Requirements & Expectations:

6. Assist your peers. Help your neighbor. Ask questions.
7. Keep the shop, kitchen, laundry, and dye room clean.

Attendance:

- Excused absences are limited to illness and emergencies and must be excused by the instructor.

Project Requirements:

The graduate student will be required to embellish the project with decorative hand stitching, create his/her own fashion fabric using textile manipulation techniques, pattern matching, and/or making more than one corset in the time allowed.
