#### REGISTRATION FOR 45-WEEK SUMMER SESSION THIS WEEK

MISSOULA --

Students may register anytime this week for the second 4½-week summer session, which begins Thursday (July 22) at the University of Montana.

Wayne C. Woolston, UM registrar, said students should complete registration by Friday (July 23). Students should attend classes as scheduled beginning July 22 and register during their free periods.

Summer session classes will continue through Aug. 20.

Those who plan to attend classes during the second session should pick up registration packets at the Registrar's Office in Main Hall and then secure signatures of instructors teaching the courses they wish to enroll in. The students will then take their packets to the UM Business Office in Main Hall for billing and payment of fees and then to the Registrar's Office for checking in.

Graduate students must secure the approval of the UM Graduate School to obtain graduate credit for their respective courses.

A total of 2,960 students are attending classes, workshops and seminars during the first 4½-week session, which ends Wednesday on the Missoula campus.

Dr. Walter C. Schwank, summer session director, said he expects about 3,500 students for summer classes by the end of the second 42-week session, which would be an increase of 200 compared with last summer.

Classes are conducted at UM during the summer session with academic offerings in the College of Arts and Sciences, and Schools of Education, Fine Arts, Business Administration, Journalism, Pharmacy, and in religious studies. A number of clinics, workshops and seminars supplement the regular class schedule.
