DRUG INFORMATION OFFERED BY UM PHARMACY STUDENTS miller/jg 2/2/79 local

MISSOULA--

Information on nonprescription drugs will be offered by University of Montana pharmacy students at the fourth annual "Over-the-Counter Drug Information Fair" Wednesday and Thursday, Feb. 7 and 8, in the University Center Mall.

The public is invited to attend the fair, which will be in session from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. both days, and ask questions about the drugs and pharmacy supplies displayed. There is no admission charge.

The fair is being organized by Kappa Epsilon, a women's student pharmacy honorary, for the purpose of providing the public with information about over-the-counter-drugs.

Instruction in cardiopulmonary resusitation (CPR), an emergency procedure used to revive heartbeat and breathing in heart attack victims, will also be available.

Types of products on display will include antacids, cough and cold suppressants, laxatives, birth control products, obesity control aids, vitamins and sleeping pills. The display products, provided through the courtesy of Missoula area pharmacies, will not be for sale.

About 60 third, fourth, and fifth-year pharmacy students will be available at different times throughout the two-day fair to answer questions about the drugs displayed. The students have been prepared for the fair by the UM pharmacy school, which offers a course in over-the-counter drug products.
