COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A system approach to medical word building including pathology of body systems, abbreviations, and special procedures such as radiographic, surgical, and laboratory.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Pronounce, spell and define word roots/combing forms, prefixes and suffixes related to specific body system anatomy and physiology.
- 2. Pronounce, spell and define word parts/terms related to system pathology.
- 3. Define, spell and pronounce terms related to surgical and diagnostic procedures.
- 4. Locate information, spell, define and pronounce pharmacological terms/drugs related to body systems.
- 5. Write and define abbreviations pertinent to specific body systems.
- 6. Accurately spell selected operative instruments
- 7. Learn to determine, locate and apply resources to assist in defining, spelling and pronouncing terms related to body systems.
