HOFFMAN-LAROCHE ESTABLISH RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

MISSOULA--

Thomas J. Collins, acting director of the University of Montana Foundation, has announced the receipt of \$2,100.00 from Hoffmann-LaRoche, Inc. for the establishment of a summer research program. The funds will provide three monthly stipends of \$350.00 for two undergraduate or graduate students from the University to work at the Deer Lodge Research Unit.

Mr. Collins said, "We are very happy to have a program of this type initiated." He added, "It will not only aid two deserving students, but increase the prestige of the University."

Hoffmann-LaRoche, one of the world's largest pharmaceutical firms, made a grant of \$250,000.00 to the University to build, equip and staff the laboratory at the Montana State Prison in Deer Lodge. It opened officially on February 15, 1968. The laboratory will increase research facilities available to the School of Pharmacy and will provide research opportunities in psychology and sociology as well.
