9   Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM) represent student  
10 interests;

11  
12   Whereas, Senators are held to a higher standard because they represent students at the University  
13 of Montana (UM);

14  
15   Whereas, Many organizations have specific standards of conduct for their members;

16  
17   Whereas, Currently there is no avenue to hold senators accountable for their conduct during their  
18 term;

19  
20   Whereas, ASUM senators are elected by the student body and currently there is no avenue for  
21 students to bring forth concerns about senators' conduct as written in our governing documents;

23   Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That a new ASUM Committee be established and named Ad-Hoc  
24 Senate Code of Conduct Committee (SCCC);

25  
26   Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That the Ad-Hoc SCCC shall be composed of five (5)  
27 Students at Large;

28  
29   Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, The chair of the Ad-Hoc SCCC shall be the ASUM Vice  
30 President;

31  
32   Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, The Ad-Hoc SCCC be charged with the task of  
33 investigating the need and feasibility of creating a Senate Code of Conduct that all ASUM  
34 Senators would abide by. This shall be done by gathering information from the student body and  
35 current Senators on the need and content of a Senate Code of Conduct;

37   Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, The Senate Conduct Code will not be made retroactive  
38 but will apply to all future senates;

40   Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, The Ad-Hoc SCCC will be required to present the Senate  
41 Conduct Code to the Vice President of ASUM and the Senate as a whole to be voted on and  
42 adopted;

44   Therefore, Let it Further Be Resolved That This Resolution Be Sent To Brenna Love, ASUM  
45 Vice President; Braden Fitzgerald, ASUM President; Rhondie Voorhees, Dean of Students,  
46 Megan Stark, ASUM Advisor; John DeBoer, ASUM Advisor.
