15	Whereas, The University of Montana currently has 22 gender neutral bathrooms across campus,	
16	located in Eck Hall, the University Center, University Hall, Corbin Hall, the International House,	
17	the George and Jane Dennison Theater, the Music Building, Law School, PAR/TV Building, Math Building, Gallagher Business Building, Curry Health Center, Fitness and Recreation	
18 19	Center, Fine Arts Building, including one in each of the Residence Halls;	
20	Center, The Arts Building, including one in each of the Residence Hans,	
21	Whereas, Many of these buildings listed house high volumes of students each day and access to	
22	these gender neutral bathrooms can be very limited, especially where there is only one gender	
23	neutral bathroom in the building;

25	Whereas, Having broad access to gender neutral bathrooms across campus is important to current	
26	students, as well as to potential or future students at UM;

28	Whereas, UM 2020's diversity section under core values reads:	
29	"The University of Montana seeks to enhance diversity by recognizing and	
30	embracing the differences in age, ideas and perspectives, disabilities, abilities, creed,	
31	ethnicity, gender identity, gender expression, veteran status, national origin, race,	
32	religious and spiritual beliefs, sex, sexual orientation, and the socioeconomic and	
33	geographic composition of its faculty, administrative professionals, staff, and students. In	
34	its effort to enhance diversity, The University of Montana recognizes that particular	
35	focused effort must be placed on including members of groups who have historically	
36	been subject to discrimination and are still underrepresented in the campus community.";
