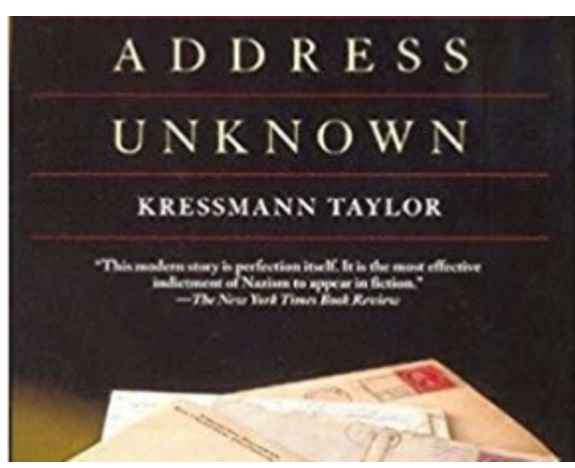
Haunting of Hannon VI
