A rehabilitation fair at the University of Montana May 6-7 will feature booths and activities related to the needs of handicapped individuals with emphasis on self-help.

UM physical therapy students will operate the booths, and rehabilitated young adults will act as hosts. The fair will be open from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. to the general public, especially those who are concerned with up-to-date rehabilitation methods for invalid patients.

Orders may be taken at the booths for patient rehabilitation aids, and for materials to make inexpensive splints and supportive devices devised by UNI student therapists.
