# Commencement Address School of Allied Health



Hal Larsen, Ph.D. Interim Dean, School of Allied Health

Dr. Larsen is certified as a medical technologist by the American Society of Clinical Pathologists and the National Certification Agency For Medical Laboratory Personnel. He holds a B.S. and M.S. degree in Microbiology from Brigham Young University and a Ph.D. in Medical Microbiology from the University of Nebraska College of Medicine. He completed an NIH postdoctoral research fellowship at the University of Tennessee. Dr. Larsen has been at TTUHSC since 1984. Prior to coming to TTUHSC, Dr. Larsen was a member of the faculty at Brigham Young University, the University of Tennessee College of Veterinary Medicine, and the University of Osteopathic Medicine and Health Sciences. While at TTUHSC, he has served as Chair of the Department of Clinical Laboratory Science, and later as Chair of the Department of Diagnostic and Primary Care and Associate Dean. Dr. Larsen was appointed Interim Dean in January, 1998. Dr. Larsen has experience in a number of clinical laboratory settings, having worked as a medical technologist and laboratory director, director of a clinical flow cytometry laboratory, and Laboratory Officer in the U.S. Army. He has published fifteen books or book chapters and over twenty scientific papers in peerreviewed journals. Dr. Larsen serves as a program reviewer for clinical laboratory science programs for the National Accrediting Agency For Clinical Laboratory Sciences. He is Chair of the Microbiology Committee for the National Certification Agency For Medical Laboratory Personnel (NCA).

### Commencement Address School of Medicine



Joel Kupersmith, M.D. Dean, School of Medicine Dean, Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences and Vice President for Clinical Affairs

Dr. Kupersmith completed his clinical training in internal medicine at New York Medical College and cardiology training at Harvard Medical School. Subsequently, he joined the faculty of the Mt. Sinai School of Medicine where he rose to the rank of Professor and was Director of the Clinical Pharmacology section. He then became Chief of Cardiology and V.V. Cooke Professor of Medicine at the University of Louisville and prior to joining Texas Tech one year ago he was Professor and Chairperson, Department of Medicine at the College of Human Medicine at Michigan State University.

Dr. Kupersmith is the author of 130 publications and two books. His research interests have been in the area of electrophysiology, the causes and treatment of heart rhythm abnormalities and the design and use of implantable cardioverter defibrillators. Most recently he has published on the cost effectiveness of heart disease treatments in which he is a recognized international expert.

Dr. Kupersmith has been on a variety of community boards and on many national and international committees involved with heart disease. He is a member of numerous professional organizations including the American Society for Clinical Investigation and is a winner of the Affirmative Action Award of the University of Louisville.

Dr. Pat Yoder-Wise, known to the graduates as Dean and Professor at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Nursing, is also President of the Texas Nurses Association. In addition to her nursing preparation, Dr. Yoder-Wise holds a doctorate of education from Texas Tech University. She joined the founding Dean at Texas Tech in 1979 to develop the School of Nursing. #### AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN REINTEGRATED NURSING

The Award for Excellence in Reintegrated Nursing is presented to the graduating student at the undergraduate and the graduate levels who best exemplifies a reintegrated nursing approach. Reintegration is the term that reflects the School of Nursing's philosophy about professional nursing and describes the return to a holistic perspective of the profession. Reintegration is the synthesis of practice, education, scholarship and service to the community and institution.

Nursing's unique contribution is its interactive process which emphasizes care - that element which promotes the comfort of individuals and the development or restoration of their resources for self-care. Nursing, as an art and a science, is demonstrated in multiple settings, clinical arenas and roles. It centers care on the individual, group and society and the response to health care needs.

The nautilus, long recognized as a holistic symbol because of its concentric, unending spirals, denotes the continuity and interrelatedness of health to individuals and their environment and of nursing in its multiple aspects.

In order to practice professional nursing in its ultimate sense, a nurse must use a holistic reintegrated approach. Viewing an individual as a unified whole encourages a self-perpetuating holism for both the nurse and the individual.

One award is presented to the outstanding graduating senior who is selected by faculty to demonstrate these qualities. Another award is presented to the outstanding master's student in a like manner.

## **TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER**

## **A Brief History**

On May 27, 1969, enabling legislation was passed making possible the creation of the Texas Tech University School of Medicine. Three years later, a remarkably short time in which to develop a comprehensive medical education program, the School of Medicine opened its doors to 36 freshmen and 25 juniors. It was August 21, 1972. The first class graduated in 1974.

In 1979 the name of the School was changed to the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, paving the way for the development of two additional schools. Accordingly, a School of Nursing was approved and the first nursing students were admitted in 1981. That same year the School of Allied Health was funded and physical therapy students began arriving twelve months later.

By 1983 two additional allied health programs-medical technology (now referred to as clinical laboratory science) and occupational therapy-were initiated. Ten years later Tech's Department of Speech & Hearing Sciences was transferred into the School of Allied Health and renamed the Department of Communication Disorders. Continued growth in Allied Health is exemplified by the expansion of the occupational therapy and physical therapy programs onto the Amarillo and Odessa campuses.

In 1987 the School of Medicine formalized an integrated dual doctoral degree program, one leading to the Doctor of Medicine degree, the other to the Doctor of Philosophy degree. This program prepares students to be physicians as well as modern biomedical scientists. Another milestone was reached when the Health Sciences Center graduated its first three candidates from the M.D./Ph.D. program in May, 1994. In addition, the class size of the School of Medicine has grown from 100 to 120.

Two additional schools have been approved recently for the Health Sciences Center: a Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences and a School of Pharmacy, Amarillo campus, which admitted its first students in Fall, 1996.

Today, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center is a dynamic, multi-campus school with educational programs in Amarillo, El Paso, Lubbock and Odessa and a student enrollment of over 1500. With this graduating class, the institution boasts over 4,000 alumni, including physicians, scientific researchers, nurses and allied health professionals practicing in nearly every state of the union and several foreign countries. Of particular pride is the fact that the majority of these graduates have chosen to remain in Texas to serve the health care needs of the State of Texas.

The wearing of academic dress at commencement dates from the early history of the oldest universities somewhere in the twelfth or thirteenth century. Since educated people were almost always of the clergy, the black gown is somewhat of an adaptation of the *cope*, a mantle of *silk* or other cloth worn by church dignitaries in procession and on other occasions. The long gown and *cowl* (similar to the academic hood of today) were worn by priests and monks for warmth in the cold medieval buildings.

In the early centuries, a great diversity of color and style of cap, gown, and hood appeared in different universities of Europe. The European custom of wearing academic dress was later introduced at American colleges. Not until after 1895 was a uniform academic code of dress code adopted by most colleges and universities in the United States. Today, the black robe, hood, and cap are worn at most institutions of higher learning.

The gown is cut differently for the bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees. Usually the bachelor's robe has long pointed sleeves; the master's has closed sleeves, square at the end with a slit at the elbow; the doctor's is faced with velvet and has round open sleeves with three bars of velvet.

The doctor's hood has side panels and is slightly longer than the one worn for the master's degree. The color used in the velvet border of thehood indicates the field of study. The velvet border is widest on the doctor's hood. The color of the lining of the hood indicate the college or university that conferred the degree. For example, thos who have received advanced degrees from Texas Tech Univesity wear hoods lined with red.

The Oxford -- the so-called mortar board -- is black and has a long tassel fastened to the center. The tassel is usually worn pendant over the left front of the cap. Different colored tassels are often worn on the bachelor's and master's caps to indicate the type of degree. The tassel on the cap of the doctor's candidate, except for professional degrees, is either gold or black.

Candidates for the undergraduate degree will wear the tassel on the right side of the cap at commencement. After the degrees have been conferred, baccalaureate degree recipients will turn the tassel to the left side of the cap, thus showing that they are now graduates.

All candidates for the undergraduates degree who wear the medallion are honor students who possess a minimum 3.50 grade average and will graduate *Cum Laude*, *Magna Cum Laude*, or *Summa Cum Laude*.
