MISSOULA, Mont.--

High school students participating through Friday (June 29) in the 1973 Montana High School Fine Arts Camp at the University of Montana represent 39 Montana communities and five states.

A total of 173 students are participating in the camp and about 35 of them will be named to participate in the Montana High School Artists' Camp for selected musicians from June 30-July 6 on the Missoula campus.

Fine arts camp classes in art and music continue through Friday and camp classes in dance and drama will last through July 6.

The artists' camp next week will emphasize work by small groups composed of voice students and others specializing in stringed and wind instruments. Pianists will be included in those selected for the artists' camp.
