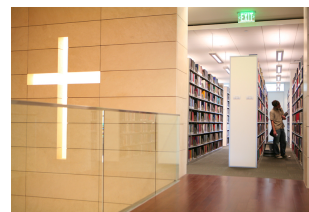
(Keep an eye out for library staff distributing treats during finals' week, too!)

Do you have a book or ten that you forgot to turn in on time this semester? Now is your chance to reduce your fines, and help feed a hungry family this holiday season at the same time.

From Friday December 3 through Tuesday December 21, the William H. Hannon Library is hosting **Food for Fines**.

For every food item that you bring in (rice, beans, peanut butter, canned meats, canned fruits, and canned vegetables are most needed), you can reduce your library fines* by \$2. (**That's \$2 for each item donated!**)

All donations will go directly to the [Los Angeles Regional Foodbank](#), a non-profit organization at the heart of a charitable food distribution network that includes over 900 charitable agency sites throughout Los Angeles County.

To exchange your food for fines, please bring your donation items to the library Circulation Desk on Level 1. (Donations also happily accepted by those who don't have fines! Look for the LA Foodbank donation boxes around the library.)

*Please note that replacement charges for lost materials are *not* included in Food for Fines.

Undergraduate Library Research Award

We are pleased to announce our fourth annual [Undergraduate Library Research Award](#) (ULRA). The purpose of this award is to recognize and reward LMU undergraduate students whose research makes expert and creative use of the services, resources, and collections of the William H. Hannon Library to produce a scholarly or creative work. For 2010, a prize of \$1,000 was awarded to the first place undergraduate project, and \$450 each to two honorable mentions.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for the 2011 ULRA, applicants must:

- Be currently enrolled at Loyola Marymount University as an undergraduate student in any class level. All disciplines are eligible. Groups and teams are not eligible; individuals only.
- Have completed and submitted an original research project for an LMU credit course during Spring 2010, Summer 2010, or Fall 2010. Works from Spring 2011 will also be considered, but the paper/project must be complete by the submission deadline of April 8, 2011. Revising and improving a previously submitted and graded research project is allowed and encouraged.
- Agree to contribute the project to the permanent collection of the Loyola Marymount University Library.
