MISSOULA--

A 30-minute guest performance by the Bowling Green State University A Cappella Choir will be featured during the weekly Missoula City Band Concert at 8 p.m. Wednesday, July 13, at Bonner Park.

The choir from Bowling Green, Ohio, is stopping in Missoula for Wednesday's guest performance as part of a 22-state summer tour covering 11,000 miles. Richard Mathey is choir director.

Highlight of Wednesday's program will be a presentation of the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" by the choir and the Missoula City Band. Mathey will direct that work, which features setting by Peter J. Wilhousky, with arrangement for band by James Neilson.

Alex Stepanzoff, chairman of the University of Montana Executive Board, who is band director, said other band selections will include "March for the Sultan Abdul Medjid" and "La Gazza Ladra," an overture, by G. Rossini; "Invitation a la Valse" by C.M. von Weber, and "Washington Grays," a march by C.S. Grafulla.
