QUEEN FINALISTS FOR UM FORESTERS BALL
ANNOUNCED AT UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA

MISSOULA--

A total of five University of Montana students have been named finalists in the 59th UM Foresters Ball queen competition. The finalists were selected Monday evening following interviews of the nine competing women by a panel of UM forestry students and Patricia Ann Boyle, Great Falls, queen of the 58th UM Foresters Ball.

Those on the Missoula campus selected as queen finalists include Kathy Mae Gilbert, Anaconda; Kathleen Dawn Anderson, Bozeman; Karen Jayne Morrison, Havre; Susan Joyce McGuire, Lewistown, and Jayne Ann Shryock, Polson.

University forestry students will vote on the Foresters Ball queen candidates Jan. 8-9. The queen will be crowned and names of the four runners-up who will serve as princesses in her court will be announced at the Foresters Convocation on Jan. 12 in the University Theater.

The UM Foresters Ball will be Jan. 16-17 in the UM Men's Gym. Theme of the ball will be "Timber, Tracks and Time," which deals with the old railroad methods of logging, popular in the late 1800s.

Profits from the ball provide loans and scholarships for UM forestry students who assist in putting on the annual event.

The UM Forestry Students Association sponsors the annual ball.
