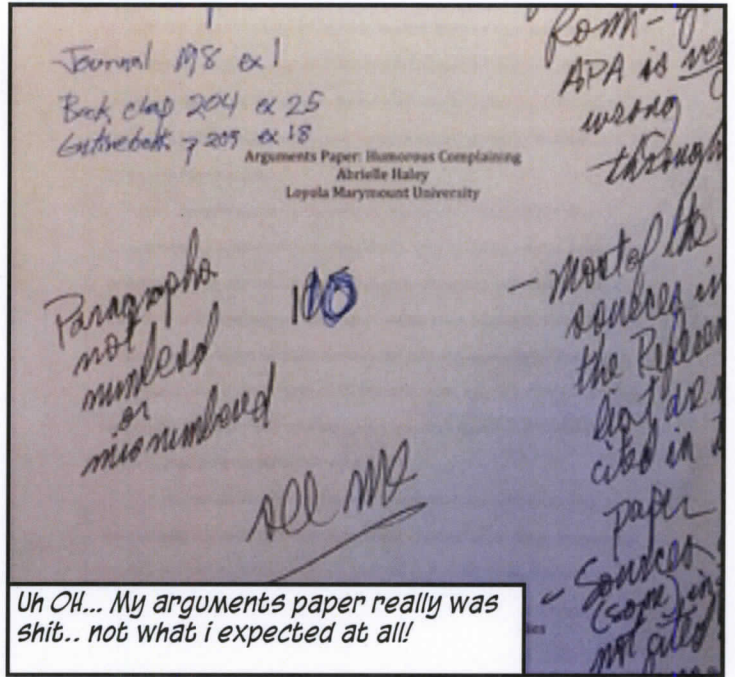

- Panel 5/Panel 6: Split panel into two images of what I'm doing on the outside: me sitting contently in class and what I want to do on inside: me running out the classroom



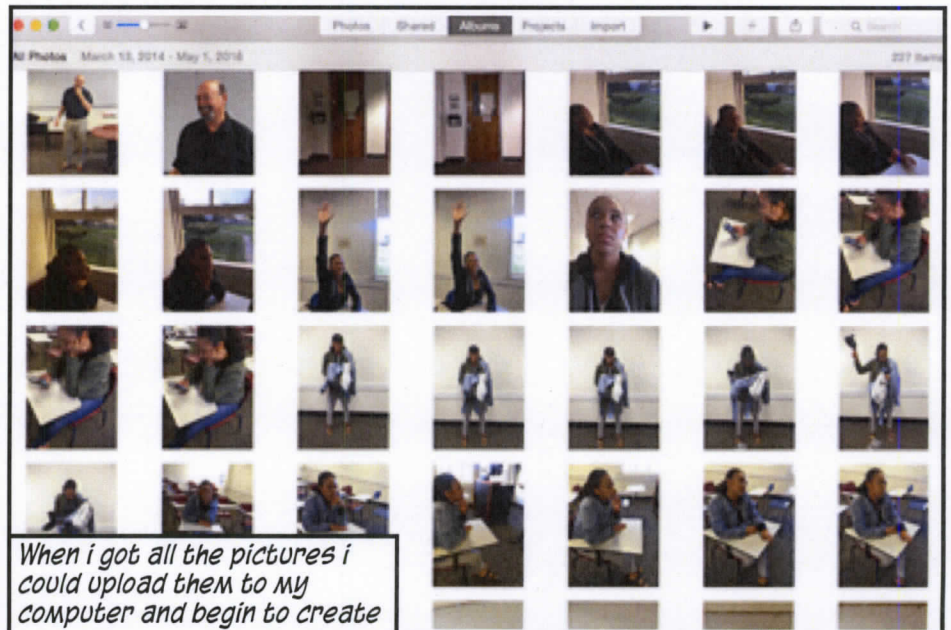
