7	Whereas, Prior to 2012, the Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM) was
8	comprised of twenty (20) seats;
9	
10	Whereas, There was a change to the ASUM Constitution in 2012 that increased the number of
11	seats on the ASUM Senate from twenty (20) to twenty-six (26) seats, but did not increase the
12	amount of votes students get for Senate candidates during the general election;
13	
14	Whereas, Students should be able to vote for all of their representatives on the ASUM Senate;
15	
16	Whereas, Students currently do not have the ability to vote for all of their representatives on the
—17—	ASUM-Senate;

19	Whereas, Article V, Section 4, Subsection a (6) of the ASUM Bylaws reads:
20	6. All students who are registered for one (1) credit or more are allowed to vote in any
21	ASUM election. In a primary election, each student may vote for as many candidates as
22	may advance to the general election. In a general election, each student may vote for one
23	(1) candidate for each executive position and for as many as twenty (20) senate
24	candidates.;

26	Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That Article V, Section 4, Subsection 1 (6) of the ASUM Bylaws
27	be amended to read as follows:
28	6. All students who are registered for one (1) credit or more are allowed to vote in any
29	ASUM election. In a primary election, each student may vote for as many candidates as
30 24	may advance to the general election. In a general election, each student may vote for one
31	(1) candidate for each executive position and for as many as twenty-six (26) Senate
32	candidates.
