COURSE DESCRIPTION

Introduction to psychological research methods has been designed to provide students with a fundamental understanding of the scientific method, basic research methods, the implementation of the appropriate research methods in specific situations and the ethical issues involved in conducting research. Specifically, the course will emphasize the scientific method as it is applied to the investigation and explanation of psychological phenomena.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- An introduction to the function and purpose of psychological research
- An introduction to the function and purpose of the scientific method
- An understanding of the major experimental and quasi-experimental designs
- The inherent problems associated with experimental, non-experimental and quasi-experimental designs
- The ability to develop an empirically testable hypothesis as well as the ability to critically evaluate the validity of other experiments
- The ethical issues involved in conducting research

I. <u>GRADING</u>

Grades will be derived from four out of five exams and ten out of thirteen pop quizzes.

A. <u>TESTS</u> (400pts)

There will be four tests and one cumulative final. Each test, including the final, is worth 100 points. You will be allowed to drop your lowest grade, either one of the four tests or the comprehensive final. The format of the tests will be a combination of 35 multiple choice questions and 3 out of 5 essay questions. The tests will cover information from the current lecture material as well as material covered in the book. The cumulative final will cover material from the entire semester.

B. OUIZZES(100pts)

There will be thirteen pop quizzes given throughout the course of the semester. Each quiz will be worth 10 points. The best 10 quizzes will be factored into the final grade (note: this is equivalent to one test grade).
