8	Whereas, the cost of college tuition for a four-year degree at a public university has risen
9	by almost 51% over the last 10 years;
10	
11	Whereas, over two-thirds of college students in the United States graduate with student
12	loans;
13	
14	Whereas, the average college graduate debt in the United States is \$22,700;
15	
16	Whereas, starting in 1965 the federal government has helped students finance college
17	through the Federal Family Education Loan program (FFEL);
18	
19	Whereas, the FFEL system operates as a lucrative form of corporate welfare, offering a
20	guaranteed rate of return for banks and other middlemen, who provide capital for student
21	loans;

23	Whereas, when college students are unable to repay their debts, taxpayers are required by
24	law to reimburse the banks for 97% of the losses;
25 26	Whereas, The Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2009 (SAFRA) aims to
20 27	terminate FFEL and replace private lending with direct government loans to students;
28	terminate 11 EL and replace private lending with direct government toalis to students,
29	Whereas, SAFRA makes college more affordable for 8.5 million more students;
30	whereas, 5741 KAY makes conege more anoreable for 0.5 minion more students,
31	Whereas, the restructuring of the federal student loan system would save taxpayers \$87
32	billion over the next ten years;
33	onition over the next ten years,
34	Whereas, of the \$87 billion saved by SAFRA, \$40 billion would then be reinvested to
35	increase individual Pell Grants by fourteen hundred dollars;
36	
37	Whereas, increasing Pell Grants by fourteen hundred dollars could aid five million more
38	students in paying for college;
39	
40	Whereas, under SAFRA, 40 million more students would qualify to receive Pell Grants;
41	
42	Therefore, let it be resolved, that the Associated Student of the University of Montana
43	(ASUM) offers its endorsement the Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2009;
44	
45	Let it be further resolved that ASUM urges Senator Max Baucus and Senator John Tester
46	to support the Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2009;

47 48	Let it be further resolved that a copy of this resolution be distributed to all interested, and
49	pertinent, parties including the offices of Senators Baucus and Tester.
