GRADING:

- 1. There will be four multiple choice exams of approximately equal weight. The exams will be scantron graded so bring a #2 pencil to each exam.
- 2. Grades will be determined separately for each of the exams. The last exam will <u>not</u> be comprehensive. The lowest score on exams #1, #2, or #3 will be dropped.
