MCH CONTINUES MORNING TV SERIES

MISSOULA --

International visitors, history, art and literature will be among the topics this month as the Montana Committee for the Humanities continues its statewide series of morning television interviews.

"Montana This Morning," a series of three-minute television interview programs on Montana public affairs and cultural issues, is featured on CBS stations and affiliates throughout the state from 7:07 to 7:10 a.m. weekdays.

Wendy Bay Lewis, executive director of the Montana Council for International Visitors in Bozeman, will be featured through Friday, Nov. 12. Segments featuring Western historian Elliott West of the University of Arkansas will air Nov. 15-19. Livingston artist, author, publisher and fisherman Russell Chatham will be the guest Nov. 22-26. Missoula author and educator Rick DeMarinis will be featured Nov. 29-Dec. 3.

Produced and hosted by Glenda Wallace, "Montana This Morning" is a cooperative project between the University of Montana-based committee and KPAX-TV of Missoula. MCH Acting Executive Director Gerald Fetz is executive producer for the series, which began in early June and will continue through the end of the year. The series is partially supported by funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities and by ASARCO Corporation.
