



VIDEO SHOWCASE

Amercian Video Awards Announced

The power of videos became clearly evident during the 5th Annual American Video Awards celebrated April 27th at the Scottish Rite Auditorium in Los Angeles despite the fact that the program itself lacked the finesse and glamour stigma of the established Grammy and Oscar awards. With these drawbacks together with the total lack of creativity one would expect to find as in the intriguing images of the music videos highlighted that evening, the program did manage to convey the influences upon our culture. The offspring of a new "music video generation" was also emphasized.

As Casey Casem, the reknown Top-40 analyst, stated, "If there's one thing the past year told us, is that music videos are more than something we sit around watching. They influence the fashions we wear, the movies that we see, the parties that we go to and the commercials that we watch on television."


"The influence of videos is everywhere."

"1986 was the year that music video went beyond mere entertainment. It was the year that what would be done as part of the music business became part of our entire culture; the year music video style was everywhere we looked. It was the year when that style was used frivolously, and the year when it was used to change the world - or at least to try. 1986 was the year when music video seemed capable of anything from patriotism to parody."

Patriotism is illustrated in the video hit, "Living In America" performed by James Brown. The concept, however, is later ridiculed by Wierd Al Yankovic's version, "Living With A Hernia."

In addition music videos also complemented the music industry when used as commercial tools for promotions and product sales. As you may recall some of these types of videos included the clever "Budweiser USA" and the "Super Bowl Shuffle" video used to create greater interest in last year's popular Super Bowl battle.

Like other media, videos also took advantage of America's most utilized constitutional priviledge, "freedom of speech." Music videos such as "This Is The World Coming," "Hands Across America," "Sun City," "Promised Land" and "Stop The Madness" addressed the social issues of the day.



All videos considered for these honors were submitted to the National Academy of Video Arts & Sciences by a membership consisting of record company executives, independent producers and video crafts personnel. Its eligibility criteria emphasized distribution between September 31, 1985 and November 15, 1986. The membership thereafter narrowed all eligible votes to a final five nominees in each category through a true ballot system. Tabulations and guarding of the winners for the awards presentation were handled by the independent accounting firm of Laventhal and Hartwaithe.



Lubbock "Hotrod" Sweeps San Antonian Car Show

The gear shift is connected to the transmission; the transmission is connected to the cross-member; the cross-member is connected to the frame; and the frame is what holds it all together for this 1923 Ford roadster "hotrod" showcar which represented Lubbock as a top contender in a San Antonian statewide auto show last April.

The countless hours of preparation rewarded the '23 Ford roadster with 1st Place Open-Top, 1st Place Overall and 2nd Place Farthest Distance trophies. In addition, it received prize money and a custom paint job door prize.

"We completely rebuilt the auto," A.R. Morales, head crew member and custom painter for the project, stated.

"We had to disassemble it completely to repaint the frame and retouch the welding marks for this show. We paid close attention to the finest details while putting it back together; a great deal of thought to chrome and brass accenting. Sometimes the slightest bolt can make a big difference if it is brass plated to accent the chrome around it."

"We spent alot of hours on this 'baby.' Detailing alone took over 5 hours in Lubbock before we even left. In San Antonio, we polished and cleaned the car another 15 hours or so before we displayed it. We 'armored-alled' all the vinyl and rubber to get the wet shiny new look. We even cleaned every rock and gravel stone out of each tire groove using Q-tips!"

According to Morales, there were other autos there dressed with "more money." He attributes their triumphal outcome to their special attention to minor details in construction, assembly and display of the car.

The '23 roadster belongs to owner Felix "Max" Fabila, a Lubbock school teacher.

"I purchased the car for \$4,800 at a Lubbock World of Wheels show in '77. I've spent well over \$3,000 in upkeep and modifications since then," Fabila stated.

"Just minutes after I bought it, I was offered \$6,000 before I even drove it out of the show. I could have profited \$1,200 bucks, but I had always wanted one and I wasn't about to let it go. I'm so attached to it now that it's priceless to me. I wouldn't even begin to price it - I'm going to keep it forever for as long as I can and live to enjoy it," Fabila added.

Fabila also owns a '75 corvette and a '82 corvette, both "daily driven." His fourth car is a seasonal "winter time" '71 volkswagen beetle.

The crew for the Fabila show project consists of A.R. Morales, owner of Industrial Fields Services of Lubbock, Steve Salazar, head mechanic for the project and Vice President of I.F.S. and Freddy "Cadillac" Rodriguez, detail specialist.

The '23 roadster has brought home an additional 12 trophies and a plaque for Fabila since he gained possession of the vehicle.

"We provide development opportunities for young people," Bart Starr, newly elected President, stated. "We concentrate in public speaking and writing by developing projects to teach them leadership responsibilities, although some members practice such qualities in their everyday lives and occupations."

"In the beginning, the Jaycees were mostly made up of successful doctors, lawyers and independent business people. Today our membership attracts all sorts of people with various trade practices." Starr added.






BUILDING heartBEAT

BUGS BUNNY BLEEPED

Yep, right here in Lubbock: an internationally renowned video artist and producer and his partner are working late hours toward completion of their first collaboration, heartBEAT, for which raw footage was shot in January and special effects are currently being "built." The artist and producer is **Dr. Kim Smith**, professor of art at Texas Tech; his cohort is Duane Conder, KLBK news photographer and image-manipulator extraordinaire. Smith describes heartBEAT as "a narrative form of music video which deals with the thoughts running through a guy's mind after arriving home from work." He explained Conder's special effects will help convey the main character's inner monologue, and should provide a nice tingle to the cortex too. Musical scoring for the project is being written and will be performed by Tech Music Department doctoral candidate David Kneupper and explores a wide variety of musical motifs, much in the manner of works by Brian Eno and David Byrne. Smith already has a number of impressive accomplishments under his belt including Top Award at the 1984 7th International Tokyo Video Festival for his production of video artists Bruce and Norman Yonemoto's Vault, Best Independently Produced Music Video at the 1985 Canadian VideoCulture Awards for his production of Go For It Mike, and some pioneering work on an interactive videodisc version of Lorna. All three videos have been shown worldwide. heartBEAT is expected to go to post-production no later than September and we should be treated to a local premiere sometime in October. Hmmm...Halloween would be appropriate, n'est-ce pas?

If you're a fellow connoisseur of classic cartoons and make a dash for the telly on Saturday mornings to catch "Bugs Bunny" on ABC, you may have been noticing the steadily increasing number of bad jump-cuts and nonsensical action sequences. Electronic Media magazine reports ABC is taking considerable heat for what many feel is excessive editing of violent scenes which the network feels are "imitable by kids." Warner Bros. cartoon directors Fritz Freleng and Chuck Jones have joined animation buffs in protesting editing which they feel is ruining classic examples of the art and turning some works into impossible-to-follow stories because integral scenes are being removed. ABC defended its policy by pointing out that many of the old cartoons were made with adults in mind, and that children "perceive them differently." Warner Bros. executive Edward Blair sees the problem as "an enormous paradox...of venerating the art form on one hand, and mutilating it on the other." Personally, I find the whole brouhaha delightfully ironic. The same directors who are delivering public diatribes against editing "their" cartoons and coloring "their" black and white movies are the same guys who begin rewriting scripts and screenplays as soon



Peter Gabriel Inducted to American Video Awards Hall of Fame

From his early performances with Genesis in the late 60's to his solo career which began in the late 70's, Peter Gabriel pledged total commitment to the marriage of rock with astounding visual images. For him video was a natural outgrowth of his previous work.

Acquiring a team of technical wizards, he explored to discover an array of unique visual ideas. He grew extensively from his background in theater and design.

"No matter how strainious the shot, and how late the hour, Peter remained a constant source of creative insight and artistic inspiration to all he would allow the priviledge of working with him," his director, Stephen Johnson, stated.

"Video is about to change....people still see it as just another piece of promotion. In terms of power basis too, there are two bodies beginning to settle; the TV lobby and the record companies. There needs to be a sort of power base that is of the video artists and video directors. And I hope soon there will be a union or a federation to protect our interests. I think we're having a little influence. We have some power, and we should grab it," Gabriel stated during his acceptance speech.

"Tejano videos are relatively new, and very few Spanish artists have produced them," Rodriguez stated.


