
### 2. USDA Research Grant

- Forest Health Monitoring (Greg Turner) 23 plots monitored every 5 years to determine health and condition of the Gordon Area forests.
- Seed Bank Analyses of Gordon Area soils (Jessica Schedlbauer) – deer overpopulation and serious infestations of non-native plants have impacted seed bank of native plant seeds. This study will quantify those impacts.
- Hydraulic properties of soils in the Gordon Area (Martin Helmke) this research will eventually allow us to measure water quantity and quality coming from the Gordon Area and flowing into the East Branch of Plum Run
- Green Legacy database update, development & maintenance (Joan Welch) tree inventory of all campus trees includes information on size, benefits, & hazards. Potential impacts of non-native insects and diseases can be evaluated. Serves as basis for certification of WCU as Tree Campus USA
