7 8	Whereas, There is an ongoing act of civil disobedience being peacefully carried out in and
8 9	around Cannonball, North Dakota, as part of a national effort to halt the construction of the
10	Dakota Access Pipeline (DAPL) which has been shown to have serious implications on
11	American waterways and indigenous sacred lands;
12	Timorroun water ways and margenous sucred lands,
13	Whereas, The proposed path of the DAPL crosses the Missouri River approximately a half-mile
14	north of the Standing Rock Sioux Reservation's border, putting the health, safety, and well-being
15	of residents in jeopardy and threatens the habitability of Tribal land;
16	
17	Whereas, The proposed route for the DAPL will deliver crude oil across 1,172 miles and
18	crossing rivers, creeks and tributaries at 209 different points; threatening water sources such as
19	the Missouri river that provide for nearly 10 million people, including people from 10 states and
20	from 28 different Native American tribes ¹ ;
21	
22	Whereas, 5,674 'significant accidents' occurred from 1996 to 2015 involving pipelines carrying
23	crude oil or refined petroleum products resulting in over \$7.5 billion in damages over the 20-year
24	period, according to the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), the
25	federal agency in charge of overseeing energy transportation in the United States ³ ;
26 27	Whereas, The construction of DAPL without proper consultation with the Sioux Tribes is a
27	direct violation and infringement of Indigenous sovereign rights;
28 29	uncer violation and miningement of mulgenous sovereign rights,
30	Whereas, The right to peaceful assembly is enumerated in the First Amendment of the United
31	States Constitution;
32	
33	Whereas, There have been widespread reports of human rights abuses in the crackdown on the
34	water protectors at Standing Rock including mass arrests, the widespread use of tear gas, attack
35	dogs, rubber bullets, and sound cannons, and detention of protectors in substandard facilities ⁴ ;
36	
37	Whereas, Law enforcement from at least five (5) states, North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota,
38	Wyoming, and Nebraska, as well as private security contractors are reported to have taken part in
39	crackdowns against the water protectors;
40	
41	Whereas, Reports of human rights abuses have sparked an investigation from the United Nations
42	permanent forum on Indigenous Issues into the legality of such practices;
43	Whoreas Numerous University of Montana (UM) students and alumni along with multiple
44 45	Whereas, Numerous University of Montana (UM) students and alumni, along with multiple Associated Students of the University (ASUM) Senators, have visited the protest site in
43 46	Cannonball, North Dakota, to express support and solidarity for this effort;

 Rock through committee on November 8th, 2016, and will be considering the resolution as a full
 body at the November 14th City Council meeting;

- 55 Whereas, The ongoing issues surrounding the planned DAPL route and its implications for
- 56 public health and water quality in the region, rule of law, and civil rights in the United States are 57 of significant interest to the students of UM;

- (ASUM) and University of Montana (UM) students stand is solidarity with the water protectors
 at Standing Rock and their opposition to the DAPL;

- community and abroad to raise awareness regarding the Indigenous struggle to obtain
 environmental and social justice both on and off the reservation;

- 68 officials, and protestors to exercise the utmost restraint going forward and respect the
- 69 Constitutional right to free assembly, speech, and protest;

- support so we may all stand in solidarity and provide political power to our neighboring nations;
