LOCAL UM STUDENTS WIN SCHOLARSHIPS MISSOULA --

A number of University of Montana students have won scholarships for the 1989-90 academic year.

Eleven students won the Hammond Scholarship, which Mrs. Frank B. King established at UM in memory of her father, Andrew B. Hammond. A Missoula-area businessman, he established a lumber mill at Bonner, built Missoula's Florence Hotel, started a newspaper, built the first railroad from Missoula to Hamilton and bought the First National Bank. Four students won the Marjorie Frost Scholarship. Frost attended UM during the 1918-19 school year. Since she couldn't complete her degree due to lack of money, she retained a lifetime desire to help other women students earn degrees. Four students have won the Bernice Gleed Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to students planning on attending medical school. The recipients, their awards and hometowns are:

Shahram Lotfipour, \$1,100, and Tarn Ream, \$1,100, Missoula; Elaine Porter, \$250, Columbia Falls; Julie Reil, \$1,100, Glendive.

Three students have won the Vivian Troop Kelly Scholarship, established to recognize worthy UM students. The recipients, their awards and hometowns are:

Allan Anderson, \$300, <u>Miles City</u>; Elizabeth Dyrdahl, \$100, <u>Malta</u>; Lois Stevens, \$300, <u>Kalispell</u>.

Brian Mattern of <u>Billings</u> has won the \$800 Donald Gute Memorial Scholarship. Gute's parents established the scholarship in memory of their son who died in an automobile accident at the end of his first quarter at UM. The scholarship recognizes a UM male student who shows outstanding leadership and citizenship.

Koryn Arnold of <u>Great Falls</u> has won the \$450 Briscoe-Gray Scholarship. In 1969 the parents of then ASUM President Ben Briscoe and ASUM Vice President Bruce Gray established the scholarship in memory of their sons who died in an automobile accident. In addition to being active on campus, they campaigned hard to lower Montana's voting age to 19. The scholarship recognizes UM students showing high academic ability and leadership qualities.
